MAKE-A-WISH SAN DIEGO

The Padres are proud to partner with Make-A-Wish San Diego and are instrumental in helping grant milestone wishes at Petco Park. In 2023, the Padres helped grant the organization's 5,000th wish. The Padres assist in providing wishes to children with life-threatening medical conditions by enriching the human experience and providing the families with strength and joy. In addition to helping grant wishes, the Padres host "Make-A-Wish Mondays" where Wish kids enjoy a day at Petco Park meeting their favorite Padres.

YOUTH ASSISTANCE COALITION

The Padres work closely with the Youth Assistance Coalition (YAC). YAC positively impacts the lives of youth experiencing homelessness through empowerment, mentorship, and community collaboration in order to provide transformative opportunities. Every month members of the Padres front office bring dinner to serve to the youth at the YAC downtown facility. Along with spending time with the youth each month, the Padres Foundation designated YAC as one of the two main beneficiaries for 2023 Dinner on the Diamond, which resulted in a \$250,000 donation.





PADRES BLOOD DRIVE

In partnership with the San Diego Blood Bank, the Padres annual Summer and Winter Blood Drives support patients struggling with life-threatening medical conditions. The team set a record when more than 850 Padres fans, which included more than 311 first-time donors, donated blood to those in need.

PADRES PEDAL THE CAUSE

Padres Pedal the Cause brings together thousands of cyclists and runners each year to raise money for local collaborative cancer research. Padres Pedal is San Diego's most impactful fundraising experience with over \$18 million raised to date to fund more than 80 innovative research grants targeting all types of cancer.



URBAN STREET ANGELS

The Padres were in attendance for the grand opening of Urban Street Angels' pizzeria and print shop called Timmy's Place. Padres pitcher Nick Martinez, Pad Squad and Friar were all in attendance to support an environment that provides jobs to youth facing homelessness. Urban Street Angels received \$250,000 from the Padres Foundation as a primary beneficiary from the 2023 Dinner on the Diamond.

RADY CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

Rady Children's Hospital and the Padres have a long-standing partnership. The Padres are proud to support the physicians, staff, and volunteers of the only pediatric-specific hospital in San Diego, by offering unique, uplifting experiences to patients receiving treatment. In 2023, the Padres hosted a group of teens undergoing cancer treatment for a weekend of fun and baseball at the Peoria Spring Training Complex.

SUPPORTING MONARCH SCHOOL'S UNHOUSED STUDENTS


The Padres Foundation has been a leading supporter of the Monarch School and its thousands of unhoused students over the years, providing special support and opportunities as they persevere through the trauma of homelessness.

During the Padres Foundation's annual Back-to-School Shopping spree, presented by Motorola, Padres' staff, players and alumni give Monarch School students one-on-one personal shopping support to help them pick out new clothes, shoes and other essentials to help them through the school year. With the support of Walmart and Chick-fil-A, the students also receive school supplies and a great lunch.











EDUCATOR APPRECIATION NIGHT

The Padres recognize the vital role teachers play in our community. In conjunction with the San Diego Office of Education, the Padres annually provide tickets and hold a special pre-game ceremony at Petco Park to introduce each local school district's Teachers of the Year. In addition, the five San Diego County Teachers of the Year are recognized and deliver the Ceremonial First Pitch.

COACH OF THE YEAR PROGRAM

The Padres Coach of the Year program was created to recognize and honor the positive role baseball and softball coaches play in the lives of San Diego County's student-athletes. Coaches are honored for making a positive impact on the lives of his or her players on and off the field as a coach, mentor and role model. To date, 41 baseball or softball coaches have been recognized in five years of the program, including 24 high school baseball coaches, 15 high school softball coaches, and two youth coaches. A Coach of the Year is selected annually from among the Coach of the Week honorees. In 2024, the Coach of the Year will receive a \$10,000 donation to his or her program while each Coach of the Week receives a \$2,500 donation to their program.

FUTURE PADRES JERSEY PROGRAM

The Padres' commitment to youth baseball and softball continued in 2023 with the Future Padres initiative, a signature youth baseball and softball program presented by UC San Diego Health with support from US Bank. Since 2012, the Padres have donated more than 180,000 jerseys and caps/visors to the region's youth players.

PADRES ROOKIE LEAGUE

Padres Rookie League (formerly known as Padres RBI) offers boys and girls ages 5-13 the opportunity to play in a FREE baseball or softball summer league. The Padres provide free uniforms to go with free mitts provided by Masons4Mitts. This initiative is designed to provide young people from underserved and diverse communities a chance to learn and enjoy the game.





PADRES YOUTH BASEBALL & SOFTBALL CAMPS

The San Diego Padres offer a series of baseball summer camps throughout the San Diego area that enrich the lives of children through exceptional instruction, character development and a unique Major League experience. Net proceeds from the Padres Baseball and Softball Camp program benefit the Padres Foundation and support the club's youth baseball and softball outreach efforts. PLAY BALL!


The PLAY BALL initiative is Major League Baseball's collective effort to encourage young people and communities to engage in baseball or softball activities, including formal leagues, special events and casual forms of play.

FREE YOUTH BASEBALL & SOFTBALL CLINICS

The Padres provide free youth baseball and softball clinics throughout the year for youth in the San Diego and Baja region. These clinics provide opportunities for children in underserved communities as well as for children from military families. Partnering organizations include Professional Baseball Athletic Trainers (PBATS), Pitch Hit and Run, United Heroes League, IMDET (Tijuana) and Rally Camps.

PADRES PROVIDE ALL-STAR MOMENTS FOR SAN DIEGO'S BEST

Each year the Padres open up their Petco Park home to give the top high school baseball players in San Diego County an unforgettable experience. The top 48 players are chosen to participate in the annual High School All-Star Game & Home Run Derby and experience the thrill of playing for the first time on a major league field.



SERVE

Supporting Those Who Serve

For nearly three decades, the Padres have proudly supported our nation's servicemen and women. In 1995, the Padres established the first Military Affairs department in professional sports, earning recognition as the "Team of the Military" throughout the sports world. A comprehensive approach includes collaborating with non-profits to support active duty military, veterans and their families. The Padres host morale-boosting events, offering in-ballpark recognitions and awareness, and actively engaging with the San Diego area's vast military community - the largest concentration of U.S. military personnel in the world.



SUNDAY SALUTES

The Padres honored active duty military members, their families and Veterans on-field in elaborate pre-game ceremonies before every Sunday home game in 2023, which included flyovers by an array of military aircraft from multiple services and a parachute demonstration by the Army's Golden Knights. New this season was the "Hero of the Game" featuring an in-game narrated video montage of a service member, veteran, or family member who had performed heroic and inspiring acts of bravery. Each Hero was presented with a framed United States Flag that had been flown over PETCO Park.

MILITARY SCHOLARSHIPS

The Padres annually donate thousands of dollars in college scholarships to military members and their families. In 2023, \$15,000 was donated to three recipients in coordination with the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation, Tailhook Educational Foundation, and Wings Over America Scholarship Foundation.

PADRES CARE PACKAGES FOR THE MILITARY

The Padres take pride in providing support to deployed forces by curating and distributing care packages to active duty military members around the globe. Care packages and winter coats that fold out to sleeping bags were also donated to struggling local homeless veterans who receive care at Veterans Village San Diego. Padres players, staff, volunteers and sponsors assembled more than 2,000 care packages in 2023.

Every year, the Padres partner with a military installation to host a Padres Alumni & Military Softball game. In 2023, the Padres joined forces with the Navy Submarine Force. Family, friends and military members stationed in Point Loma were among the crowd and were treated to a complimentary lunch from Hodads.



MCRD RECRUITS WELCOMED AT PETCO PARK

In partnership with USAA, the Padres host approximately 3,400 Marine Corps recruits at the ballpark prior to graduation each year. Attending a game at Petco Park is a monumental moment for these recruits as it is their first time out in public wearing their military uniforms. During the fifth inning, these men and women are introduced and recognized for excelling through boot camp and committing the next several years of their life to their country.

PADRES BABY SHOWER FOR MILITARY MOMS-TO-BE

In collaboration with Nuna and the Drew Pomeranz family, the Padres Foundation organized a heartwarming baby shower at Petco Park for young enlisted service members and the spouses of deployed service members. This annual event offered essential support during a pivotal moment in their lives. Each family was surprised with a Nuna stroller and carrier.




DONATING AND VOLUNTEERING WITH LOCAL MILITARY CHARITIES

The Padres provided more than 15,000 tickets to active-duty military, veterans and families in 2023. They also contributed to their local charity partners throughout the year, most notably through the Hats Off Their Heads online auction of game worn and player-issued Independence Day Ballcaps which generated \$27,000, including a \$10,000 donation from Blue Shield of California for homeless and housing insecure veterans supported by Veterans Village of San Diego.

The Padres' support for San Diego's first responders comes in many forms, such as on-site visits, on-field recognition ceremonies and financial donations. First Responder Appreciation Games are dedicated to all first responder departments throughout the City and County of San Diego, including the San Diego Police Department and other county police departments, San Diego County Sheriff's Department, San Diego Fire-Rescue Department, California Highway Patrol, Customs & Border Protection, Red Cross, FBI, DEA and other organizations on the front line of service to our community.




Players in the Community



Diversity, Equity & Inclusion

CELEBRATING DIVERSITY WITH JOHNNY RITCHEY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM & BREAKING BARRIERS FORUM

The Padres' Johnny Ritchey Scholarship program was created in 2020 to make annual awards to local high school seniors from underserved areas that embody the characteristics and qualities Ritchey displayed on and off the field, including the capacity to overcome adversity and break barriers academically, athletically or in the community. Ritchey, a San Diego native, broke the color barrier in the Pacific Coast League after being signed by his hometown team in 1948. At a time when Major League Baseball was not yet in the Western United States, Ritchey was the first – and often the only - Black player on the field in ballparks throughout the West Coast.

The Padres Foundation, in partnership with the California Masons Foundation and Reality Changers, awards 10 scholarships valued at \$10,000 each (\$2,500 renewed annually) to students that have encountered and, more importantly, overcome significant personal adversities in their life and have used these challenges to strengthen themselves in their pursuit of higher education.

The Padres with the support of San Diego Gas & Electric and the "Going to Bat for San Diego program" created the Breaking Barrier Forum in 2022 as an opportunity for high school students to hear stories of "breaking barriers" and overcoming personal adversity as Johnny Ritchey did in his life from community and business leaders and professional athletes.





GOING TO BAT FOR SAN DIEGO

The Padres and San Diego Gas & Electric partnered for the eighth consecutive year on the GOING TO BAT FOR SAN DIEGO giving initiative. Among the many key giving opportunities in the program is support for diversity, equity, and inclusion (DE&I) as well as safetyfocused organizations. The partnership supports the Johnny Ritchey Breaking Barriers Forum and the efforts of organizations that support firefighters throughout the County, such as the San Diego Fire Rescue Foundation, Firefighter Aid and the San Diego Regional Fire Foundation.

OUT AT THE PARK

OUT At The Park is a theme game to celebrate and welcome the LGBTQ+ community to Petco Park to cheer on their team. A portion of every OUT At The Park ticket in Pride's sections goes to San Diego Pride, a year-round education, advocacy, and arts and culture organization that fosters pride, equality and respect for the LGBTQ+ community. Out at the Park is the largest of the Padres' community and heritage games.

COMUNIDAD AWARDS

The Padres honored the recipients of the 12th annual Comunidad Awards, which recognize and pay tribute to individuals or organizations whose work has made a positive impact on those who live and work in San Diego's Hispanic community. The Padres Foundation donated \$25,000 total to five charitable organizations in honor of the recipients.

TONY GWYNN COMMUNITY ALL-STARS

Padres Hall of Fame outfielder Tony Gwynn was known as "Mr. Padre" for his on-field excellence and leadership in the SanDiego community.

The Tony Gwynn Community All-Star Program was created to recognize and honor San Diego's youth who follow in his footsteps and support their local community. The Padres recognize nine students ages 18 and under who are working with a local non-profit organization to support underserved segments of our community. The Padres Foundation issues grants (\$45,000 total) to support their efforts.

TIJUANA YOUTH BASEBALL CLINIC

Fernando Tatis Jr. visited the Unidad Deportiva Benito Juarez in Tijuana to teach 200 kids what baseball is all about. Fernando and the Padres planned the clinic with the Mayor of Tijuana's office and IMDET, in sponsorship with Arco and Roma. Not only did each child receive an opportunity to meet Fernando but they also all received a City Connect shirsey.



MEXICO CITY BASEBALL CLINIC

On April 28, 2023 the Padres visited Liga Olmeca, a baseball and softball academy for youth in Mexico City. A baseball clinic was set up with 10 Padres players and three alumni who handed out City Connect shirseys and taught the kids techniques from hitting, fielding to everything in between. Over 250 kids were in attendance from Liga Olmeca and Mexico YMCA.

BUILD A MIRACLE

The Padres partner with Build a Miracle, which works directly with less fortunate families in Tijuana. They help hundreds of families through a program that helps with shelter, education, work and food. The Padres have sponsored a family for each of the last four years and help build new homes with front office volunteers.


BROADCAST AUCTION
