### WHEN THE LIGHTS

- The Colorado Rockies continue their second consecutive three-city, nine-game, 10-day road trip with the first of four games against San Francisco tonight ... will play four games in San Francisco Thursday-Sunday and three-games at Los Angeles-NL May 21-23.
- On Tuesday, Colorado played its 12th game of the season vs. the Padres ... entering Thursday's games have yet to play the Giants or the Dodgers and have only played the Arizona Diamondbacks three times, the first series of the season.
- According to MLB Network, nearly a third of the Rockies remaining schedule – 38 of 119 games – will come against the Giants and Dodgers
- The Rockies were 2-4 on their six-game homestand ... the Rockies have not finished any of their three homestands above .500 and are now 7-11 (.389) at Coors Field, the second-fewest home wins in the National League.
- Since the season-high six-game winning streak (May 1-8), Colorado has dropped five of the past seven, and have been shut out twice that span since May 9 ... batting .233 (56-for-240) the past seven contests, including .178 with runners in scoring position (8-for-45).
- Split the first two games of the road trip at San Diego ... were limited to one hit on Tuesday by the Padres ... it was the 25th time in franchise history the Rockies were held to one or fewer hits, with 20 of those games coming on the road ... Trevor Story broke up Jordan Lyles' perfect-game bid with a one-out single in the eighth inning.

### HOTEL POINTS

- Colorado has won 16 (16-9) games away from home, tied for the third-most road wins in the Majors and tied for the second-most in the National League ... the .640 road winning percentage is tied for seventh in the Majors in MLB and tied for third-best in the NL.
- The Rockies have played 25 road games, tied for first in the Majors (Atlanta, Boston, Milwaukee).
- Tuesday's loss at San Diego ended the Rockies' six-game road winning streak ... in franchise history, the Rockies have won at least six road games in a row 10 times within a season ... won eight consecutive road games in 2017 (Aug. 26-Sept. 12) with the club record being nine (June 4-22, 2009).

- Colorado's 3.38 road ERA (216.0 IP, 81 ER) is fourth-best in the NL ... rank tied for fourth in the NL with 206 road strikeouts.
- Over their 25 road games Colorado starters have gone 11-8 with a 3.15 ERA (140.0 IP, 49 ER) and 13 quality starts.
- Have averaged 3.7 runs scored per game with a .212 batting average (175-for-824), ranking 14th in the NL and 28th in MLB.

### OLD FRIENDS

- Colorado and San Francisco will play a total of 19 times this year ... the Rockies were 12-7 vs. the Giants last year; Colorado's most wins ever against their Division rivals.
- Last year, Colorado won 10 of the first 11 meetings, but dropped six of the last eight to SF ... Colorado was 3-6 at AT&T Park in 2017, losing the last five after winning three of the first four here.
- The Rockies are 16-11 the past 27 games vs. the Giants since July 5, 2016.
- Rockies Manager Bud Black pitched for the Giants from 1991-94 ... Giants catcher Nick Hundley played for Colorado in 2015 and 2016.

### HE LOVES THE BAY

- Nolan Arenado is third among active players with 78 RBI vs. the Giants ... has done that in 88 games ... the two players with more RBI vs. the Giants have done it in 178 games (Adrian Gonzalez, 85 RBI) and 185 games (Matt Kemp, 91 RBI).
- Since 2015, his 65 RBI vs. the Giants are the most vs. any single opponent by any player in MLB.
- His 21 home runs are tied with Gonzalez for the second-most vs. the Giants among active players ... Kemp is first with 24 home runs.
- Is tied with Troy Tulowitzki for the Colorado franchise record with nine home runs at A&T Park ... in fact, the nine home runs at AT&T Park ranks tied for 10th among all active players.
- Has hit above .300 vs. the Giants in each of the last three seasons.
- Recorded 24 RBI vs. the Giants in both 2016 and 2015 ... the only other Rockies player to record 24 RBI in a season vs. any opponent was Preston Wilson vs. San Francisco in 2003.
- Hit 10 home runs and recorded 24 RBI vs. SF in 2015, the fourth player ever with that many home runs and RBI in a season vs. the Giants, joining Dolph Camilli in 1941 (11 HR, 30 RBI), Roy Campanella in 1953 (10, 28) and Stan Musial in 1954 (12,27).

### RECIPE FOR SUCCESS

- The Rockies are 19-4 on the season when scoring first, 18-2 when out-hitting their opponent.
- Colorado is 17-6 when their starter pitches at least 5.2 innings, 15-5 when their starter goes at least six innings ... Colorado has yet to have a pitcher go at least six innings and not record a quality start.

### PRESS START

- After allowing 13 runs to San Diego on April 23, including nine in the seventh inning, the Rockies have posted a 3.32 ERA (168.0 IP, 62 ER) over their past 19 games while going 11-8 ... the 3.32 ERA since April 24 ranks third in the NL, fifth in MLB.
- Over that same span, starting pitchers have allowed 40 earned runs over 102.1 innings of work (3.20 ERA) with 12 quality starts ... the 3.20 ERA ranks fourth in the NL, sixth in the Majors.

### #COORS?

- A total of 36 of the Rockies' 56 home runs have come on the road, the second-most road home runs in the NL and tied for the third-most in MLB.
- Charlie Blackmon's 10 road home runs are tied for the second-most in the Major Leagues.

### BEAT THE STREAK

- Nolan Arenado streak of reaching base ended Tuesday at 24 consecutive games ... since April 12, it was tied for the second-longest active streak in MLB and the second-longest streak of his career ... reached base in 30 consecutive games in 2014.
- Batted .333 (30-for-90) with five doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 17 RBI, 15 walks and 23 strikeouts over the course of the streak.
- Arenado has reached base in 35 of his 38 games played this season.

ACROSS THE BOARD

- The Lubbock, Texas, native was a member of his third career Opening Day roster in his sixth Major League season.
Selected by the Rockies in the second round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft out of Texas Tech University.
Attended Monterey High School in Lubbock ... was named to the all-region team before his senior season ... drafted by the Houston Astros in the eighth round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft, but did not sign.

GREAT CHETTIS

- Ranks tied for sixth in the National League with four wins and 15th in the NL with a 3.12 ERA (49.0 IP, 17 ER).
His 1.8 Baseball Reference WAR ranks fifth in the National League.
Streak of four starts to begin '18 in which he pitched five or more innings with two or fewer runs and five or fewer hits allowed, the longest such string to start a season in Rockies history.

DARK HORSE

- His 1.35 road ERA (33.1 IP, 5 ER) ranks first in the National League, fifth in the Majors ... his 33.1 innings pitched on the road are ninth-most in the Majors, third-most in the National League.
Is 4-1 in his five road starts this season and has allowed a total of five earned runs on 23 hits in 33.1 innings of work.
In 52 career appearances on the road, including 41 starts, is 15-16 with a 4.29 ERA (239.1 IP, 114 ER) ... as a starter, has gone 15-15 with a 4.26 ERA (228.0 IP, 108 ER).

IN THE REARVIEW

- Allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in five innings pitched in his last start, May 11 vs. Milwaukee ... allowed three runs in the sixth inning before being removed from the game ... left the game still in line for the win with the Rockies up 9-7 ... the Rockies eventually lost 11-10 in 10 innings.

BY THE BAY

- Has made 11 career appearances, seven starts, against San Francisco, going 3-4 with a 4.50 ERA (50.0 IP, 25 ER), 10 walks and 31 strikeouts ... is 3-3 with a 4.20 ERA (45.0 IP, 21 ER), in his seven starts.
Is 1-1 with a 4.80 ERA (15.0 IP, 8 ER), four walks and 10 strikeouts in four career appearances, two starts, at AT&T Park ... 1-1 with a 6.00 ERA (12.0 IP, 8 ER) in his two starts ... last start came on May 6, 2016 in a 6-4 Rockies loss (6,0,8,5,5,2,4).
Made one start vs. San Francisco last season, on Sept. 4 at Coors Field in a 4-3 Rockies win ... allowed three runs on five hits across 5.1 innings pitched ... surrendered two home runs (Span, Panik).

FAST TRACK

- Is 13-7 with a 4.76 ERA (206.0 IP, 109 ER) in 36 career starts at Coors Field ... his .636 winning percentage at Coors Field ranks eighth among Colorado pitchers all-time with 150.0 or more innings ... is 1-1 with a 11.51 ERA (20.1 IP, 26 ER) in 18 relief appearances in Denver.
Made three starts at Coors Field this season and combined to pitch 15.2 innings with 12 runs allowed (6.89 ERA) ... does not yet have a decision in Denver.
Since the beginning of 2016, has gone 9-3 with a 4.50 ERA (128.0 IP, 64 ER) in 22 starts at Coors Field ... the Rockies have gone 16-6 at home over that span.
Colorado won 11 consecutive games at Coors Field in his starts from June 9, 2016-Aug. 14, 2017 ... over that span, he went 7-0 with a 3.50 ERA (64.1 IP, 25 ER).

DON'T BET AGAINST HIM

- Returned to the starting rotation in 2017 after recovering from a testicular cancer diagnosis and subsequent surgery ... was originally diagnosed and underwent surgery in November, 2016 ... a biopsy in March, 2017 showed the cancer had spread and he underwent chemotherapy treatments throughout the spring and beginning of summer.
Placed on the 60-day disabled list March 26, 2017, sent to Double-A Hartford to begin rehab July 13 ... was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list and optioned to Triple-A Albuquerque Aug. 4.
Made his first Major League start of the season on Aug. 14 vs. the Atlanta Braves ... pitched seven shutout innings and allowed six hits with no walks and two strikeouts in a 3-0 Rockies win.
Made nine Major League starts and went 2-4 with a 5.05 ERA (46.1 IP, 26 ER), 11 walks and 30 strikeouts.

ALL OUT

- Was the recipient of the 207 Tony Conigliaro Award, which is given to a Major Leaguer who has overcome adversity through the attributes of spirit, determination and courage that were trademarks of Tony C. ... Bettis became the second Rockies pitcher to receive the award (Aaron Cook, 2005).

BREEZE

- Went 14-8 with a 4.79 ERA (186.0 IP, 99 ER), 59 walks and 138 strikeouts in 32 starts in 2016, setting career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.
Led the Rockies in wins, starts and innings pitched.
Pitched his first career complete-game shutout on Sept. 5 vs. San Francisco at Coors Field ... allowed two hits with no walks and seven strikeouts, becoming the seventh Rockies pitcher to throw a nine-inning shutout and allow two hits or fewer, the second to accomplish the feat at Coors Field.
The Rockies went 21-11 in his 32 starts, including 16-4 over his final 20 starts of 2016 ... Colorado went 10-0 over his final 10 starts at Coors Field.

YEARLING

- Made his Major League debut in 2013, making eight starts and eight relief appearances.
Was used solely as a reliever in 2014, making 21 relief appearances for the Rockies ... returned to the starting rotation in 2015, making 20 starts.

24-year-old Denver native will make his ninth start, sixth on the road ... earned his third win of the season May 12 vs. Milwaukee at Coors Field, a 4-0 Rockies win ... pitched 6.1 scoreless innings with four hits, four walks and six strikeouts ... is 3-1 with a 1.65 ERA (27.1 IP, 5 ER) over his last four starts, working into the seventh inning each time ... limited opponents to a .175 batting average over that span ... 1-3 with a 4.82 ERA (28.0 IP, 15 ER) in five starts on the road this season ... 1-1 with a 3.21 ERA (14.0 IP, 5 ER), two walks and 13 strikeouts over his last two starts on the road ... in four career starts vs. San Francisco is 2-2 with a 3.22 ERA (22.1 IP, 8 ER) ... lost his lone start at AT&T Park, June 28 ... allowed four runs over six innings with seven hits and two home runs.
