This year the Carpenter Cup Classic presented by Nike, celebrates its 37th year of showcasing the top high school baseball players in the tri-state area of Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware. This tournament, named in honor of former Philadelphia Phillies' owners Bob and Ruly Carpenter, has provided opportunities for scholar-athletes to demonstrate their skills. The single elimination format affords all major league team scouts and more than 100 college and university coaches an annual look at the area's finest high school baseball players.

This year we continue to host our first and second round games at the Phillies MLB Urban Youth Academy Fields in F.D.R. Park. The semi-finals will be hosted at Citizens Bank Park on Monday, June 26th and the championship game will be hosted at Citizens Bank Park on Tuesday, June 27th.

The Carpenter Cup Classic has been the catalyst for hundreds of players to receive scholarships or admission at some of the country's finest colleges and universities. Each year, former Carpenter Cup participants are joining the professional level. Rules of Play - 2023

9-inning games - played in order, 1 to 15

7-innings is a complete game - weather or Executive Committee decision

American League rules EXCEPT:

- NO bunting until the 7th inning, and NOT in a player's first at-bat
- NO intentional walks at any time
- Aluminum bats are allowed
- Base Runners should avoid contact with fielders at all cost (Slide or Veer Away). Failure to do so may result in an OUT and subject to ejection from the game and suspension of next game (should team advance)"
- ARGUING with umpires will be limited to 30 seconds for explanation of your complaint, and contacting the game coordinator for any further resolution
- Catcher's must wear a one-piece hockey style mask

GAME ROSTERS consist of 25 players, 2 players at each of 8 positions, 2 DH's, 7 pitchers (all exceptions must be signed off on 1 hour before the game or by agreement with the game coordinator's permission) * *Each team will be limited to no more than 15 Seniors for 2023*

Pitchers can pitch a maximum of 3 innings per game

Position players and DH's must play a minimum of 4 innings
Designated hitters must bat in the same spot in the line-up

A pitcher in your 1st game CAN be a position player in your 2nd game

A positions player in your 1st game CAN be a pitcher in your 2nd game

Substitutions can be made between the 5th and 6th innings, in any legal baseball fashion - NO RE-ENTRY unless made by game coordinator. All changes must be given to game coordinator prior to that player taking the field.

Extra Innings Pitchers: Prior to each game, each team will provide game coordinator with three (3) position players at the start of the game who will serve as extra innings pitchers. Last rostered pitcher **MUST** complete their 3-maximum innings (9 outs) before extra inning pitchers are entered. Extra Inning pitcher will not hit and will occupied by the DH.

Players not able to play may be replaced on the roster. Any player that is replaced is done for the tournament. Exception is a high school sanctioned playoff game. The replacement will need to complete a waiver form and the coach must fill-in the player profile form

HISTORY

- During the fall of 1985, a committee of high school baseball coaches from the tri-state area met with representatives from the Philadelphia Phillies to discuss the possibility of holding a tournament for the outstanding players in the region. The tournament would be named in honor of Robert & Ruly Carpenter, former owners of the Phillies. The Carpenter Cup Classic evolved from those meetings with the first single elimination tournament being held in June, 1986 at Veterans Stadium. Today, 16 teams participate in the event beginning at Richie Ashburn Field (FDR Park) and concluding with the semifinals and championship at Citizens Bank Park.

EXTRA INNINGS (26 total)

- Most extra-inning games in one tournament took place in 1993, when four of the 15 games went extra innings
- Longest game in tournament history was an 18-inning affair between Ocean Monmouth and Lehigh Valley on June 26, 2002; final score: Ocean Monmouth 7, Lehigh Valley 5

TRIPLE PLAY

- In game 6 of 2007, Mercer County recorded the first triple play in the then, 22 years of the Carpenter Cup in their first round game versus Delaware North. With Mercer County in the field and Delaware North batting in the top of the 5th inning, Dan Schafferman was on 1B, Alex Riley on 2B, and Tom Visk at bat. Visk lined out to Mercer County first baseman Ryan Murphy who then stepped on the bag to get Schafferman out and then threw to the shortstop who recorded the putout of Alex Riley at 2B.
- In game 3 of the 2016 Carpenter Cup, Philadelphia Catholic turned a triple play against Burlington County. With runners at first and second, Burlington County's Tyler Dearden hit a long fly ball to center field, which Philadelphia Catholic CF Marquise Wood caught on the run. Wood hit SS Greg Grandelli with the relay throw and Grandelli threw to 2B Jeff Manto for the second out. Manto then threw to 1B John Cappola to complete the triple play.

ONE-HITTER

- In game 3 of 2019, Jersey Shore pitched a combined one-hit shutout against Chester County in a 3-0 victory.
- In game 7 of 2017, Delaware South pitched a combined one-hit game against Philadelphia Public in a 4-1 victory.
- In game 7 of 2014, Berks County pitched a combined one-hit game against SOL American/Continental in a 2-1 victory.
- In game 8 of 2008, SOL American & Continental pitched a combined one-hit game against Delaware North to get the shutout win, 5-0.
- The only other one-hitter on record in the Carpenter Cup Classic came in 2000 when Delaware North threw a combined one-hit game against Ocean Monmouth (now Jersey Shore).

ONE-RUN GAMES

- 118 of 514 Carpenter Cup Classic games have been decided by one run.

MOST RUNS SCORED BY ONE TEAM IN A GAME

- Chester County defeated Delaware South on June 20, 2006 by a score of 27-8. This replaced the previous record of 22 runs scored by a team when South Jersey North defeated Suburban American 22-2 in the semifinal game of the 1986 and first Carpenter Cup (June 20, 1986).
