NOTING THE ROCKIES

PRESENT TENSE: The Rockies took the last 2 games of this week's series in Anaheim and are 2-1 to begin 6-game AL West road trip...Rox have won 4 of 5...club has won 4 of its last 5 series and 5 of last 7...team has taken 2 of last 3 road series after having dropped 6 straight series away from hom...Rox are .500 over the last 12 games, but have won 13 of their last 21...the current 40-38 record matches the 4th-best start in franchise history, as Rockies have had better records through 78 games in just 3 seasons (1995, 1997, 2000)...with a win tonight, club would 3rd-best start for the Rockies...Colorado is 9-3 in interleague games this season...this weekend's series will end a stretch of 12 straight against teams from the AL West...team is 20-20 on the road, the team's best record through 40 road games in franchise history...could still match best 41-road game record ever, even with a loss tonight...club is 1.0 games back in the NL West, the team's smallest deficit since May 22 (0.5 GB)...team has held at least a share of the division lead for 32 days this season, the 2nd-most days in first place in a season in franchise history.

ALIVE: With a loss by division-leading San Diego yesterday, the idle Rockies moved to within 1.0 game of the division lead, the club's smallest deficit since May 22 (0.5 GB)...beginning June 5, the Rox have lost ground in the division just 3 times in the last 23 days...this is Colorado's smallest deficit in the NL West this late in a season since July 3, 2000...that year, team dropped a doubleheader at San Francisco on July 4 to fall 1.5 games back, and would never get within a game of the division lead again...prior to 2000, latest date to trail by 1.0 game or less came in 1996, when team was 1.0 game back through Aug. 7, 1996.

LONG ROAD: The Rockies' current 20-20 road record is the best in franchise history through 40 road games in Denver...in fact, entering today, Colorado joins New York-NL as the only National League teams to be .500 or better both at home and on the road...only New York-NL (25-16) and San Diego (20-15) have better road records than the Rockies among NL teams...5 of the 14 AL teams are .500 or better on the road...Colorado did not record its 20th road win last season until Sept. 6, and posted just 27 road victories all of last year...team has already won 5 road series this season after just 8 all of last year.

RIVAL: The Rockies are 9-3 against the American League this season, the best mark among all NL teams in interleague play...the 9 wins also lead all NL clubs...in fact, Colorado joins just 2 other NL teams with records of better than .500: Florida and San Francisco (both 8-7)...Rox' .750 winning pct. ranks 6th in the majors in interleague play, as Boston is 14-1 against the NL while Detroit, Minnesota, and Seattle are all 13-2...White Sox are 12-3...Rox' 9 interleague wins matches the most in a single season in franchise history (also 1997 and 2003)...with 2 wins in this series, it would also give Colorado its most road interleague victories ever in a single campaign.

ALL THOSE YESTERDAYS: On June 30, 1996, Rockies 2B Eric Young stole 6 bases in Colorado's 16-15 win over the Dodgers to tie a major league record...there were seven lead changes in the contest, which lasted 4 hours, 20 minutes, then an NL-record and still a Rox club record.

HAIL HAIL: Colorado Springs pitchers Nate Field and Justin Hampson have been named to the PCL All-Star team, which will play the International League All-Stars on July 12 in Toledo, Ohio, hometown of Katie Holmes...Sky Sox coach Alan Cockrell will be on the PCL staff for the Triple-A All-Star Game.

OFF HE GOES: Right-handed pitcher Greg Reynolds, selected by the Rockies with the second overall pick in this year's draft, has been activated with Modesto of the California League...Reynolds had been throwing bullpen sessions with Tri-City of the Northwest League during the Cal League's All-Star break.

REARVIEWMIRROR: The Rockies are 13-12 in June entering the final game of the month...this is most wins, and will mark first time to be .500 or better in June, since 2003, when club went 15-13...entering this final game, Rox have had a winning record in June in just 2 of the last 8 seasons (beginning 1997)...Colorado currently leads the NL with a .290 average this month, 4th in the majors...team's 144 runs ranks 2nd in NL, T5th-most in majors...current run total is already highest since last Sept. (152)...current average would be highest in June since 2001 (.302)...team's current 4.44 ERA ranks 6th in NL this month...Matt Holliday ranks 3rd in the NL with a .400 (40-for-100) avg. this month while Garrett Atkins ranks 2nd in league with 27 RBI...Jason Jennings has a 2.62 ERA (34.1 ip, 10 er) this month, T9th-best in the NL.

INDIFFERENCE: This marks the Rockies' first series with Seattle since 2002, when club went 1-2 here at Safeco...Colorado has won just one of 7 series between the clubs, that being a 2-game set in 1997...M's have taken each of last 5 series beginning 1998, all by a 2-1 margin...Todd Helton's has reached base safely via hit or walk in 29 consecutive games, the longest streak of his career and 6 shy of matching the club record...beginning Sept. 13, 2005, Helton has reached safely via hit, walk, or HBP in 77 of his last 82 major league games...since last season, Rockies DH's are batting .371 (13-for-35)...Jorge Piedra has an RBI in each of his 3 starts at DH this season.

- The 29-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season, the 135th start and 152nd appearance of his career...Rockies are 8-7 in his starting assignments.
- Earned win in last start on Sat. vs. Texas, an 11-6 Rockies win (5.0 ip, 11 h, 5 r-4 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...the 11 hits allowed was a season-high, matching 3rd-most in his career...has tossed 5.0 innings in 2 straight starts...game was delayed by rain, as Fogg has been the start in each Rockies game delayed this season.
- Has never faced the Mariners, but is 2-0, 5.91 (10.2 ip, 7 er) in 2 interleague starts this season and is 6-3, 5.88 (78.0 ip, 51 er) in 13 career interleague assignments.
- Has tossed at least 5.0 innings in 13 of 15 starts.
- Rox have won 3 of his last 4 starts.
- Lost on June 18 at St. Louis in Colorado's 4-1 defeat...gave up a homer to Scott Rolen in the first inning and a run-scoring triple to Aaron Miles in the 4th...marked his 8th straight loss to the Cardinals and fell to 1-9 with a 6.97 in his career against them.
- In his career, has gone 3-3 with a 7.18 ERA (31.1 ip, 25 er) in 6 career starts vs. the AL West.
- Fogg has thrown at least 5.0 innings in 13 of 15 starts this year while permitting 3 or fewer earned runs in 11 of 15 outings...has also permitted 3 or fewer walks in 12 contests...Rox have lost 6 of Fogg's last 10 starts after winning 4 of first 5.
- Has averaged 6.80 runs of support, highest among Rox starting pitchers and 3rd-best in NL.
- Earned win on June 13 at Washington, a 9-2 Rox victory (6.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r-er, 4 bb, 4 so)...worked just one 1-2-3 inning, but stranded 8 runners...the one run allowed matched lowest total this season...was first career win against the Montreal/Washington franchise.
- Took no decision on May 9 at St. Louis despite leaving with a 2-1 lead vs. Chris Carpenter...Albert Pujols hit a 3-run HR off Jose Mesa in the 8th inning of that 4-2 Colorado loss.
- Took no decision on June 7 vs. Pittsburgh at Coors Field despite allowing 8 runs in 4.1 innings...was first career matchup against his former club...was most runs allowed since August 5, 2005 at LA and most earned runs allowed since May 2, 2005 at Houston.
- Took loss on June 2 vs. Fla. despite quality start, a 4-2 loss to Fish...Rox managed just 2 solo homers off opposing starter Dontrelle Willis.
- Has made at least 26 starts while throwing 142.0 or more innings in four straight seasons.
- Is a career .107 hitter with 13 runs scored, 2 doubles and 8 RBI...has gone hitless last 37 at-bats since single on July 31, 2005 at Atlanta.
- Due to the late addition, his bio appears on pages 216-218 of this year's Rockies media guide.
