TONIGHT: Colorado will open the season's "second-half" by hosting the Philadelphia Phillies in this first game of a three-game set at Coors Field...the Rockies will start the season's "second-half" with a 6-game homestand vs. PHI (7/13-15) and PIT (7/16-18)...this current three-game set will mark the second of three series played against the Phillies this season...the Rockies defeated Washington for their 32nd win of the season in the final game of the "first-half" by a score of 4-3 on 7/8 at WAS.

- Rockies left-handed pitcher Christian Friedrich will take the mound for the Rockies tonight in his first start since 7/5 at STL...Friedrich is looking to snap his five-game, six-start, losing streak that dates back to 6/10 vs. LAA.
- The Phillies will send LHP Cliff Lee to the mound...Lee will be facing the Rockies for the first time this season as he looks to collect just his second win of 2012.

VS. PHILLIES: The Rockies will be facing the Phillies for the second series this season...Colorado is 1-2 against Philadelphia this season after losing two of three at Citizen's Bank Park 6/19-21...Colorado has an all-time record of 61-85 against Philadelphia, including 30-40 at home...the Rockies will travel to Philadelphia one more time this season for a three-game set at Citizen's Bank Park, 9/7-9.

ROCKIES IN THE 2ND HALF: The Rockies will begin the second-half of the season by hosting six games at home before taking to the road for six-day, six-game trip to San Diego and Arizona...the Rockies will be looking for their first Post-ASG above .500 record since 2009 when they posted a 45-29 record.

FOWLER IN THE LAST YEAR: Since the start of the "second-half" of last season (since 7/14/11) Rockies outfielder Dexter Fowler has hit .294 (153-for-521) with 33 doubles, 19 triples, 16 home runs, 63 RBI, 96 runs scored, 74 walks and 17 stolen bases while having an OPS of .907.

- Fowler's .907 OPS is the sixth-best among MLB outfielders since 7/14/11...additionally, his .294 average is seventh-best, his .385 on-base percentage is third-best and his 68 extra-base hits are fourth-best among NL outfielders since the 2011 All-Star Break.
- Fowler's teammate Carlos Gonzalez is one of the few players ahead of Fowler on the lists above...Gonzalez is second behind only Ryan Braun (1.010) with a .967 OPS since the 2011 All-Star Break...Gonzalez's .320 average (143-for-530) in that same span is tied for third among all NL players and his 30 home runs are tied for fifth among all NL players.

RAFAEL AND THE HALF: Rockies closer Rafael Betancourt had one of the best second-half's in baseball last season as he owned a 0.33 ERA (27.0 ip, 1 er) following the All-Star Break in 2011...additionally, Rafael held opposing hitters to a .080 batting average (7-for-88) while walking just one batter, striking out 39 and collecting eight saves and four holds in his 29 appearances.

EQUIPMENT DAY AT COORS FIELD: The Colorado Rockies and the Baseball Tomorrow Fund, in association with Major League Baseball, will be collecting equipment donations to support youth programs in Denver prior to tomorrow's game against Philadelphia.

- The Baseball Tomorrow Fund will also award a grant of \$5,000 to the Denver Public Schools Foundation for the purchase of new equipment during tonight's pre-game ceremonies.
- This year marks the 8th season the BTF has teamed up with MLB clubs to collect equipment...to date nearly 100,000 pieces of equipment and approximately \$1,250,000 have been donated.

2012 RUN SUPPORT PER START

Christian Friedrich will be making his 13th career Major League start and appearance today...Friedrich had 81 career appearances, all starts, in his five seasons in the Minor Leagues prior to his call up.

- Last Outing: Was issued his fifth straight loss, coming in his last six starts, 7/5 at STL...allowed six runs on five hits, three walks and five strikeouts over 4.1 innings...Rox are 0-6 in his last six starts, since 6/10 vs. LAA.
Decision Streaks: Friedrich's four wins are tied for the Rockies lead this season...he is also second among Rockies with his 12 starts...Friedrich snapped his three-game winning streak with the loss 6/10 vs. LAA, however, the three game streak is the longest for any Rockies starting pitcher this season, and also tied for the longest by a rookie in the National League this season...the Rockies are 4-8 in his 12 starts this season...Friedrich has been issued the loss in five of his last six starts.
Keeping up with the K: Friedrich's has 62 strikeouts in his first 12 career starts...he owns an 8.6 strikeouts per 9.0 innings pitched ratio (62 K, 64.2 IP)...Friedrich also owns a 2.82 strikeout to walk ratio (62 K, 22 BB)...his 62 strikeouts are the most by any Rockies pitcher this season...additionally, his 62 strikeouts are fourth-most by a rookie in the NL.
Strikeouts for the Southpaw: Through his first two starts he had 17 K, which set a new Rox record for most strikeouts through a pitchers first two MLB games and represented the most for an active Major League pitcher since Stephen Strasburg struck out 22 in his first two games in June of 2010...Friedrich is only the fourth left-hander in Rox history to strikeout at least 10 in a game, joining De La Rosa (5x), Brian Bohanon and Jeff Francis.
MLB Debut: Friedrich earned the win in his Major League debut 5/9 at SD after allowing two runs, one earned, on five hits, one walk and seven strikeouts over 6.0 innings...Friedrich became the eighth starting pitcher in franchise history to earn a victory in his ML debut, and the 11th pitcher overall to earn a victory in his ML debut...he is the third Rox pitcher to win in his MLB debut as a starter in the last two seasons, joining Pomeranz (9/11/11 vs. CIN) and Nicasio (5/28/11 vs. STL)...his 7 strikeouts were the 2nd-most for a Rox pitcher in his ML debut...Mark Brownson also had 7 K on 7/21/98 at HOU...Jason Jennings struck out a franchise-record 8 in his ML debut on 8/23/01 at NYM...Friedrich's 7 strikeouts also tied the most by a Rockies pitcher at that time this season.
Stop the Streak: In his Major League debut on 5/9 at SD and he earned the win while also stopping Colorado's five-game losing streak...over the last 10 seasons, only two other pitchers making their MLB debuts started and got the win after their team had lost at least the five previous games: Baltimore's Brad Bergesen in 2009 and Pittsburgh's Paul Maholm in 2005.
Minor League Success: In his five seasons in the Minors, Friedrich went 19-24 with a 4.04 ERA (418.1 ip, 188 er), 140 walks, 418 hits, 40 home runs and 432 strikeouts in 81 starts...the lefty set career-highs in 2011 with Double-Ain starts (25), wins (6), IP (133.1), BB (43) and K (103)...was named a Texas League Mid-season All-Star after going 5-5, 3.89 ERA (76.1 ip, 33 er), 22 walks and 60 strikeouts in 14 first half starts for Tulsa.
First-Round Pick: Friedrich was the Rockies first round pick (25th overall) in the 2008 Draft out of Eastern Kentucky University...he became the first ever player out of EKV to be drafted in the first round and is the sixth former Ohio Valley Conference player currently in the MLB.
College: Attended Eastern Kentucky University...was rated as the second-best left-handed pitcher in the 2008 Draft by Baseball America...was the 2008 Ohio Valley Conference Pitcher of the Year, his junior season...ranked second in the nation in ERA and H/9.0 IP (4.41) and eighth in K/9.0 IP (11.90) in 2008...is the all-time career strikeouts leader (327) at EKV, and as a freshman pitched the fifth no-hitter in school history.

- Last Start: Was issued a no decision in the Rockies 4-3 win, 7/8 at WAS...allowed two runs on six hits, one walk and three strikeouts over 6.0 innings for his second straight quality start.
Relief vs. Starting: Guthrie is 3-7 with a 6.34 ERA (71.0 ip, 50 er), 25 walks, 35 strikeouts and 16 home runs in 13 starts this season for the Rockies...he was moved to the bullpen following his start 6/17 and made four appearances in relief going 0-1 with a 4.38 ERA (12.1 ip, 6 er).
vs. the Phillies: Guthrie has one start and one relief outing in his career against Philadelphia...made his relief outing earlier this season with 3.0 perfect innings with two strikeouts...in his sole start against the Phils, Guthrie went 7.0 innings allowing just one run on two walks, three hits and four strikeouts 6/21/09...both appearances at Philadelphia
Road Waves: Guthrie has made nine road starts this season...in his nine starts he is 2-4 with a 4.22 ERA (42.2 ip, 20 er)...despite having a loss in four straight road games, Guthrie has tossed four quality starts in his nine road nods this season.

• Ranks in NL: RBI (58, 6th), HR (17, T6th), runs (61, 1st), average (.330, 6th), hits (104, T5th), SLG (.578, 5th), OBP (.389, 8th), multi-hit games (32, T3rd), total bases (182, 3rd), XBH (40, T3rd) and vs. RHP avg. (.352, 2nd).
• Has hit safely in 21-of-25 games since 6/8 at .353 (36-for-102) w/ 6 2B, 3B, 3 HR, 13 RBI.
