HERE GOES

- The Rockies will begin their 27th Major League season today in the first game of a four-game series at Miami ... this will be their second Opening Day in Miami, having opened here in 2014 (lost 10-1).
- March 28 is the earliest that the Rockies have ever opened the season in franchise history, beating last year's previous record of March 29.
- The Rockies are 14-12 on Opening Day, including a record of 10-9 while opening on the road ... have won three of their last five Opening Day games (2015-17) ... the Rockies have opened their season on the road every season since 2011, when they hosted the Arizona Diamondbacks on April 1.

WE'RE ALL KYLE FREELAND GUYS

- Kyle Freeland will make his first career Opening Day start, making him the 19th Opening Day starter in franchise history.
- Freeland is the sixth Opening Day starter who was originally drafted or signed by the Rockies, joining Jon Gray (2017-18), Jhoulys Chacin (2013), Ubaldo Jiménez (2010-11), Aaron Cook (2007, 2009) and Jason Jennings (2003, 2006) ... this is the second time in franchise history that the Rockies have had home-grown Opening Day starters in three consecutive seasons (also: Cook 2009, Jiménez 2010-11).

FISH STICKS

- The Rockies went 2-4 against Miami in 2018, 1-2 at Marlins Park and 1-2 at Coors Field ... are 7-17 at Marlins Park since it opened in 2012 ... have only won consecutive games there one time, and never in the same season (May 23, 2012, Aug. 23, 2013) ... overall since 2012, the Rockies are 17-30 against the Marlins.
- Rockies Bench Coach Mike Redmond was originally signed by the Florida Marlins as non-drafted free agent on Aug. 18, 1992, playing for the Major League team from 1998-2004 ... was a member of the '03 World Series championship team ... he was the Miami manager from 2013-2015.
- Mike Dunn pitched for the Marlins from 2012-2016 and leads the franchise with 405 appearances.

IT'S OVER

- The Rockies went 14-15-3 in Spring Training, their second consecutive Spring record below .500 ... prior to last Spring, were .500 or better every season since 2007.
- Colorado led the Cactus League with 75 doubles, ranked third with a .470 slugging percentage and tied for third with 44 home runs ... their .262 (169-for-1,078) batting average ranked eighth.
- Among qualifiers across both the Cactus and Grapefruit leagues, Ryan McMahon ranked first

with a .763 slugging percentage, nine doubles, 13 extra-base hits and 45 total bases, second with a .424 batting average and a .470 on-base percentage, and tied for second with 25 hits ... he was the recipient of the 2019 Abby Greer Award, which is given annually to the Rockies' Spring Training MVP.

Kyle Freeland's four wins tied for the Major League lead ... Jon Gray's 0.92 WHIP ranked second in the Cactus League, fourth overall in MLB.

Freeland, a native of Denver, becomes the first Denver-born Opening Day starter in Rockies history.

LONG WINTER TO LONG BALLS

- In 26 Opening Day games, the Rockies have recorded 36 home runs (26 on the road, eight at Coors Field, two at Mile High Stadium) ... Nolan Arenado, Vinny Castilla, Carlos González and Troy Tulowitzki all lead with three career Opening Day home runs for the Rockies ... Arenado has homered on Opening Day in 2015, 2016 and 2018.
- Vinny Castilla (1998 at Arizona) and Trevor Story (2016 at Arizona) are the only Rockies players to ever hit multiple home runs in one Opening Day, and no Rockies player has ever hit a grand slam on Opening Day ... Jeff Baker (2005 vs. San Diego) and Trevor Story (two home runs, 2016 at Arizona) are the only Rockies players to ever hit a home run in their Major League debut on Opening Day ... the most home runs ever hit by the Rockies as a team on Opening Day is four (2016 at Arizona).

GET-GO

- David Dahl, Garrett Hampson, DJ Johnson, Harrison Musgrave and Raimel Tapia are all on the Opening Day roster for the first time.
- Johnson, 29, is the ninth player in Rockies history to make his first Opening Day roster at age 29 or older ... he is 29 years and 210 days old, making him the seventh-oldest Rockies player to make his first Opening Day roster (oldest: Danny Ardoin, 31 years and 269 days old on Opening Day 2006).

INJURED LIST

- The Rockies have placed Antonio Senzatela (blister infection, right heel) and Chris Rusin (mid-back strain) have been placed in the 10-day IL to begin the season, retroactive to March 25.

NEW TO US

- The Rockies signed Daniel Murphy to a two-year contract on Dec. 21, their only Major League signing of the offseason.
- Murphy, 33, is a career .299 (1421-for-4747) hitter with 122 career home runs and 641 RBI since he made his debut in 2008 with New York-NL ... he is a three-time All-Star (2014, 2016-17) and finished second in NL MVP voting in 2016.
- Mark Reynolds was signed to a Minor League contract on Jan. 30, and was selected to the 40-man roster on Tuesday ... this is the second time (also 2017) that Reynolds has signed a Minor League contract with the Rockies and subsequently made the Opening Day roster ... Reynolds' career home run count is currently at 294.

FACULTY CLUB

- Dave Magadan begins his first season as the Rockies' hitting coach, his 17th season as a Major League hitting coach ... has previously served in the same role with the Padres (2003-06), Red Sox (2007-12), Rangers (2013-15) and Diamondbacks (2016-18).
- Ron Gideon begins his third season on the Rockies' coaching staff, his first season as first base coach.

- Pitched six innings this Spring and allowed three runs on seven hits (including two home runs) with one walk and six strikeouts.
- Since 2014, ranks third among qualified MLB relievers with a 2.03 ERA (306.2 IP, 69 ER) over that span ... one of 16 pitchers with 100+ saves since 2014 ... one of 13 pitchers all-time with at least 75 starts and 100 saves.
