ON TAP

The Colorado Rockies continue their six-game, seven-day homestand with the final game of a three-game series vs. Arizona today ... will host Miami Friday through Sunday ... tomorrow's off day will be Colorado's only off day until September 5 (will play a stretch of 20 games without a day off).

HE DID IT...

- Dom Nunez had his contract selected from Triple-A Albuquerque prior to last night's game and made his Major League debut in a start at catcher.
- Hit an eighth-inning home run for his first Major League hit, becoming the seventh player in Rockies history to record a home run in his Major League debut, and the eighth to record a home run as his first Major League hit (last: Trevor Story, April 4, 2016 at Arizona).

...SORT OF LIKE THIS GUY DID

- Trevor Story had a four-game home run streak at Coors Field snapped last night, the longest home run streak at home in his career and the longest for a Rockies player since Charlie Blackmon's four-game home run streak in Denver, May 11-June 11 of this season.

STOP RIGHT THERE

- Three of Colorado's four losing streaks of five or more games have been snapped with German Márquez earning a win in a quality start (April 14 at San Francisco, July 21 at New York-AL, August 11 at San Diego) ... in those three games, he has combined to allow five runs over 24.0 innings of work (1.88 ERA) with four walks and 19 strikeouts ... pitched eight or more innings in two of those games (8.0 IP Sunday, one-hit complete-game shutout on April 14 at San Francisco).

A LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

- German Márquez is 3-0 over his last five starts since July 21 at New York-AL (Colorado 7-13 over that span) ... has made quality starts in four of those games, and has a 3.27 ERA (33.0 IP, 12 ER) with four walks and 35 strikeouts over that span.
- Has pitched seven or more innings three times over that span, while allowing two or fewer runs in three of those games.
- Has pitched at least eight innings four times this season, the most since Jhoulys Chacin had four outings of eight or more innings in 2013.

THIS IS NOW

- The Rockies were a season-high six games over .500 after sweeping a three-game series at Arizona June 18-20.
- Colorado is 13-33 since June 21 ... the .283 winning percentage over that span is the lowest in the

National League, second-lowest in MLB (Detroit, .196, 9-37).

WALK ABOUT

- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, German Márquez' 22.2-inning walkless streak, that was snapped with a walk to Manny Machado in the first inning Sunday, was tied for the second-longest single-season streak in Rockies history (also Rafael Betancourt, 22.2, innings, July 26-Sept. 28, 2011) ... José Jiménez holds the record at 23.2 innings, May 7-June 24, 2002) ... it was the longest such streak for a starter (previous record: Aaron Cook, 21.0 innings, June 28-July 15, 2007).

STREAKY BUSINESS

- After a 3-11 run from June 21, 2017-March 30, 2018, the Rockies are 18-9 vs. Arizona since July 11, 2018, going 10-5 in Denver over that span, including a five-game winning streak that was snapped Monday.
- Colorado was swept by Arizona the last time the two clubs met in Phoenix, July 5-7, the final series of the first half.
- When the two clubs last met in Denver prior to this series, May 27-30, the Rockies swept Arizona in four games, Colorado's second four-game sweep of Arizona in franchise history (Sept. 18-21, 2014).
- The Rockies have won nine of the past 13 in Phoenix ... prior to the three-game sweep in July, Colorado had won a franchise-record six consecutive games in Phoenix since Sept. 21, 2018, sweeping the previous two series there.
- Also prior to July's series in Phoenix, the Rockies had won a club-record eight consecutive games vs. Arizona since May 5 (won seven straight in 2004, July 23-Sept. 13), the longest winning streak by either team in the series ... had not lost to the D-backs since May 4 and had not lost at Chase Field since July 22, 2018.

BRING IT ON HOME

- Charlie Blackmon has batted .344 (21-for-61) his past 15 games on the road, hitting safely in 12 with multiple hits in six and three hits in three ... Trevor Story has hit safely in 21 of his past 25 road games (.284, 29-for-102).

YONDER WINDOWS BROKE

- Yonder Alonso homered in back-to-back games Saturday and Sunday for the second time this season (also: April 26-29 at Detroit as a member of Chicago-AL), and for the first time as a member of the Rockies.
- His home run Sunday was the 100th of his career, his third as a member of the Rockies.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

- Nolan Arenado logged the 700th RBI of his career last Tuesday, Aug. 6 ... at 989 games, he became the fourth active player to reach that milestone in fewer than 1,000 games, joining Albert Pujols (863 games), Miguel Cabrera (964) and Ryan Braun (972).

NOT TAPPING OUT

- Raimel Tapia has recorded back-to-back three-hit games for the first time in his career as part of a current eight-game hitting streak ... is batting .455 (15-for-33) with four runs, one double, one home run and six RBI over the streak with multiple hits five times ... has hit in 11 of his last 12 home games, batting .413 (19-for-46) with seven runs, two doubles, one home run and five RBI over that span with multiple hits in six games.

IN RELIEF

- Scott Oberg ranks fifth among NL relievers with a 2.17 ERA (43.0 IP, 13 ER) ... allowed a season-high four runs last Friday at San Diego.
- Since being reinstated from the 10-day injured list on June 27, 2018, posted a 12-2 record and 1.99 ERA (95.0 IP, 21 ER), the second-lowest mark by a reliever in the NL (min. 50 appearances).
- Oberg has posted a 1.52 ERA (29.2 IP, 5 ER) at home without allowing a home run ... four pitchers in franchise history have made 20 or more appearances at home without allowing a home run.

HE'S FREE

- A member of the Opening Day roster for the third consecutive season after making his debut in 2017 ... first Opening Day start this year at Miami.
Denver native graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School.
Selected in the first round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft (eighth overall), the third player in University of Evansville history to be drafted in the first round.

OF LATE

- Lost at San Diego last Friday, 7-1, allowing eight hits and three runs with two walks and three strikeouts ... allowed three runs or less for the third time in four starts ... fifth quality start of the year.

THAT'S OVER

- Win vs. San Francisco on Aug. 4, his first since April 18, a span of 11 starts to snap a six-game losing streak (April 29-July 30).

THE WORM WILL TURN

- Is 1-4 with a 6.91 ERA (28.2 IP, 22 ER) in six starts since returning from Triple-A Albuquerque ... went 18-6 with a 2.80 ERA (196.0 IP, 61 ER) in 32 starts from May 6, 2018-April 18, 2019.

DON'T BACK DOWN

- Is 3-3 with a 5.40 ERA (51.2 IP, 31 ER) in 10 starts vs. Arizona ... is 1-3 with a 7.04 ERA (30.2 IP, 24 ER) in six starts vs. the Diamondbacks at Coors Field.
Colorado has won five of his past six starts vs. the Diamondbacks despite a 5.79 ERA (32.2 IP, 21 ER).
Has made two starts vs. Arizona this season, both at Coors Field, going 0-1 with a 13.00 ERA (9.0 IP, 5 ER) ... has allowed 16 hits and five home runs.

GOING NATIONAL

- Throwing a season-high 109 pitches, lost game two July 24 at Washington, 2-0 to Patrick Corbin ... tallied his fourth quality start of the year and first since May 14 at Boston.
Seventh starter in Rockies history, the first since Drew Pomeranz (July 1, 2012), to lose a game after working six or more innings and allowing no earned runs (just the fifth when allowing four hits or fewer).

KEEP IT LOW

- Allowed 22 home runs this season, 19 against right-handed batters, for an overall average of 2.25 per nine innings, the third-highest rate in the Majors (min. 80 IP) ... in 18 starts, has allowed two home runs four times and three home runs three times ... allowed four home runs total over his 29.2 innings in Triple-A.
Allowed 17 home runs in 2017 and 2018 ... has allowed three home runs to left-handers this season after allowing two in 2018 and four in 2017.

ALL TOGETHER NOW

- Is 31-28 with a 4.13 ERA (440.0 IP, 202 ER) in 79 career regular-season starts with the Rockies going 45-34 ... fourth-lowest career ERA in franchise history by a pitcher with 50 or more starts.
Posted a 2.84 ERA (6.1 IP, 2 ER) in his five career relief outings, all in 2017.

HOUSEKEEPING

- His 4.25 career ERA in Denver (222.1 IP, 105 ER) over 43 games (40 starts) is the fourth-lowest home ERA in franchise history by pitcher who has made 25 or more starts.
Colorado is 24-16 in his 40 home starts (18-14, 4.27 ERA, 219.1 IP, 104 ER ... has a 3.00 ERA (3.0 IP, 1 ER) in three relief appearances at home.

YOUR ROOM ISN'T READY

- Career road ERA of 3.98 (224.0 IP, 99) ranks seventh in franchise history among Rockies with 25 or more starts.
Is 13-14 with in 39 career starts on the road ... has no decisions with a 2.70 ERA (3.1 IP, 1 ER) in two road relief outings.
Has not won a road start since Opening Day, March 28 at Miami ... is 0-6 with a 5.49 ERA (39.1 IP, 24 ER) over that eight-start span.

SCRAPBOOK

- Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 at Miami and earned the win after pitching seven innings and allowing one run on two hits with one walk and five strikeouts.

ABOUT THOSE STREAKS

- Won nine straight games across a 12-start span with the Rockies going 11-1 from Aug. 6, 2018 to his Opening Day win on March 28, 2019 ... posted a 2.09 ERA (77.1 IP, 18 ER) over that span ... it was tied for the longest winning streak by a pitcher in franchise history ... the only other Colorado starter to win nine straight is Ubaldo Jiménez (May 15 to July 8, 2010).
His 12-start quality start streak over that same span was tied for the second-longest streak in franchise history ... one of three pitchers to have a double-digit quality start streak (also: Jiménez two times and German Márquez) ... posted a 2.09 ERA (77.1 IP, 18 ER) over that span.

Scratched on Tuesday, pushed back due to left ankle soreness ... lost 9-3 at San Diego on Thursday (5.2,6,7,3,1,4), allowing seven runs, three earned ... is 6-4 with a 3.65 ERA (81.1 IP, 33 ER) in 15 starts since May 27 ... is 5-2 this year with a 3.90 ERA (67.0 IP, 29 ER) in 11 starts at home with the Rockies 7-4 ... his home ERA is the 12th-lowest clip in franchise history for a single season and the second-lowest mark (3.13, 2017) of his career ... 2-3 with a 5.14 ERA (35.0 IP, 20 ER) in six career starts vs. Miami ... 2-1 with a 6.48 ERA (16.2 IP, 12 ER) vs. the Fish at home ... ranks among the NL leaders this year in wins (10-T8), starts (24-T6), innings (142.0-12th), opponents GIDP (15-T5), ground ball-to-fly ball ratio (2.18-7th) and grounds balls (201-8th).

- Third home run as a member of the Rockies Sunday, his second straight game with a home run ... all three of his home runs have been game-tying home runs, including his second career pinch-hit home run last Saturday.

- Signed a Minor League contract July 10 ... designated for assignment by Chicago-AL June 28 and released July 3 ... in nine games at Albuquerque, was 13-for-31 (.419) with seven runs, three doubles, one triple, two homers and 12 RBI.
