MOUNTAINS ON FIRE

- The Colorado Rockies continue their two-opponent, seven-game homestand this evening with the second of four games vs. the New York Mets ... host the Miami Marlins for three games this weekend.
- Fell 12-2 last night, their first loss to the Mets this season after sweeping them in three games in New York, May 4-6 ... Tyler Anderson took his second loss of the season after allowing three runs on seven hits over 5.1 innings of work ... allowed a leadoff inside-the-park home run to Cheyenne, Wyo., native Brandon Nimmo, the first leadoff inside-the-park home run allowed in franchise history ... Bud Black received his first ejection of the season in the bottom of the fourth inning, his 28th career ejection as a manager.
- The Rockies went 2-4 on a two-city, six-game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2) and Texas (1-2).

GLAD YOU ARE HERE

- Members of the Rockies All-Time 25 Team will be honored with a number of events this weekend on Saturday and Sunday at Coors Field for the 1:10 p.m. games on both days ... Saturday will include the Rockies 25th Anniversary Photo Day, a replica jersey giveaway to the first 15,000 fans, Alumni Batting Practice and a pregame ceremony ... on Sunday, the first 15,000 fans through the gates will receive a 25th Anniversary Blake Street Bomber T-shirt.

BREAKING IN THE COUCHES

- Between now and the All-Star break, Colorado will play 16 of 25 games at Coors Field ... the Rockies are tied for second in the Majors behind San Francisco with 41 road games.

NO SPIN ZONE

- The Rockies are four games under .500 for the first time this season ... have lost eight of the past 10 games.
- Have lost eight consecutive home games dating back to June 1 ... that is the longest single-season home losing streak in Coors Field history ... the longest home losing streak in franchise history is nine games, July 25-Aug. 18, 1993 at Mile High Stadium ... have been out-scored 81-39 over the losing streak ... have yet to play over .500 in any homestand thus far in 2018.
- The Rockies have posted a 7.58 ERA (143.2 IP, 121 ER) in June, with a bullpen ERA of 10.15 (52.1 IP, 59 ER) over that span ... the bullpen is 0-7 with two saves in seven opportunities in June.

MEET THE METS

- Since losing 11 consecutive games to New York from May 4, 2014-Aug. 23, 2015, the Rockies are 12-5 vs. the Mets ... have won four of their last five vs. NY and six of the past eight.
- Gerardo Parra (2-for-4 last night) is a career .319 hitter (65-for-204) vs. New York ... Ian Desmond has 20 home runs, his most against any opponent (has 16 vs. Atlanta) ... ranks seventh among all active players in home runs vs. the Mets.

T FOR TEXAS

- Trevor Story leads the National League lead (ranks second in MLB) with 54 RBI and is tied for third in the league with 15 home runs.
- Batting .320 (39-for-122) since May 15, hitting safely in 23 of 30 games, including 10 of his past 12 ... has hit in 12 of 16 games in June, batting .354 this month (23-for-65).
- Story has hit safely in 13 of his past 17 road games (.297, 22-for-74) ... multi hits seven times that span ... hit safely in seven of his past eight road contests (.323, 12-for-36).

IT'S BEEN BUMPY

- The Rockies have lost 21 games after leading, which ranks first in the National League and third in the Majors ... they have 12 come from behind wins, 11th in the NL.

FIVE STARS

- The Rockies' 23 road wins rank third in the Majors and first in the National League ... the team's .561 road winning percentage is fifth in the NL and 10th in MLB.

BE FIRST

- Colorado's 61 runs in the first inning lead the Majors but they rank fourth in the Majors with 60 runs allowed in the first.
- Have hit a Major League-leading 20 home runs in the first inning ... Nolan Arenado's six first-inning home runs are tied for the most in the NL while Trevor Story's five home runs are tied for fourth.
- Nolan Arenado (18) and Trevor Story (16) rank first and second, respectively, in MLB in first-inning RBI.
- Among NL leaders in first-inning batting average, DJ LeMahieu (.419) ranks second (20 PA minimum).

WITH THE LEATHER

- Colorado ranks second in the Majors with a .991 fielding percentage ... the Rockies have committed 25 errors, tied for the second-fewest in MLB ... Sunday at Texas marked the club's fifth two-error game of the year.

THEY'RE JUST LIKE US

- The Rockies and the Houston Astros are the only two teams in the Major Leagues that have used the same five starting pitchers all season.

I'LL TAKE A ROADIE

- Chad Bettis (2.70) ranks sixth in the National League in road ERA ... his five road wins are tied for second in the league and his road innings (50.0) are tied for fourth.

GET THAT BALL, TINY

- Wade Davis is one save shy of 100 and one strikeout away from 800 ... Adam Ottavino recorded his 400th career strikeout Sunday at Texas.

HE DOESN'T READ TWITTER

- Ian Desmond has hit safely in 14 of his past 20 games (.309, 21-for-68) with a .400 on-base percentage ... since June 10, over eight games, he is 11-for-31 (.355) with three home runs and seven RBI.
- His 14 home runs are tied for seventh in the NL ... 11 of those have come on the road, tied with Charlie Blackmon for most in the Rockies and tied for second in NL.

FREQUENT FLYERS

- Ian Desmond's team-high 25 road RBI are tied for fourth in the NL ... Nolan Arenado is tied for sixth 24 RBI away from Denver, while Charlie Blackmon (23) is tied for 10th.

DON'T WORRY, BE HAPPY

- Gerardo Parra has a hit in 11 of his past 13 games (.432, 19-for-44) with a .479 on-base percentage ... also hit in 13 of his past 17 games (.367, 22-for-60) with multiple hits eight times ... batting .340 (49-for-144) since April 27.
- Parra is hitting .320 (41-for-128) on the road, which ranks eighth in the NL ... batting .408 (29-for-71) his past 21 road contests since May 2 ... has hit safely in seven of his past eight road games (.481; 113-for-27) with multi hits five times.

MARQUE IT

- 23-year-old right-hander is a member of his second career Opening Day roster ... broke camp with the 2017 club as a reliever.
Made his Major League debut on Sept. 8, 2016 at San Diego, pitching an inning of relief.
Acquired from Tampa Bay on Jan. 28, 2016 along with left-handed pitcher Jake McGee in exchange for outfielder Corey Dickerson and infielder Kevin Padlo.

LAST TIME OUT

- Entered his last start last June 14 at Philadelphia with a 2.06 road ERA, but allowed six runs on seven hits in the loss ... six road runs tied a career high for the third time ... departed in the seventh trailing 3-2 and leaving three runners who eventually scored in the Phillies' four-run inning ... allowed two homers at Philadelphia, five over his previous two starts.

2018

- Rockies won three of his first four starts, going 1-1 with a 4.34 ERA (18.2 IP, 9 ER) ... went 1-4 with a 5.76 ERA (25.0 IP, 16 ER) in five games from April 22-May 15 ... 2-2 with a 5.10 ERA (30.0 IP, 17 ER) in five starts (2-3) since.
The Rockies have dropped his past three starts, scoring a combined seven runs (0-2, 8.44, 16.0 IP, 15 ER) ... allowed seven home runs.
Was 4-4 with a 4.00 ERA (45.0 IP, 20 ER) in eight starts from April 16-May 27 ... won consecutive starts May 21-27, beating Los Angeles-NL and Cincinnati respectively (14.0 IP, 2 ER).
Rockies are 6-8 in his 14 starts, this year; 2-5 in Denver and 4-3 on the road ... Colorado has scored three or fewer runs while he's in the game nine times, two or fewer eight games.

COORS HEAVY

- In 23 career appearances, 22 starts, at Coors Field, is 8-7 with a 5.18 ERA (125.0 IP, 72 ER) ... 1-4 with a 7.71 ERA (32.2, IP, 28 ER) this year.
Is now 1-5 with a 7.05 ERA (44.2 IP, 35 ER) in his past nine starts at home since Sept. 3, 2017 with the Rockies 2-7 ... Colorado has scored three runs or fewer six times, including one run in three games

ROAD WARRIOR

- His 3.07 road ERA (41.0 IP, 8 ER) ranks 10th in the NL.
Four of his five quality starts have come on the road ... the Rockies are 4-3 in his seven road outings.
In 24 career starts on the road, has gone 8-8 with a 4.11 ERA (127.0 IP, 58 ER) ... made two road relief appearances in 2016 and allowed three runs in 4.1 innings pitched (6.23 ERA).

FIRST THINGS FIRST

- Has allowed 16 of his 45 runs this season in the first inning ... opponents are batting .355 (22-for-62) with five of his 13 home runs allowed in the first.

DEEP SIX

- Allowed six hits or fewer nine times this year, including three times at home ... given up six or fewer hits 10 times at home over 19 starts since May 5, 2017.

GOOD TEAM WIN

- The Rockies have won 16 of his past 30 starts since July 7, 2017 ... has gone 10-10 with a 4.71 ERA (166.1 IP, 87 ER) over that span.

A DENVER OPENER

- Started the Rockies home opener on April 6 and walked a career-high six batters en route to an 8-3 loss vs. the Braves at Coors Field ... allowed four runs in the first inning and charged with three in the fifth, working 4.2 frames ... game was delayed one hour due to inclement weather and eventually began at 27 degrees, the second-coldest start temperature in club history.

A YEAR TO REMEMBER

- Named to the Topps All-Star Rookie Team, the second pitcher in franchise history to earn that honor (Jason Jennings, 2002).
Made 29 starts in his rookie season in 2017 and went 11-7 with a 4.39 ERA (162.0 IP, 79 ER), 49 walks and 147 strikeouts.
Led all Major League rookies in strikeouts and quality starts (14) and finished tied with Kyle Freeland in wins ... finished second in innings pitched (162.0) and tied for first in games started (29).
Recorded six consecutive quality starts from July 7-Aug. 8, the longest streak by a Rockies rookie in franchise history.
Per Elias, became the first rookie in Rockies history to record at least nine strikeouts in each of three consecutive games in a single season, July 17-29 (9 SO, 9 SO, 10 SO).
