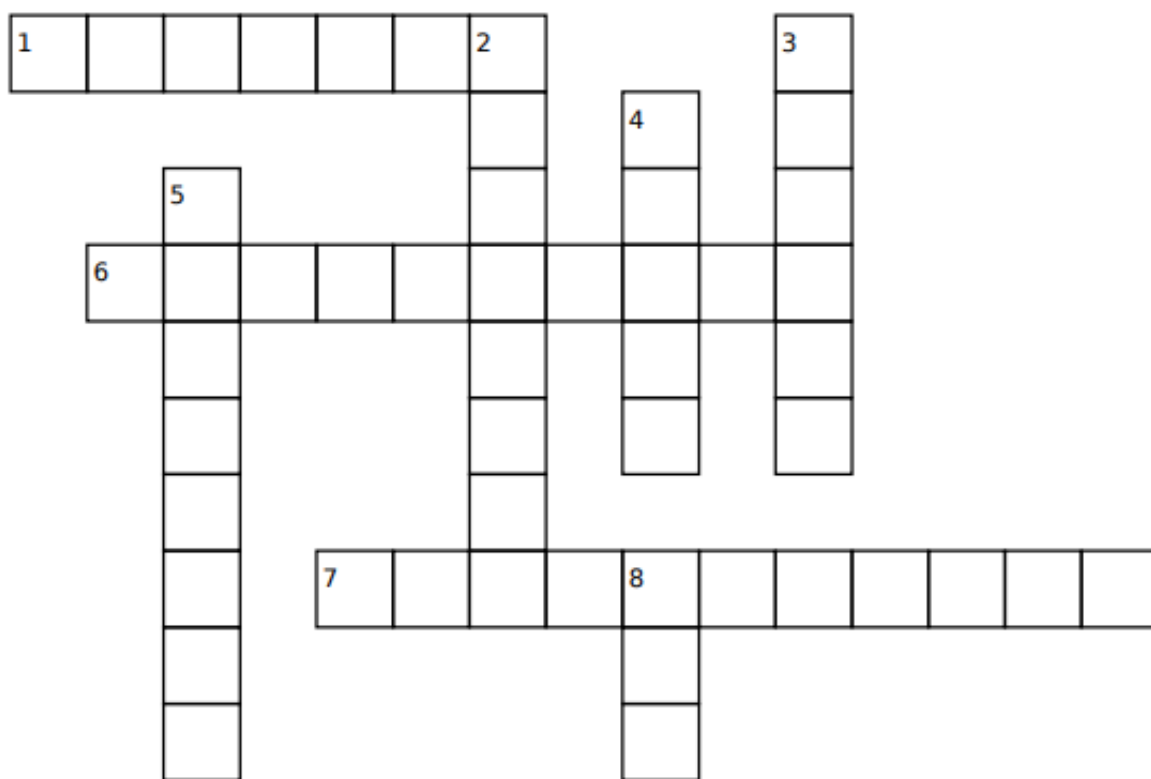


CROSSWORD



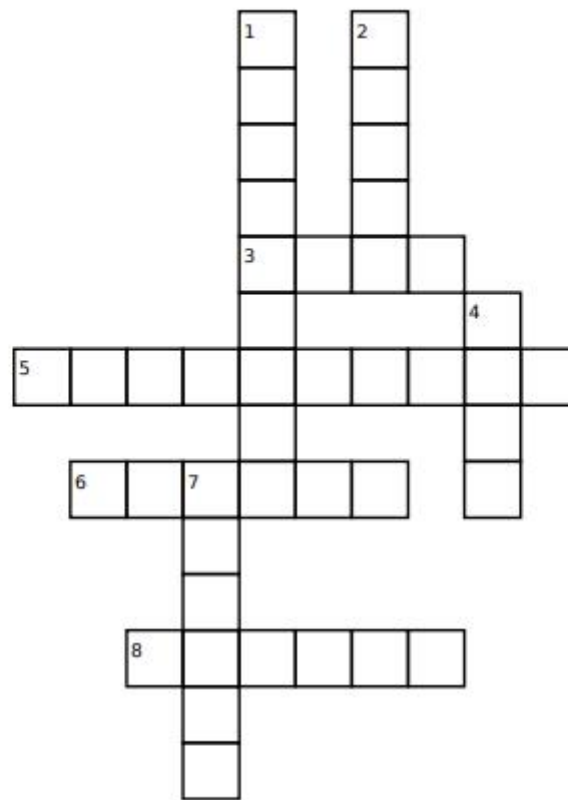
Down:

7. This happens when a batter swings at and misses a pitch, does not swing at a pitch in this zone or hits a foul ball that is not caught

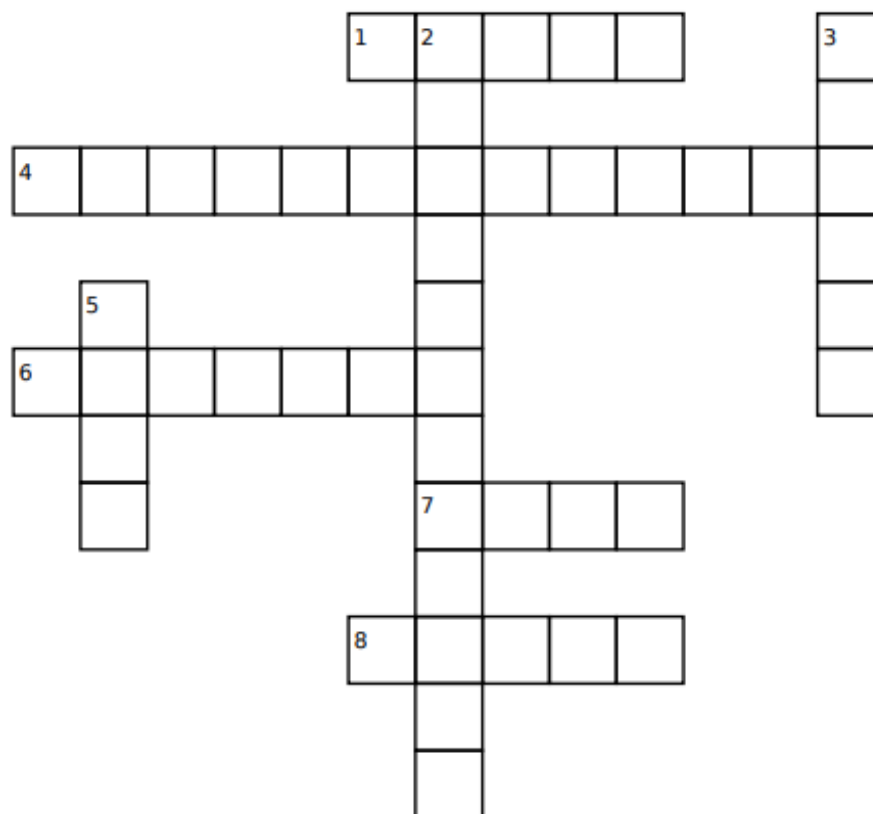
Across:

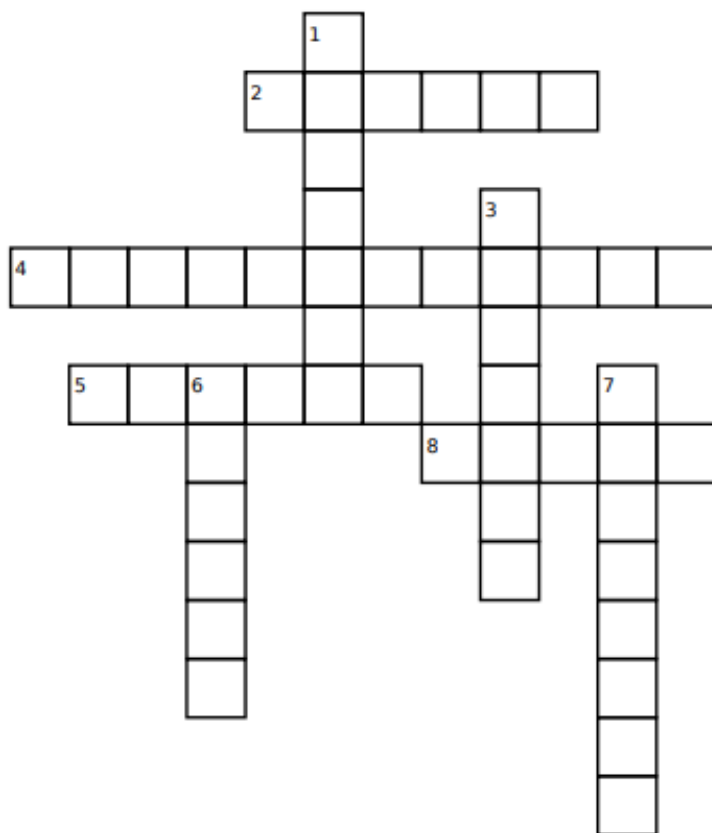
Down:

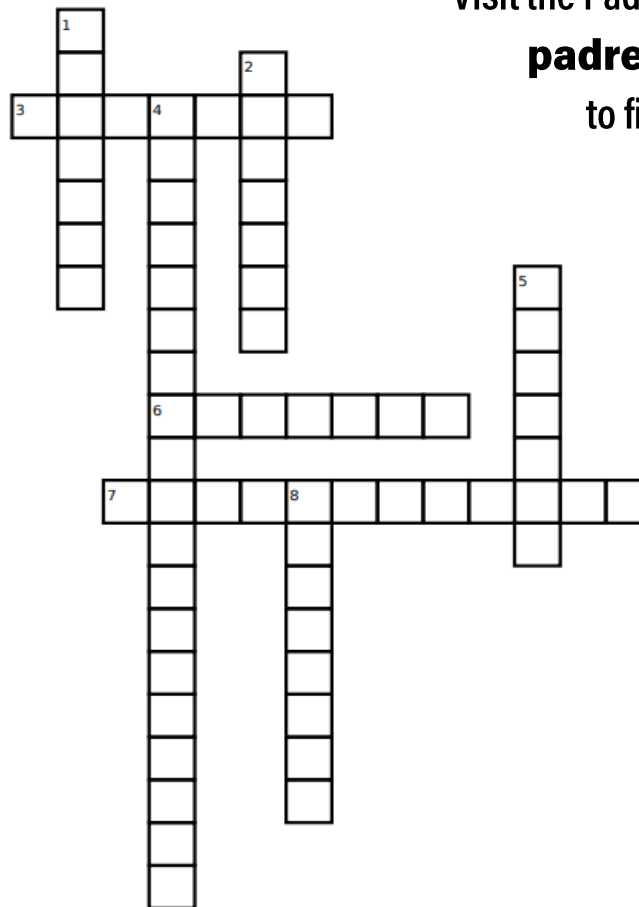
