MUCHO SWAGGER

• The Colorado Rockies continue their seven-game homestand today with the final game of a four-game series against the San Francisco Giants ... will host the Arizona Diamondbacks for three games Tuesday-Thursday after an off day on Monday ... have won four consecutive games after losing a season-high tying three straight games in Pittsburgh.

A DAY FOR THE OLD MAN

• Colorado is again joining all of Major League Baseball in celebrating Father's Day and participating in the fight against prostate cancer ... players will sport specialty jerseys, caps and socks in addition to wristbands and the symbolic blue ribbon on their jerseys ... MLB will again donate all royalty payments from the sale of the specialty caps and jerseys to the Prostate Cancer Foundation and Stand Up To Cancer ... in addition, players can use blue equipment including compression sleeves, batting gloves, footwear, wrist/elbow/leg guards, and catcher's equipment. For the first time on Father's Day, a specially-stitched baseball made by Rawlings matching the color theme of the uniforms will be used in games on Sunday only.
• The Rockies are 12-12 in franchise history on Father's Day, including 8-6 at home.

CHICKEN DINNERS ALL AROUND

• Colorado is 45-26 and has a .634 winning percentage, which is the second-best in the Majors entering today.
• The Rockies have the most wins in franchise history and the best winning percentage through 71 games (previous best was 40-31, a .563 percentage, in 2000) ... the Rockies, with a one-game lead in the NL West, have not been in first this late in a season since 2006.

NARANJA

• Yesterday's win extended the Rockies win streak vs. the Giants to eight games, the longest winning streak vs. San Francisco in franchise history ... it is the Rockies' longest winning streak vs. any NL West opponent (previous: seven games, vs. Arizona, July 23-Sept. 13, 2004 & vs. Los Angeles-NL, Sept. 18-27, 2007).
• Overall, the Rockies are 9-1 vs. San Francisco this season ... Colorado swept the Giants in three games at Coors Field, April 21-13, and went 3-1 at AT&T Park, April 13-16.
• With a win today, the Rockies will sweep the Giants in four games for the first time in franchise history.
• Last season, the Rockies went 5-4 against the Giants at Coors Field, 4-6 in San Francisco.

• DJ LeMahieu is 9-for-14 in the series, including four-hit performances in each of the first two games ... he became the 11th Rockies player (12th time) to record back-to-back four-hit games (last: Carlos González, July 30-31, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL).
• LeMahieu is now batting .341 (101-for-296) against the Giants, the highest average among all active players.

WAR CRY

• Nolan Arenado leads Major League Baseball in doubles (25), and has four against the Giants in this series thus far after recording a career-high three doubles Thursday and another Friday.
• Is now batting .328 (22-for-67) in June with 17 RBI, which ranks second in the National League.
• In 10 games vs. the Giants this season, is batting .333 (14-for-42) with 10 RBI ... is a career .312 (98-for-314) hitter against the Giants with 31 doubles, two triples, 20 home runs and 71 RBI.

STILL GOLDEN

• Nolan Arenado's had his 68-game errorless streak to begin the season snapped yesterday ... according to Elias, it was the longest such streak for a third baseman since Milwaukee's Don Money's 1974 string of 86 games ... Money's stretch is also the Major League record for consecutive games without an error by a third baseman at any point during a season.
• Arenado's errorless stretch was the third-longest streak at third base in franchise history, behind Jeff Cirillo (85, 2001) and Vinny Castilla (75, 2004) ... Arenado passed Castilla (61, 1998) for third place June 9.

TRES NAZTY

• Charlie Blackmon hit a triple in back-to-back games for the second time this season Thursday and Friday, and now has a single-season career-high 10 on the year ... the Rockies' single-season triples record is 15 by Dexter Fowler in 2011.

RARE AIR

• This is only the second season in franchise history in which the Rockies have gotten to at least 19 games above .500 at any point (2009) ... the last time was at the end of the 2009 season when the Rockies finished 92-70 ... Colorado's all-time high-water mark is 24 games in '09 at 92-68.

CREDIT ALL GOES TO EGGS

• The Rockies are 25-13 away from Denver and have the most road wins in the Majors ... the Rockies have only had one winning record away from Denver in a season, going 41-40 in 2009.
• The Rockies dropped two of three to Pittsburgh, their first road series loss of the season ... per Elias, the 11 straight road series without losing one is the longest streak in Rockies history ... the last MLB team to open a season without losing any of its first 11 road series was the 2001 Mariners ... the last NL team was the 1983 Dodgers.
• Only Houston (.742, 23-8), Minnesota (.690, 20-9) and Washington (.667, 24-12) have better road winning percentages than Colorado's .658 percentage.

GETTING SERIOUS

• The Rockies have won 16 of 23 series overall this year with three splits ... have dropped series at home to San Diego, Seattle and Washington and on the road at Pittsburgh.
• The sweep vs. the Mariners (May 29-30) snapped Colorado's streak of nine consecutive series without a series loss, which tied a franchise record (May 21-June 21, 2007).

JUNE BOOM

• The Rockies are 12-4 in June, the most wins this month in MLB ... have posted a NL-leading .308 batting average (172-for-559), including a .343 average with runners in scoring position (57-for-166) while averaging 6.3 runs per game.
• The pitching staff has a 3.73 ERA (140.0 IP, 58 ER) in June with a .252 opponents' batting average against (133-for-527) ... starters are 10-2 with nine quality starts and a 3.34 ERA (91.2 IP, 34 ER) ... relievers are 2-2 with a 4.47 ERA (48.1 IP, 24 ER).

ROOKIE BALL

• The Rockies' rookie combination of Kyle Freeland, Jeff Hoffman, German Márquez and Antonio Senzatela are 26-9 with a 3.65 ERA (249.1 IP, 101 ER) over 43 starts, including 23 quality starts.

FLYING DUTCHMAN

• Rockies closer Greg Holland failed to record the save in Thursday's game, his first failed save conversion of the season ... his 23 consecutive converted saves was the longest streak in franchise history to begin a season and was the second-longest overall streak in franchise history (longest: 26, Huston Street, June 8 - Sept. 27, 2009).

CHAT ABOUT THAT

- The 27-year-old Redlands, Calif., native made his fourth career and second consecutive Opening Day roster after missing all of 2015 due to recovery from Tommy John surgery.
- Will be making his 103rd career start today, his 112th appearance overall ... has made 84 appearances, 77 starts with the Rockies since 2012.

LAST TIME OUT

- Did not factor in the decision on June 13 at Pittsburgh ... pitched six innings, allowing one run on one hit with one walk and five strikeouts.
- Pitched three shutout innings before allowing a solo home run in the fourth.
- Has allowed only one run in each of his last three starts ... pitching six or more innings in all three.

PITCHER WINS MEAN NOTHING, BUT...

- Over his six wins, has a 1.47 ERA (43.0 IP, 7 ER) with 14 walks and 31 strikeouts (6.49 SO/9) ... over his seven losses, has a 7.90 ERA (35.1 IP, 31 ER) with 23 walks and 33 strikeouts (8.41 SO/9).
- Is one win away from tying Steve Reed (33 wins) for 10th all-time as a Rockies.

STAY LOW

- Has induced 135 ground balls this year, a 58.4 ground ball percentage that ranks third in the National League ... has induced 10 ground ball double plays, tied for the eighth-most in the NL.

GIANTS

- Will be making his third start against the Giants this season, second at Coors Field ... is 2-0 with a 2.40 ERA (15.0 IP, 4 ER), four walks and six strikeouts.
- In his last start against the Giants at Coors Field, pitched six innings allowing four runs on seven hits with three walks and two strikeouts in a 6-5 Rockies win.

THAT KID ON THE ROAD

- Is 4-3 with a 2.41 ERA (52.1 IP, 14 ER), 33 hits, 19 walks and 42 strikeouts in eight road starts this season ... his road ERA ranks seventh in MLB and tied for fourth in the NL.
- Is 3-0 in his last four road starts, allowing two runs in 27 innings (1.00 ERA) ... has allowed 15 hits with eight walks and 25 strikeouts over that span.
- In 54 career appearances, 49 starts, on the road is 20-13 with a 3.10 ERA (290.1 IP, 100 ER) ... as a starter, is 20-12 with a 2.97 ERA (279.0 IP, 92 ER) on the road.
- Among active starting pitchers with at least 45 starts on the road, Chatwood's 3.13 road ERA ranks third behind Clayton Kershaw and Chris Sale.
- Was 8-1 with a 1.69 ERA (80.0 IP, 15 ER) on the road in 2016, recording the lowest road ERA in the Majors last season and the lowest in franchise history among pitchers with 80.0 or more innings pitched ... at home, went 4-8 with 6.12 ERA (78.0 IP, 53 ER), 34 walks and 56 strikeouts.
- Recorded a club-record 27.2-inning road scoreless streak April 6-May 21, which was the longest by any Major League pitcher since Wade Davis' 28.2-inning stretch in 2014 (April 26-Sept. 25) ... it was the longest such streak by a Major League starter since Josh Beckett's streak in 2014 (28.0 IP, May 25-July 22).
- Chatwood's six-game win streak on the road (snapped at Philadelphia, Aug. 14) was the longest road winning streak for the Rockies since Ubaldo Jimenez won six consecutive games, Sept. 20, 2009-May 3, 2010.
- The streak of six quality starts on the road (April 6-June 18), which ended at Miami June 18 with an injury, was the longest for the Rockies since Jhoulys Chacin also recorded six consecutive quality road starts, May 27-Aug. 7, 2013 ... the last Rockies pitcher to record a streak of seven quality starts on the road was Jason Hammel, May 3-July 1, 2009.

THE CAN

- Is 2-4 with a 7.03 ERA (32.0 IP, 25 ER), 19 walks and 27 strikeouts in six starts at Coors Field this season.
- Was 4-8 with a 6.12 ERA (78.0 IP, 53 ER) in 14 starts at Coors Field in 2016 ... his 6.12 home ERA was the worst in MLB in their home ballpark (min. 75 IP at home).
- In 42 career appearances, 38 career starts, at Coors Field, is 16-16 with one save and a 5.17 ERA (215.2 IP, 124 ER).
- Made 11 starts at Coors Field in 2013 and went 5-2 with a 3.50 ERA (61.2 IP, 24 ER).

WITH EASE

- Pitched his first career complete-game shutout April 15 at San Francisco in a 5-0 Rockies win ... allowed two hits and one walk with four strikeouts.
- Chatwood retired the first 17 batters in order, the second-longest perfect game bid in franchise history ... the Giants' Chris Marrero broke up the perfect game and no-hitter with a single to right field with two outs in the sixth inning ... only Bettis has gone longer among Rockies pitchers all-time, sitting down the first 18 hitters at Philadelphia on May 29, 2015.
- It was the seventh complete-game shutout by a Rockies pitcher while allowing two hits or fewer ... the most recent two-hitter prior to Chatwood was by Chad Bettis, Sept. 5, 2016 vs. San Francisco at Coors Field.
- It was only the fifth Rockies complete-game shutout vs. the Giants and the third at AT&T Park ... Ubaldo Jimenez accomplished the feat on May 31, 2010 and Jeff Francis blanked the Giants in San Francisco on Aug. 29, 2007.
- It was Chatwood's second career complete game ... he lost 1-0, allowing four hits in eight innings, on July 13, 2013 at Dodger Stadium.

BACK AT IT

- In 2016, went 12-9 with a 3.87 ERA (158.0 IP, 68 ER), 70 walks and 117 strikeouts.
- Recorded 14 quality starts last season, which were third-most for the Rockies behind Chad Bettis (17) and Jon Gray (16).
