ALL THAT JAZZ

The Colorado Rockies continue their three-city, nine-game, 10-day road trip to Miami, Chicago-NL and New York-NL ... Colorado snapped their season-long tying three-game losing streak with a 3-1 win last night ... Jon Gray pitched seven innings and allowed one run (a leadoff home run to Anthony Rizzo) on three hits with one walk and six strikeouts ... it was his second consecutive start in which he has pitched at least six innings while allowing just three hits.

ATTENTION GRABBER

The Rockies opened last night's game with a leadoff home run by Charlie Blackmon, the 29th leadoff home run of his career, followed by a home run by David Dahl.
It was the third time in Rockies history that they have led off the game with back-to-back home runs (also: Eric Young & Ellis Burks, May 4, 1996 vs. Florida; Charlie Blackmon & Corey Dickerson, May 10, 2014 at Cincinnati).
It was the first time that a visiting team has led off a game at Wrigley Field with back-to-back home runs since the Boston Bees (Braves franchise) did so on Aug. 6, 1937.
It was the second game in franchise history that the Rockies won on three solo home runs (also: April 11, 2017 vs. San Diego) ... the Rockies have lost the nine other games in franchise history in which they scored three runs on three solo home runs.

PRESS START

After allowing 13 runs to San Diego on April 23, including nine in the seventh inning, Colorado has posted a 1.65 ERA (60.0 IP, 11 ER) over their past seven games ... over that span, starting pitchers have allowed seven earned runs over 41.1 innings of work (1.52 ERA) with six quality starts.
Over their 19 road starts, Colorado starters have posted a 3.34 ERA (102.1 IP, 38 ER) with eight quality starts ... Rockies starters have allowed three runs or fewer in 15 of their road games.

OTTOMATIC

Adam Ottavino has multiple strikeouts in 13 of his 16 games, including striking out the side three times ... his 31 strikeouts rank second among Major League relievers.
Tied the Rockies reliever strikeout record for the month of April with 24 (also: Juan Nicasio, 2014).
Ottavino has struck out 31 of the 58 batters he has faced, a 53.4 strikeout percentage which is second in MLB ... he has an 0.53 FIP and an 877 ERA+.

SHOW US AROUND

Colorado plays the Cubs six times this year, having played a three-game series at Coors Field April 20-22 (2-1 Cubs series win) and now three in Chicago through today.

The Rockies are 44-52 all-time at Wrigley Field, and have won five of their last seven in Chicago.
All-time vs. Chicago, Colorado is 97-100 ... since 2016, the Rockies are 11-7 against the Cubs ... the Rockies took five of seven last season and won four out of six games in 2016.

TURN

Rockies second baseman DJ LeMahieu was originally drafted by the Cubs in the second round of 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of LSU ... since being acquired by the Rockies in 2012, he has batted .299 (44-for-147) vs. the Cubs.
Reliever Chris Rusin was also selected by the Cubs in the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Kentucky ... in three seasons with the club he went 4-9 with a 4.97 ERA (108.2 IP, 60 ER) in 24 appearances, 20 starts.
Wade Davis spent the 2017 season as the Cubs' closer, earning an All-Star nod and converting a Cubs franchise record 32 consecutive saves to begin the season.
Cubs starting pitcher Tyler Chatwood spent five seasons with the Rockies from 2012-17 ... his 34 wins rank 10th in franchise history.
Cubs reliever Eddie Butler was originally selected by Colorado with the 46th overall pick of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft and made his debut for the Rockies on June 6, 2014 ... was traded to the Cubs on Feb. 1 2017.
Rockies manager Bud Black and Cubs manager Joe Maddon spent half a decade together on Mike Scioscia's coaching staff with the Anaheim Angels, which included a World Series Championship in 2002.

MOUNTAIN BREEZE

Colorado struck out 16 San Diego batters last Wednesday, the sixth time Colorado has struck out 16 batters in a game.

#COORS!

The Rockies have hit 37 home runs in 31 games this season, the most home runs in the National League and tied for the fourth-most in MLB.
24 of the Rockies' home runs have come on the road, the most in the NL and tied for the third-most in MLB.
Charlie Blackmon leads MLB with nine road home runs ... hit is first seven home runs on the road before homering at Coors Field on April 22 vs. Chicago-NL ... per Elias, he is the first Rockies player to have his first seven home runs come on the road since Ian Stewart in 2010.

EYEBLACKMON

Charlie Blackmon's 10 home runs rank tied for first in MLB.
Since 2016, Blackmon's 76 home runs are third-most in the National League behind Giancarlo Stanton (86) and Nolan Arenado (83) ... his .324 batting average over that span is third-highest in the NL (DJ LeMahieu ranks second at .325) while his .581 slugging percentage is the best mark in the league.

I GOT YOU

Starter Tyler Anderson experienced lightheadedness and had trouble catching his breath on Friday night, coming out of the game after 1.1 innings.
Antonio Senzatela pitched 3.2 shutout frames, his most ever in relief, earning the win ... recorded an RBI double in the fifth inning ... according to STATS, he was the first relief pitcher in Rockies history and the first in the Major Leagues since Joe Niekro on Aug. 23, 1980 to earn the win and drive in the game's only run in a 1-0 victory ... it was also the first game in Rockies history in which all runs were driven in by a relief pitcher.

A NEW BEGINNING

- The 28-year-old left-hander will be making his seventh start of the season, his fifth on the road ... is a member of his second career Opening Day roster in his third Major League season ... made his Major League debut on June 12, 2016 vs. San Diego.
- The University of Oregon product was selected as the Rockies' first-round selection (20th overall) in Major League Baseball's 2011 First-Year Player Draft ... was also drafted in '08 by the Minnesota Twins, but did not sign.

MY KIND OF TOWN

- Pitching at Wrigley Field for the first time today, having faced the Chicago Cubs twice previously at Coors Field.
- Got no decision in a 7-6, 11-inning Rockies' come-from-behind win on Aug. 19, 2016 in Denver (7.0,8,5,5,2,8) against the Cubs ... allowed a leadoff homer in the first (Fowler) and a sixth-inning home run (Russell)
- Only win in '18 was two starts ago on April 21, a 5-2 victory (6.0,6,2,2,2,6) at home vs. Chicago ... allowed two runs in the first inning before tossing five shutout innings.

LAST START

- Left Friday's 1-0 Rockies win at Miami after only 1.1 innings due to feeling lightheaded ... came into the game having posted a 1.99 ERA (22.2 IP, 5 ER) in his previous four starts with the Rockies going 3-1 ... three quality starts that span.

DOMESTICA

- In two starts at Coors Field this season, is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 IP, 4 ER).
- In 22 career appearances in Denver, has posted a 3.36 ERA (131.1 IP, 49 ER), the lowest ERA at Coors Field in franchise history (min. 100 IP) ... is 9-5 overall at home with the Rockies 12-9 in his 21 starts.
- His 3.00 ERA at home in 2016 was the second-lowest home ERA in franchise history (min. 75 innings pitched) behind Jorge De La Rosa's 2.76 home ERA (81.2 IP, 25 ER) in 2013.

AWAY WE GO

- Is 3-7 with a 5.10 ERA (95.1 IP, 54 ER) in 20 career games, 19 starts, away from Coors Field.
- Has no decisions in four road starts this season, posting a 5.02 ERA (14.1 IP, 8 ER) with 11 walks and 14 strikeouts ... seeking his first road victory since Sept. 11, 2017 at Arizona, a 7-6 win (5.0,7,6,6,3,2).
- Has allowed one earned run over his past 12.0 innings in his past three road starts ... the Rockies are 3-0 that span since he allowed seven runs in 2.1 innings in his first start of the season at Arizona March 30 ... has no decisions and an 0.75 ERA (12.0 IP, 1 ER) with seven walks and 11 strikeouts away from home since the loss at Arizona.

BACK STRONG

- The Rockies have won seven of his 10 appearances (nine starts) after he missed much of June and all of July and August last year (knee surgery) ... 4-1 with a 2.76 ERA (49.0 IP, 15 ER) since Sept. 11, 2017.

BIG HOT SUN

- Despite a career 2.93 ERA in day games, is only 1-5 in 14 games, 13 starts (73.2 IP, 24 ER) ... has an 0.84 ERA (10.2 IP, 1 ER) in two previous daytime starts this year, both no decisions.

THE MIDDLE PART

- Career record of 3-2 with a 4.42 ERA (36.2 IP, 18 ER) in six starts vs. National League Central Division foes.

MAY DAY

- Is 2-2 with a 3.94 ERA (29.2 IP, 13 ER) in five previous starts in the month of May.

THE NOT SO DISTANT PAST

- In 15 starts and two relief appearances in 2017, went 6-6 with a 4.81 ERA (86.0 IP, 46 ER) ... the two relief appearances were the first of his professional career.
- Was 5-6 with a 5.11 ERA (81.0 IP, 46 ER) as a starter, 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (5.0 IP, 0 ER) in his two relief appearances.
- Had two separate stints on the 10-day disabled list and one stint on the 60-day DL ... placed on the 10-day DL on June 4 with left knee inflammation ... reinstated on June 22 but made just two appearances (one start) before being placed on the disabled list again on June 26 ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left knee on July 3 and was transferred to the 60-day DL on July 26.

JUST A TASTE

- Pitched one inning of relief in the National League Wild Card Game at Arizona ... entered the game in the third inning and allowed two runs on two hits with one strikeout ... allowed a two-run home run to Daniel Descalso.
