THE GUNS OF AUGUST

- The Colorado Rockies continue their seven-game homestand with the third game of a four-game series vs. the Los Angeles Dodgers.
- Beginning this past Thursday, the Rockies play 30 of their final 48 games vs. National League West opponents, including 10 (eight remaining) vs. the Dodgers and seven against Arizona.
- Colorado is in the midst of a stretch of 17 consecutive games before the next off day on Monday in Houston.

JUST MEET THE OBJECTIVE

- Colorado won last night's game 5-4 despite going 0-for-13 with runners in scoring position ... it was the second time in franchise history that the Rockies won while going 0-for-13 or worse with runners in scoring position (went 0-for-16 with RISP and won 4-3 in 12 innings vs. Cincinnati, Aug. 24, 2008) ... it was the first time this season that a Major League team went 0-for-13 or worse with runners in scoring position and still won (last: April 22, 2017, St. Louis, 0-for-14 RISP, 4-1 win at Milwaukee).
- Nolan Arenado was removed from the game in the bottom of the fifth inning with right shoulder soreness.

WIDER VIEWS

- The Rockies snapped a three-game losing streak last night ... have gone 24-13 since June 28 (.639), the fourth-best winning percentage in MLB and the second-best winning percentage in the NL.
- Over that span, the Rockies have posted a 3.67 team ERA (321.1 IP, 131 ER), the third-lowest ERA in the NL.
- Rockies starters have a 3.43 ERA (218.0 IP, 83 ER) over that span, the fifth-lowest in MLB and second-lowest mark in the NL.
- The 665.21 innings pitched by the Colorado starters this season are the third-most in the NL.

COORS YOUNG

- Kyle Freeland's 3.04 ERA (139.0 IP, 47 ER) is the seventh-lowest in the National League and ranks third in MLB (first in NL) among left-handed starters ... 2.18 ERA (62.0 IP, 15 ER) at Coors Field is the fifth-lowest home ERA in MLB.

- Recorded his fourth career game of seven or more shutout innings at Coors Field on Monday vs. Pittsburgh and his second career game in which he went at least seven innings and allowed two or fewer hits ... in 26 career starts at Coors Field, has a 3.08 ERA (146.0 IP, 50 ER).

PITCHER FRIENDLY!

- Prior to Tuesday, Colorado had held their opponents to two or fewer runs in five consecutive home games from July 25-Aug. 6, tying for the longest such streak in franchise history (also: July 30-Aug. 11, 2006) ... since July 2, have held opponents to one run or fewer seven times at home, two runs or fewer in 11 games.

TAKE CARE OF HOME FIRST

- Since their eight-game home losing streak ended June 18, the Rockies have gone 18-7 at Coors Field, including 14-5 since July 2 ... suffered their first home series loss since June 22-24 vs. Miami Wednesday after dropping two of three games to Pittsburgh ... ended a streak of five home series without a loss (tied a two-game series vs. Houston).
- The 1.71 ERA (89.2 IP, 17 ER) posted by the starters in July was the best at home in a single month in franchise history.
- Held opponents to one run or fewer in six games at home in July, two runs or fewer in 10 ... the six games in which they held opponents to one or fewer runs is a franchise record for a calendar month (previous: five in July of 2006).

BLUE ANGELES

- The Rockies play the Los Angeles Dodgers 19 times this season, including 10 times at home and nine times in L.A. ... snapped their six-game home losing streak to the Dodgers last night, their longest home losing streak to Los Angeles-NL in franchise history ... are now 4-7 vs. the Dodgers this season ... won their last series in Los Angeles 2-1, June 29-July 1 ... were swept in three games in Colorado, June 1-3.
- Among active players, Carlos González is second in home runs against the Dodgers (24), tied for second in triples, ranks third in runs scored (78) and RBI (81), fourth in hits (135), seventh in slugging percentage (.533), and is tied for eighth in doubles (22).

LONG AND WINDING ROAD

- Of the 15 series remaining in the Rockies' season, 11 are against teams currently at .500 or better (two series remaining against San Diego, and two against San Francisco).

AND MANY MORE

- On Tuesday, Charlie Blackmon became the seventh Rockies to reach 1,000 hits in a Colorado uniform ... he joins Todd Helton (2,519), Larry Walker (1,361), Carlos González (1,295), Dante Bichette (1,278), Vinny Castilla (1,206) and Troy Tulowitzki (1,165) as the only Rockies to reach the mark.

LIKE HE ALWAYS HAS

- Carlos González has batted .324 (71-for-219) since May 27, the seventh-highest batting average in the NL ... ranks fourth in the NL in runs (47) over that span.
- Is hitting .294 (30-for-102) vs. left-handed pitching this season ... since July 2, is 13-for-31 (.419) with three home runs vs. left-handed pitching, the second-highest lefty/lefty batting average in the NL over that span.

PARACHUTE

- Trevor Story ranks third in the NL in extra-base hits (61) and total bases (241), fifth in RBI (80), sixth in slugging percentage (.549) and is tied for eighth in home runs (24).
- Since June 1, Story ranks third in the NL with a .333 batting average (77-for-232) and fifth with a .608 slugging percentage.

FREE RIDE

- Second-year southpaw and University of Evansville alumna is a native of Denver who graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School.
- Selected by Colorado in the first round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft (eighth overall), the third player in University of Evansville history to be drafted in the first round.
- A member of the Opening Day roster for the second consecutive season after making his debut in 2017 ... earned his first win and recorded his first hit in his Major League debut in the Rockies Home Opener on April 7, 2017 vs. the Los Angeles Dodgers.

DIAL KYLE

- Ranks seventh in the National League with a 3.04 ERA (139.0 IP, 47 ER) ... ERA is the lowest in the National League, third-lowest in MLB, among left-handed starting pitchers.
- Per *Baseball Reference*, his 6.0 pitching WAR ranks third among National League starting pitchers and second among Major League lefties behind Chris Sale's 6.5 WAR.

BUC OFF

- Pitched seven shutout innings against Pittsburgh while allowing two hits with three walks and five strikeouts on Monday at Coors Field.
- It was the third time this season that Freeland pitched seven shutout innings, the second time at home (also: April 24 vs. San Diego) ... it was his fourth career game of seven or more shutout innings at Coors Field, the most of any pitcher since his debut in 2017 and the most for a Rockies pitcher through 51 career starts in franchise history ... it was his second career game in which he went at least seven innings with two or fewer hits (also: July 9, 2017 vs. Chicago-AL, one hit over 8.1 innings pitched).

THE BLUES

- Will be making his second start this season against Los Angeles-NL, his first at Coors Field ... faced the Dodgers on the road on May 23 and took the loss after allowing three runs on six hits with three walks and three strikeouts in 6.1 innings of work in the 3-0 loss.
- Has faced the Dodgers five times over his first two Major League seasons and is 1-3 with a 4.26 ERA (25.1 IP, 12 ER), three walks and three strikeouts ... made his Major League debut against them on April 7, 2017, and allowed one run on four hits with two walks and six strikeouts over six innings of work.

OF LATE

- Over his last 10 starts since June 16, is 4-1 with a 2.23 ERA (60.2 IP, 15 ER), 24 walks and 40 strikeouts ... the Rockies are 7-3 over that span.

WINLAND

- Earned his 20th career win on July 27 in his 49th career start to become the fourth pitcher in Rockies history to reach 20 or more wins within his first 50 career starts, all with Colorado (also: Jason Jennings, 23; Jhoulys Chacin, 20; Jeff Francis, 20).

TOP SHELF

- Team-high 14 quality starts, which ranks tied for sixth in the National League ... made 13 quality starts in 2017, which ranked second among Major League rookies.

NEWSFLASH, HE'S FROM DENVER

- His 3.08 career ERA at Coors Field (149.0 IP, 51 ER) is the lowest in franchise history (min. 100 IP) ... is 13-10 in 29 games, 26 starts at home.
- Is 7-2 with a 2.18 ERA (62.0 IP, 15 ER) in Denver this year ... seven home wins tied for the second-most in NL ... home ERA ranks fourth.
- His 3.42 ERA in Denver last year was the 11th-lowest home mark in Colorado history among all pitchers ... lowest mark at Coors Field since Jorge De La Rosa had an ERA of 2.76 in 2013 and 3.08 in 2014 ... second-lowest ERA by a Rockies rookie (Denny Stark, 3.21, 2002).

ROLLING WITH EGGS

- Has made 13 starts on the road this season, going 3-5 with a 3.74 ERA (77.0 IP, 32 ER), 26 walks and 59 strikeouts ... he is 8-8 with a 4.13 ERA (146.0 IP, 67 ER) in 27 road games, 25 starts, over his career.
- Over his past six road starts since June 5, has gone 1-1 with a 3.25 ERA (36.0 IP, 13 ER) with three quality starts.

BORN FREE

- Career 3.60 ERA (295.0 IP, 118 ER) ranks fifth all-time among Rockies pitchers with 200.0 or more innings, first among starting pitchers.
- Is 21-18 with a 3.62 ERA (288.2 IP, 116 ER) in 51 career starts with the Rockies going 30-21 in those games ... has no decisions with a 2.70 ERA (3.1 IP, 1 ER) in two road relief outings ... has a 3.00 ERA (3.0 IP, 1 ER) in three relief appearances at home.

ROOKIE CARD

- Last season tied for the Major League lead among rookies with 11 wins (also: German Márquez) ... ranked third in innings (156.0), fifth in ERA (4.10, min. 15 starts) and seventh in strikeouts (107).
- His 4.10 ERA was the fourth-lowest by a rookie in franchise history, the lowest since Jhoulys Chacin set the franchise record for rookies in 2010 (3.28).
- Became the first starting pitcher to make his Major League debut in his hometown in his club's home opener since Chuck Dobson did so on April 19, 1966 as a member of the Kansas City Athletics.

The 29-year-old right-hander will make his second start after being reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Aug. 7 (right middle finger blister) ... allowed a season-high nine runs over 4.2 innings pitched in the losing effort against the Pirates his last time out, Aug. 7 at Coors Field ... will be making his fourth start against the Dodgers this season ... has no record and a 5.93 ERA (13.2 IP, 9 ER) with five walks and 12 strikeouts this season against the Dodgers, and is 2-2 with a 5.14 ERA (56.0 IP, 32 ER), 23 walks and 43 strikeouts across 13 career appearances (10 starts) against Los Angeles-NL.
