Transit & ORCA card

To get around the region by bus, ferry, rail or train — or a combination — one card is all you'll need. ORCA is accepted on King County Metro Transit, Sound Transit, Community Transit, Everett Transit, Kitsap Transit, Pierce Transit, and Washington State Ferries.

Getting an ORCA card is easy and is \$5 or less. Then just add value, tap and ride with ORCA. ORCA cards can be purchased at a vending machine at any Link Light Rail Station.
