TONIGHT: The Rockies will host the Chicago Cubs in the second game of this 3-game series at Coors Field...this game is the fifth of the club's current 8-game homestand vs. PIT (1-2), CHC (1-0) and SF (Tue.-Wed.)...the Rockies are coming off the club's first home series loss since the club lost 3-of-4 games to HOU 6/7-10...Colorado had won 5-straight series before losing 2-of-3 games to the Pirates...Colorado is in the middle of a stretch of 17-straight games without an off-day...the club's next scheduled off-day is Monday...Jason Hammel will be making his 19th start of the season tonight...the righty will be tossing opposite lefty Tom Gorzelanny, who will be making his 15th start of 2010.

- The Rockies improved to 5-1 at home on Friday's this season and have won 12 of the 17 series openers at Coors Field this year.

ROCKIE RECORDS: Last night the Rockies defeated the Cubs 17-2 by scoring 12 runs in the 8th inning on 11 consecutive hits with two outs...the Rockies tallied the 12 runs, 8 XBH and 13 hits in 18 plate appearances, including having 13 consecutive base runners.

- STATS LLC:** The 12 runs with 2 outs in the 8th inning is the most in the MLB since 3/21/56 when the KC Athletics had 13 runs with 2 outs in the 2nd inning vs. CWS...the 12 runs also ties the NL record done twice by the Brooklyn Dodgers, last was 8/8/54 vs. CIN (8th).
- Elias Says:** Colorado poled out its 11 straight hits without as much as a walk or a hit batsman involved (by rule, such plate appearances wouldn't interrupt a string of "consecutive hits" for a player or a team)...the Rockies fell one hit shy of the Major League record of 12 consecutive hits in a game, a mark shared by the 1920 Cardinals and the 1930 Brooklyn Dodgers.
- More from STATS LLC:** The 8 XBH last night by the Rox ties an MLB record set by Cleveland on 4/18/09 vs. NYY (2nd inning).
- Colorado combined to hit 8 doubles last night, a season-high and just one shy of the franchise record set 7/2/93 also vs. CHC.

BATTING AROUND: The Rockies cycled through their batting order three times last night, twice in the 8th inning and once in the 3rd...they also came just one batter away from doing so in the 5th inning...in total, each position in the batting order reached base at least twice, each player that had an official plate appearance had a hit and the first seven hitters in the lineup all recorded at least two RBI...the last team to bat around twice in the same inning was Boston on 6/26/03 in the 1st inning vs. FLA...Boston scored 14 runs in the 1st and won the game 25-8 (STATS LLC).

THE FRANCHISE: In last night's 17-2 win over the Cubs the Rockies set seven franchise records...below are the franchise records set and the previous records:

GOING, GOING, GON-ZALEZ: Carlos Gonzalez hit his 20th home run of the season last night...it marked his third consecutive game with a home run and third-straight multi-hit game.

- Gonzalez has hit a home run in four-consecutive games one time in his career but never in four straight days...the only other time he hit home runs in three-straight days was 8/16-19/09 when he had four home runs in four games (8/16 was doubleheader).
- CarGo leads the National League with a .370 batting average at home...that mark sits only behind Josh Hamilton (.386) for highest home average in the Majors...his 16 homers at home are most in the NL.
- Carlos also ranks in the top 10 in the NL in: overall batting average (4th-.314), runs (7th-65), hits (3rd-119), RBI (7th-66), total bases (7th-533), slugging (7th-.533), average with RISP (8th-.337) and average vs. RHP (8th-.319).

HONORING KELI MCGREGOR The Rockies will wear patches - with the initials "KSM" - on their jerseys for the remainder of the season to honor the late President of the Colorado Rockies, Keli S. McGregor.

ON THIS DATE: (1996) - Dante Bichette collected his 1,000th major league hit with a single off Montreal's Jeff Fassero in the 6th inning.

FROM THE CLIPS: "Those are good pitchers they're throwing out there, too," Tulowitzki said. "It wasn't like guys that just got called up. Those guys had some good numbers...I don't know what the difference is. Baseball is a game of momentum. Once you get going, you roll a little bit." (ColoradoRockies.com) Said Troy Tulowitzki about the streak of 11-straight hits by the Rockies that led to 12 runs in the 8th inning.

ELIAS SAYS: The Rockies, en route to 12 runs in the eighth inning and a 17-2 win over the Cubs, established a major league record with 11 consecutive hits in an inning...the previous record of 10 consecutive hits in an inning was shared by 11 teams, the last being the Cardinals in 2007...there have been more than 190,000 games played in major-league history, in which there have been well over three million half-innings...the Rockies' consecutive-hits-in-an-inning record was set against that backdrop.

RUN SUPPORT (PER START)

The 27-year-old Hammel will make his 19th start and appearance of the 2010 season tonight...it will be Hammel's 126th career appearance and 77th career start...is his 49th career start in a Rockies uniform.

- In his last start: Was given his third-straight loss in his shortest outing since 6/24 vs. Boston...allowed five runs, four earned on seven hits while striking out eight...his 111 pitches were the most since 6/18 vs. Milwaukee.
• Strike 'em out: Since his start 7/4 vs. SF Hammel has the fourth-most strikeouts in the Majors with 35...he sits behind only Ricky Nolasco (40), Roy Halladay (37) and Cliff Lee (36) over that same period...Hammel set a career-high with 10 strikeouts 7/16 at CIN...despite getting the loss he bettered his previous high by two Ks...this season he has tied his career-high at the time (5/27 vs. ARI & 7/4 vs. SF) and set his career-high for strikeouts.
• Back from the DL: Is 7-4 with a 3.35 ERA (91.1 ip, 34 er) in his 14 starts since being reinstated from the DL on 5/15...was 0-2 with a 9.16 ERA (18.2 ip, 19 er) in his 4 starts prior to his DL stint.
• Bring back June: In his career is 9-1, 3.35 (94.0 ip, 35 er) in June compared to 1-7, 4.62 (85.2 ip, 44 er) in the month of July...his last win in July came in a start 7/27/07 vs. Boston as a member of Tampa Bay.
• Streak ended: His career-high 6-game win-streak ended with a loss 7/16 at CIN...the streak dated back to his win 5/27 vs. Arizona...had three no-decisions over the stretch and had a 2.17 ERA (58.0 ip, 14 er) while walking 15 and striking out 46...the Rockies went 8-1 over his winning-streak.
• July: Was tagged with his second-straight loss despite throwing at least 7.0 innings for the third time in his last four starts, 7/21 at FLA...threw 7.0 innings allowing three runs on eight hits and striking out a career-high 10 batters, 7/16 at CIN...was tagged with his first loss since 5/21 at KC...earned his career-high 6th win in a row allowing two runs on five hits over 6.1 innings pitched on 7/10 vs. SD...it was his third quality start in a row and third time in last four games he threw 89 pitches or less...the two earned runs came in 7th inning...it was his second-straight start that he took a shutout into at least the 6th inning.
• June: Finished the month of June with the 2nd lowest ERA (1.83) among NL starting pitchers (Johnson, FLA - 1.18)...extended his career-long consecutive scoreless innings pitched streak to 25.1 innings by tossing 7.1 scoreless innings on 6/18 vs. MIL...earned his 3rd straight victory and extended his career-best scoreless innings pitched streak to 18.0 innings by tossing 8.0 scoreless frames on 6/12 vs. TOR...tossed 7.1 scoreless innings 6/7 vs. HOU to earn his 3rd win of the season...was his first scoreless start of the season...tossed his first quality start on the road this season 6/1 at SF...exited with the Rockies tied 1-1, but Rox rallied for 2-1 victory in 11th.
• May: Earned his 2nd win of the season on 5/27 vs. ARI...struck out a season best 8 batters, which ties a career high (5th time with 8 K's)...took the loss 5/21 at KC...had 2 of his inherited runners score with two outs in 7th inning to allow Royals to pull away...was reinstated from the 15-day DL prior to Game 2 on 5/15...missed 18 days while on the DL with a strained right groin...earned his first win of the season in his start on 5/15 vs. WAS (G2), allowed just 3 runs in 7.0 innings and struck out 7 batters.
• April: Was forced to leave his start early on 4/26 vs. ARI due to a right groin injury...allowed 5 runs, all earned in 3.0 innings of that start...tossed his first quality start of the season 4/21 at WAS, but was forced to take a no decision...lasted just 1.2 innings on 4/16 at ATL...the 1.2 innings marks the 2nd shortest start of his career (1.1 ip, 7/30 at NYM).
• Postseason: Hammel's club has made the postseason in each of the past two years (Tampa Bay in 2008, Colorado in 2009)...made his first career postseason appearance/start in Game 3 of the 2009 Division Series vs. Philadelphia (3.2 ip, 4 h, 4 r-er, 3 bb, 5 so).
• 2009: Hammel set career highs in wins (10), starts (30), innings (176.2 ip), and strikeouts (133) for the Rockies in 2009, his first season in Purple Pinstripes...owned a personal 5-decision winning streak from 5/24-6/26/09; during the streak he went 5-0 with a 3.92 ERA (41.1 ip, 18 er) with 31 strikeouts and just 10 walks...as part of his 5-decision winning streak, Hammel earned the first and last wins of the Rockies club-record tying 11-game win-streak from June 4-14 of last season...issued just 2.1 walks per 9.0 innings pitched in 2009, the 9th-best mark among qualifying NL pitchers...Hammel went 3-3 with a 5.73 ERA (81.2 ip, 52 er) in 16 games/15 starts at Coors Field last season, compared to 7-5 with a 3.13 ERA (95.0 ip, 33 er) in 18 games/15 starts on the road...Hammel's 3.13 ERA on the road last season was the best mark among Rockies starters, and the 9th lowest ERA in the NL among starters.
• Career: Was acquired from Tampa Bay in exchange for RHP Aneury Rodriguez on 4/5/09.
