BBQ AT OUR PLACE

- The Colorado Rockies continue their 10-day, nine-game, three-team homestand with the first of a three-game series vs. San Francisco today... will be hosting the Giants for the first time this season, split a four-game series in San Francisco May 17-20.
- Following this series, will host Los Angeles-NL Friday through next Sunday.
- Beat Cincinnati yesterday to take a 2-1 series win, their second series win at home this season (also: April 23-25 vs. San Diego, 2-1 series win).
- Hit four home runs yesterday, which matched the Rockies' season high (also: May 2 at Chicago-NL) ... had hit three home runs combined over their seven previous games.
- Play at home on Memorial Day for the second consecutive season ... overall are 14-11 on the holiday, 2-3 over their last five.

HEY, LOOK

- Colorado gained a game in the standing yesterday and is 1.5 games ahead of Arizona for first place in the National League West ... moved into first in the NL West last Monday for the first time since June 20, 2017.
- It is the third time in franchise history that the Rockies have been in first place through 52 games (also: 2017 and 1995).

OLD FRIENDS

- Colorado and San Francisco play 19 times this year ... the Rockies were 12-7 vs. the Giants last season, their most wins ever vs. their division rivals.
- Last season, Colorado won 10 of the first 11 meetings, but dropped six of the last eight to SF ... Colorado was 3-6 at AT&T Park in 2017, losing the last five after winning three of the first four there.
- The Rockies are 34-27 vs. San Francisco since the start of the '15 season and 14-9 since the beginning of the '17 campaign. ... 53-42 since May 17, 2013.
- Rockies Manager Bud Black pitched for the Giants from 1991-94 ... Giants catcher Nick Hundley played for San Francisco in 2015 and 2016.

DAVID, JACK, NOLAN

- Nolan Arenado is third among active players with 80 RBI vs. the Giants ... has 92 career games against San Francisco ... the two players with more RBI vs. the Giants have 178 games (Adrián González, 85 RBI) and 185 games (Matt Kemp, 91 RBI) against San Francisco ... Todd Helton is the only Rockie with more RBI against SF.
- Since 2015, his 67 RBI vs. the Giants are the most

vs. any single opponent by any player in MLB ... has hit .336 (83-for-247) with 17 home runs against San Francisco over that span.

- His 21 home runs are tied with Adrián González for the second-most vs. the Giants among active players ... Matt Kemp is first with 24 home runs ... in franchise history, Arenado trails Helton's 29 home runs vs. San Francisco.
- Is tied with Troy Tulowitzki for the Colorado franchise record with nine home runs at A&T Park ... the nine home runs at AT&T Park ranks tied for 11th among all active players.
- Has batted above .300 vs. the Giants in each of the last three seasons.
- Recorded 24 RBI vs. the Giants in both 2016 and 2015 ... the only other Rockies player to record 24 RBI in a season vs. any opponent was Preston Wilson vs. San Francisco in 2003.
- Hit 10 home runs and recorded 24 RBI vs. SF in 2015, the fourth player ever with that many home runs and RBI in a season vs. the Giants, joining Dolph Camilli in 1941 (11 HR, 30 RBI), Roy Campanella in 1953 (10, 28) and Stan Musial in 1954 (12, 27).

NOT YOUR MOM'S BASEMENT

- At 19-13, Colorado is tied for the Major League lead in road wins.
- The Rockies' .594 road winning percentage is ninth in MLB and fourth in the NL ... Colorado has played a Major League-leading 32 road games.
- Colorado has not finished any homestand above .500 and is 9-12 (.429) in Denver ... are tied for the fewest home wins in the National League and are have the fourth-lowest winning percentage.

NEW ERA

- Chad Bettis (2.03) and German Márquez (2.06) rank fourth and fifth, respectively, in the National League in road ERA.

AT LARGE

- The Rockies' 82.5 stolen-base percentage ranks first in the National League, third in MLB ... Colorado's 33 stolen bases rank fifth in the NL.
- The Rockies are 15-for-15 in stolen-base attempts this month ... have not been caught stealing since April 29 in the first inning at Miami (Ian Desmond) ... it is the longest streak without a caught stealing since a 15-game string in 2013 ... also had a 15-game string in 1996 ... the club record for consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing is 18 in 2012.

TALK TO TONY

- Nolan Arenado has reached in 34 of his 35 games since April 12 and in 45 of his 48 games overall.
- Arenado is batting .330 (32-for-97) his past 25 games since April 29 ... hitting .337 in May, including .400 with runners in scoring position.

SNEAKY STREAK

- Chris Iannetta has reached base in 16 consecutive games, tied for the longest active streak in the National League ... it is the second-longest on-base streak of his career (longest: 29 games in 2008).

I'LL BE HERE ALL WEEK

- Bryan Shaw is tied for the Major League lead with 28 appearances ... he has allowed no runs 20 times ... in the seven games he has been scored upon, he has allowed 17 runs, including two or more four times.

#COORSLIGHT

- A total of 40 of the Rockies' 65 home runs have come on the road, the second-most in the NL and the third-most in MLB ... Colorado's 65 home runs rank third in the NL.
- Charlie Blackmon's 11 road home runs rank second in MLB ... Ian Desmond, who has hit seven of his nine on the road, ranks tied for ninth in MLB and tied for third in the NL in road home runs.

CAN YOU GET THAT FOR ME?

- The Rockies have allowed 29 of 72 inherited runners to score (40.3%) ... that is the highest inherited runners scored percentage in the NL, third-highest in MLB ... Colorado's highest IRS% over a season came in 1996, when they allowed 40.5% ... their lowest was last season at 25.2%.

ACROSSTHE BOARD

- The Lubbock, Texas, native a member of his third career Opening Day roster in his sixth Major League season.
- Selected by the Rockies in the second round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft out of Texas Tech University.
- Attended Monterey High School in Lubbock ... was named to the all-region team before his senior season ... drafted by the Houston Astros in the eighth round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft, but did not sign.

GREAT CHETTIS

- His four road wins rank tied for second in the Majors, while his 2.03 road ERA (44.1 IP, 10 ER) is 10th in MLB and fourth in the National League ... ranks first in the NL with 44.1 road innings.
- Overall, tied for 14th in the National League with four wins and 20th in the NL with a 3.30 ERA (60.0 IP, 22 ER).
- Streak of four starts to begin '18 in which he pitched five or more innings with two or fewer runs and five or fewer hits allowed, the longest such string to start a season in Rockies history.

BE GIANT

- Has made one stat against the Giants this season, did not factor in the Rockies 5-3 win at AT&T Park on May 17 ... pitched six innings, allowing three runs on five hits with four walks.
- Did not figure in his lone start against the Giants last season at Coors Field ... posting a 5.06 ERA (5.1 IP, 3 ER) ... is 2-3 with a 4.37 ERA (35.0 IP, 17 ER) in seven career games, five starts vs. the Giants at home.
- Pitched a complete game shutout at Coors Field against San Francisco on Sept. 5, 2016.
- In 12 career games, eight starts is 3-4 with a 4.50 ERA (56.0 IP, 28 ER) vs. San Francisco ... as a starter, is 3-3 with a 4.24 ERA (51.0 IP, 24 ER) ... has four quality starts in eight career starts against the Giants.

LAST TIME OUT

- Did not figure in the Rockies' 5-3 loss on May 22 at Dodger Stadium ... allowed two runs on three hits with three walks and four strikeouts over five innings pitched ... left with the game tied 2-2.

DARK HORSE

- Is 4-1 in his seven road starts this season and has allowed a total of 10 earned runs on 31 hits over 44.1 innings of work ... opponents batting .257 on the road (31-for-156) ... has walked 15 while fanning 28 away from Coors Field.
- In 54 career appearances on the road, including 43 starts, is 15-16 with a 4.298 ERA (250.1 IP, 119 ER) ... as a starter, has gone 15-15 with a 4.26 ERA (239.0 IP, 113 ER) ... Rockies are 28-22.

IN THE REARVIEW

- Allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in five innings pitched May 11 vs. Milwaukee ... allowed three runs in the sixth inning before being removed from the game ... left the game still in line for the win with the Rockies up 9-7 ... the Rockies eventually lost 11-10 in 10 innings.

FAST TRACK

- Is 13-7 with a 4.76 ERA (206.0 IP, 109 ER) in 36 career starts at Coors Field ...his .636 winning percentage at Coors Field ranks eighth among Colorado pitchers all-time with 150.0 or more innings ... is 1-1 with a 11.51 ERA (20.1 IP, 26 ER) in 18 relief appearances in Denver.
- Made three starts at Coors Field this season and combined to pitch 15.2 innings with 12 runs allowed (6.89 ERA) ... does not yet have a decision in Denver.
- Since the beginning of 2016, has gone 9-3 with a 4.50 ERA (128.0 IP, 64 ER) in 22 starts at Coors Field ... the Rockies have gone 16-6 at home over that span.
- Colorado won 11 consecutive games at Coors Field in his starts from June 9, 2016-Aug. 14, 2017 ... over that span, he went 7-0 with a 3.50 ERA (64.1 IP, 25 ER).

DON'T BET AGAINST HIM

- Returned to the starting rotation in 2017 after recovering from a testicular cancer diagnosis and subsequent surgery ... was originally diagnosed and underwent surgery in November, 2016 ... a biopsy in March, 2017 showed the cancer had spread and he underwent chemotherapy treatments throughout the spring and beginning of summer.
- Placed on the 60-day disabled list March 26, 2017, sent to Double-A Hartford to begin rehab July 13 ... was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list and optioned to Triple-A Albuquerque Aug. 4.
- Made his first Major League start of the season on Aug. 14 vs. the Atlanta Braves ... pitched seven shutout innings and allowed six hits with no walks and two strikeouts in a 3-0 Rockies win.
- Made nine Major League starts and went 2-4 with a 5.05 ERA (46.1 IP, 26 ER), 11 walks and 30 strikeouts.

ALL OUT

- Was the recipient of the 207 Tony Conigliaro Award, which is given to a Major Leaguer who has overcome adversity through the attributes of spirit, determination and courage that were trademarks of Tony C. ... Bettis became the second Rockies pitcher to receive the award (Aaron Cook, 2005).

YEARLING

- Made his Major League debut in 2013, making eight starts and eight relief appearances.
- Was used solely as a reliever in 2014, making 21 relief appearances for the Rockies ... returned to the starting rotation in 2015, making 20 starts.

24-year-old Denver native will make his 11th start of the season, fourth at home ... has won three of his four starts in May, posting a 2.05 ERA (26.1 IP, 6 ER) ... took the loss in his last start at Los Angeles-NL on Wednesday, allowed three runs on six hits over 6.1 innings and fanned three with three walks ... went 2-2 with a 3.22 ERA (22.1 IP, 8 ER) in four starts as a rookie vs. San Francisco last season ... three of his four career starts against the Giants have come at Coors Field, is 2-1 with a 2.20 ERA (16.1 IP, 4 ER) over those starts ... in three starts at Coors Field this season, is 2-1 with a 1.40 ERA (19.1 IP, 3 ER) eight walks and 19 strikeouts ... his 3.30 ERA at Coors Field ranks first in franchise history (min. 100 IP).
