On behalf of the nearly 40 regional business and non-profit leaders who compose the Tampa Bay Partnership, I request your support in approving the Historic Gas Plant Redevelopment Project proposed by the Hines Historic Gas Plant Partnership.

Professional sports teams are critical economic drivers, contributing to their communities' economic vibrancy and overall prosperity. As an anchor institution, the Tampa Bay Rays' presence in St. Petersburg and participation in shaping the development project elucidated Hines' bid. The very presence of Major League Baseball increases the viability of revitalizing the 86 acres.

The development plan strategically creates multi-use zones designed to increase the flow of programming and citizen engagement throughout the district's core. This layered infrastructure will be a catalyst for the 86 acres, increasing the economic density in parcels surrounding the stadium. This will generate new tax revenue for both the City and County.
