### NOTING THE ROCKIES

**TODAY:** Rockies begin their 13th season of Major League Baseball this afternoon, hosting the San Diego Padres in the 2005 opener here at Coors Field...this is the first time Colorado has opened at home since 2001 and only the fourth time overall, also doing so in 1994 and 1995...Rox are 6-6 all-time on Opening Day but 2-1 at home and a perfect 2-0 here at Coors Field...are 7-5 in home openers, winning four of the last five...these two clubs have met once before in a season opener, 1999, when the Rockies defeated the Padres 8-2 in Monterrey, Mexico...Colorado owns an all-time record of 882-999 (.469) in 12 years as a franchise, just one loss shy of 1,000...that .469 win pct. still ranks as the fourth best record of any expansion team after 12 seasons...Colorado is 514-425 (.547) all-time here in the Mile High City, including a 450-351 ledger at Coors Field (.562)...Rox will try and re-gain that home field advantage this summer after posting their worst record ever at Coors in 2004 (38-43).

**THE SKIPPER:** Clint Hurdle is in his fourth season as the Rockies' manager, his 12th season overall with the organization...Clint was named manager on April 26, 2002 and has led the Rockies to a 209-255 (.450) record in just under three full seasons...Rockies are 131-102 (.562) at home under Hurdle, the best home record of any Colorado manager based on winning percentage...since Coors Field opened in 1995, only Don Baylor (191-133, .590) has a higher win percentage at this particular ballpark...Hurdle was selected as one of the National League's coaches for the 2004 All-Star Game in Houston.

**YOUNG GUNS:** Rockies open the 2005 season with an average age of 26 years, 324 days, by far the youngest roster in baseball...it's more than a year younger than the Devil Rays, who's average player is 28 years and 20 days...these figures, compiled by the Elias Sports Bureau, include players currently on the disabled list...however, even if you do NOT include DL players, Rockies still come in as the youngest at 27 years, 80 days...Kansas City is second in that scenario at 28.150...the Yankees check in as the oldest, over 34 years old...a look here at the youngest teams in baseball, including disabled list.

**YOUNG GUNS PART II:** Almost half (12) of Colorado's 25 active players are making their first appearance on an Opening Day roster, which includes four players making their ML debut (Marcos Carvajal, Ryan Speier, Jeff Baker and Cory Sullivan)...the 20-year old Carvajal will become the youngest player in Rockies history when he makes his debut...the 2005 club features eight rookies, 11 if you count guys on the DL...with his start behind the plate today, J.D. Closser will become the first rookie catcher to start on Opening Day in the National League since Jason Kendall did it for the Pirates in 1996...Rockies played a club-record 18 different rookies in 2004, most in the NL and second behind only the Royals (21) in all of baseball...Colorado led the majors in games played by rookies (792) and were second in games started by rookies (473).

**ATKINS ON DL:** The Rockies made one final transaction yesterday, placing 3B Garrett Atkins on the 15-day disabled list due to a strained right hamstring and recalling 3B Jeff Baker from Double-A Tulsa.

**SPRING RECAP:** Rockies enjoyed one of their best springs in franchise history, posting a 17-14 record, third best in the Cactus League...Colorado's 17 wins finished as the third most in Rockies spring history, two short of the record (19-15 in 1996)...Cory Sullivan won the 2005 Abby Greer Award as the club's spring MVP...Cory played in a team-high 24 games this spring, hitting .396 (21-for-53) with a .450 OBP.

**HISTORIC OPENER, APRIL 4, 1999:** Six years ago today, April 4, 1999, Colorado and San Diego opened the '99 season in Monterrey, Mexico, becoming the first teams to ever open a Major League season outside of the U.S. or Canada...behind 6.2 strong innings from Darryl Kile and 4-for-5 efforts from both Dante Bichette and Vinny Castilla, the Rockies defeated the Padres 8-2.

**ROX AND FRIARS:** Today is the first of 18 meetings between San Diego and Colorado in 2005... these two clubs have met 175 times in the regular season, with Colorado holding a 90-85 advantage...Rox are 46-39 against SD at home but struggled last year, as the Friars won six of the nine matchups here in Denver...Rox did go 7-3 at PETCO Park last year.

- **The 25-year old lefty makes his second career Opening Day start.**
- Started the 2003 season opener as a member of the Tampa Bay Devil Rays on March 31, 2003 vs. Boston...Joe got the no decision opposite Pedro Martinez that day, allowing 4 runs but only 1 earned on 8 hits with no walks and 3 strikeouts in 7.0 innings...Tampa went on to win the game 6-4
- **Today is Kennedy's 100th major league start**, as he enters with a career record of 27-38 with a 4.63 ERA in 109 appearances (99 starts)...Joe begins his second year with the Rockies and fifth in the major leagues...he spent his first six years as a professional in the Devil Rays organization.
- **Kennedy is coming off a 2004 season in which he set career highs in both wins (9) and strikeouts (117), while establishing a Rockies franchise record for lowest ERA (3.66)**...in fact, he became the first pitcher in club history to ever post a sub-4.00 qualifying ERA...still needing 7.2 innings in his final start to qualify, Joe worked 8.0 innings in a complete-game loss to the Astros on Oct. 1, finishing at 162.1 IP...his 3.66 earned run average ranked 18th in the National League and seventh among NL left-handers...the previous club record for lowest ERA was exactly 4.00 by Armando Reynoso set during the 1993 expansion season.
- Today is only his second career start against the Padres...had a no decision on May 24, 2005 vs. San Diego in Denver, allowing 6 runs on 7 hits in just 5.0 innings of work...Rox lost 11-6.
- **Kennedy a year ago compiled one of the finest seasons ever at Coors Field, as he finished the year 6-1 with a 3.59 ERA in 14 starts at home** (82.2 ip, 33 er)...it ranked as the second lowest ERA by a starting pitcher at this ballpark, trailing only Denny Stark's 3.21 in 2002...went 3-6 with a 3.73 ERA in 13 road assignments.
- Made six starts this spring, going 2-1 with a 4.94 ERA in a team-high 23.2 innings of work...he tied for the club lead with 2 wins.
- Picked off 5 baserunners last year, tied for second in the NL (Chris Capuano 6)...the southpaw has picked off 19 runners in his four ML seasons, including a league-leading 8 in 2002...**his 19 pickoffs rank as the sixth most of any pitcher since 2001.**
- Has worked 6.0 or more innings in 64 of his 99 ML starts (65%), going 7.0-plus on 31 occasions...he's thrown 7 career complete games, 5 alone during the 2002 season...one of those came at Coors Field, June 23, 2002 in a losing effort...has allowed 3 or fewer runs in 61 of his 99 assignments.
- Will look to duplicate his early season success from last year when he went 3-0 with a 2.67 ERA in the month of April...it was his most wins and lowest ERA over a full month as a major leaguer...among the NL leaders in April, Joe tied for third in wins, was seventh in ERA and tied for 10th in average against (.219)...all four of his outings throughout the month were "quality starts."
- Was by no means an easy out at the plate last summer, as he batted .125 (6-for-48) with a double, triple and 4 RBI...he is a .169 career hitter with 10 hits and 5 RBI.

- The 26-year right-hander will make his first start of the year and 105th of his major league career on Wednesday.
- Jennings enters this season just 10 wins shy of tying Pedro Astacio's franchise record for career victories (53)...owns a 43-34 lifetime record while his team is 54-50 in his 104 starts.
- Needs one home victory to tie Astacio's ballpark record of 24 wins here at Coors Field...Jennings is 23-13 at Coors and the Rockies are 32-16 in his 48 starts at this ballpark (.667).
- Will make his 14th career start against the Padres, tied for his most against any one team (also 14 vs. SF)...is 5-3 with a 5.11 ERA vs. SD, including 4-1 combined record with a 2.33 ERA at Qualcomm Stadium and PETCO Park (46.1 ip, 12 er)...here at Coors, is just 1-2 with a 9.51 ERA against the Friars (29.1 ip, 31 er)...will be facing Adam Eaton for the sixth time in his career...they faced off four times last year, with Jason and the Rockies going 3-1 in those games.
- Owns the highest career batting average (.249) among active pitchers.

- Is a three-time Rawlings Gold Glove Award winner (2001-02, '04) and his .995 career fielding percentage ranks fifth all-time in ML history.
- Enters 2005 with a streak of 14 consecutive full months in which he's hit .300 or better, tied for the third longest such streak in the majors since 1969...has posted a .300 average or higher in 40 of 49 career months, including 24 of the last 25...has combined to bat .337 in his last two Aprils (59-for-175) but April (.298) is still the only month he does not hit .300.
