THE HEAT IS ON

- The Colorado Rockies are home at Coors Field for a six-game homestand to complete the first half of the season prior to the All-Star break next week ... play three games against the Arizona Diamondbacks before hosting the Seattle Mariners.
- The Rockies have won five of their last seven games ... have also won eight of the past 11 and 12 of the past 19 ... off to a 5-3 start in July after an 11-16 June.

SMASH MOUTH

- Nolan Arenado, Charlie Blackmon and Trevor Story were each selected to represent the National League in the 2018 All-Star Game at Nationals Park in Washington D.C. ... it is the sixth consecutive season that the Rockies have had multiple All-Stars.
- Arenado was voted by the fans as the National League's starting third baseman for the second consecutive year ... it is his fourth consecutive All-Star selection, tied with Dante Bichette (1994-96, 1998) and Larry Walker (1997-99, 2001) for the second-most All-Star selections in franchise history ... Arenado joins Todd Helton (2000-04) as the only Rockies players to be selected to four consecutive All-Star games.
- This is Blackmon's third All-Star selection, his second in a row ... he is the ninth player in franchise history to earn three All-Star nods, the fifth Rockies outfielder (also: González, Holliday, Walker, Bichette).
- Story joins Troy Tulowitzki as the only shortstops in franchise history to be named to the All-Star team.

FUTURE

- Two Rockies players were chosen to play in the All-Star Futures Game, which will be played on Sunday, July 15 at Nationals Park.
- Infielder Brendan Rodgers will represent the U.S. Team ... Rodgers is batting .273 with 21 doubles, two triples, 17 home runs, 58 RBI and 11 stolen bases with Double-A Hartford this season.
- Right-handed pitcher Jesus Tinoco was selected to represent the World Team ... Tinoco, acquired by the Rockies in 2015 from the Toronto Blue Jays, is 6-7 with a 5.21 ERA (93.1 IP, 54 ER), 27 walks and 85 strikeouts with Hartford.

NINE IS ENOUGH

- The Rockies have lost nine in a row vs. the Diamondbacks at Coors Field, the longest losing streak at Coors Field against any single opponent ... the Rockies lost 11 straight to the Atlanta Braves at Mile High Stadium from May 6, 1993-Aug. 9, 1994.
- Colorado has lost four straight overall to the D-backs ... was swept by Arizona at Coors Field June 8-19, allowing 29 runs while scoring 14 ... dropped two of three at Arizona to open the 2018 season.
- The Rockies are 18-27 overall against Arizona since the 2016 season, including 7-16 at Coors Field.

GO LOW

- The Rockies have posted a 1.97 ERA their past 10 starts, allowing 14 earned runs over 64.0 innings ... have seven quality starts with the starters 6-1.
- Sunday's start by Antonio Senzatela snapped a streak of eight starts by the Rockies allowing two or fewer runs ... the streak was tied for the longest in franchise history (also: Sept. 16-23, 2014).
- The Rockies have nine outings of at least seven scoreless innings, including four such outings since June 27 ... that is tied for the third-most starts of that kind in franchise history (also: 2011) behind the 2008 (11) team and the 2010 club (16).
- Since the start of 2017, the Rockies have used eight starting pitchers, the fewest in the Major Leagues.

ON THE HILL

- Colorado has posted a 2.70 overall ERA (113.1 IP, 34 ER) in the past 13 games, limiting opponents to a .212 batting average (87-for-411). ... from June 29 through July 7, a span of eight games, the Rockies notched a 1.52 ERA (71.0 IP, 12 ER), allowing two or fewer earned runs seven times.

WORM IS TURNING

- Four runs in last night's loss snapped the Rockies' bullpen streak of no runs in four consecutive games (10.0 I) from July 4-8 ... Colorado's bullpen has allowed no runs six times in the past nine games (3.13 ERA, 23.0 IP, 8 ER).
- The bullpen has a 3.57 ERA (53.0 IP, 21 ER) in the past 19 games, with seven saves in nine opportunities.

BE IN YOUR SEATS

- Colorado leads the Majors in runs scored in the first inning (74) and also leads MLB in runs allowed in the first frame (76).
- Have hit a Major League-leading 27 home runs in the first inning, and have allowed 23 to lead the Majors ... Nolan Arenado's 10 first-inning home runs and 25 RBI are the most in MLB.

NORMAL NOLAN

- Nolan Arenado is tied for first in the National League with 23 home runs and ranks tied for third with 64 RBI ... also ranks second in slugging percentage (.593) and second in total bases (192).

A NOVEL STORY

- Trevor Story is batting .353 (49-for-139) since June 1, the second-highest average in the National League that span ... also leads the NL since June 1 with 16 doubles.
- Has hit .343 (36-for-105) on the road since May 15, fourth in the NL that time span ... also ranks fourth in the NL since June 6 with a .388 road batting average (26-for-67).
- Story has tied his Major League career-high (second time, June 8-13, 2018) with five consecutive multiple-hit games since July 3.
- Returned to the lineup on Sunday after missing Saturday's game with a right foot contusion, ending his consecutive games streak at 139 ... it was the third-longest active streak in the Majors.
- Story is fifth in the NL with 62 RBI, second with 47 extra-base hits, fourth with 185 total bases and tied for eighth with 17 home runs.

MARK YOUR MARQUE

- 23-year-old right-hander was a member of his second career Opening Day roster in 2018 ... broke camp with the 2017 club as a reliever.
- Made his Major League debut on Sept. 8, 2016 at San Diego, pitching an inning of relief.
- Acquired from Tampa Bay on Jan. 28, 2016 along with left-handed pitcher Jake McGee in exchange for outfielder Corey Dickerson and infielder Kevin Padlo.
- Pronounced *HAIR-mahn MAR-keh-z*

LAST TIME OUT

- Earned his seventh win of the season last Friday at Seattle, his fifth on the road ... pitched six innings and allowed one run on five hits with no walks and five strikeouts ... the one run came on a solo home run in the sixth inning.
- Improved to 3-0 in six career Interleague starts, posting a 2.48 ERA (36.1 IP, 10 ER), eight walks and 28 strikeouts.

BRING IT HOME

- Has won each of his past two starts, allowing two runs across 14 innings pitched (1.29 ER) ... has allowed seven hits with no walks and 14 strikeouts over that span ... first time in his career he has not walked a batter in consecutive starts.

HOME AND AWAY

- Has a 7.93 home ERA (42.0 IP, 37 ER) compared to a 2.62 road mark (55.0 IP, 16 ER) ... nine homers allowed in Denver, seven on the road.

ROAD WARRIOR

- His 2.62 road ERA (55.0 IP, 16 ER) ranks fifth in the NL ... tied for fourth in the NL with five road wins.
- Rockies have won six of his nine road starts this year ... has six of his seven quality starts on the road with a .198 opponents' batting average against (40-for-202) ... worked five or more innings in every road game, including six or more frames seven times.
- In 26 career starts on the road, is 10-8 with a 3.83 ERA (141.0 IP, 60 ER) ... made two road relief appearances in 2016 and allowed three runs in 4.1 innings pitched (6.23 ERA).

COORS HEAVY

- Is 2-5 with a 7.93 ERA (42.0 IP, 37 ER), 21 walks and 42 strikeouts in nine starts at home this season ... has allowed four or more runs in four straight home starts (8.38 ERA, 19.1 IP, 18 ER).
- In 25 career appearances, 24 starts, at Coors Field, is 9-8 with a 5.43 ERA (134.1 IP, 81 ER) ... Rockies are 13-11 when he starts at home.
- Is 2-6 with a 7.33 ERA (54.0 IP, 44 ER) in his past 11 starts at home since Sept. 3, 2017 with the Rockies 3-8 ... Colorado has scored three runs or fewer six times, including one run in three games.

FIRST THINGS FIRST

- Allowed 20 of his 57 runs in the first inning (second-most is nine in the fifth) ... given up a run in the first inning in 11 of his 18 starts ... opponents are batting .350 (28-for-80) with five of his 16 home runs allowed in the first ... has not allowed a first inning run in either of his past two starts.

GET THAT HIT

- His .300 (9-for-30) batting average leads all Major League pitchers ... second in the league behind Zack Greinke (10) with nine base hits.
- Recorded a career-high tying two hits on June 19 vs. the Mets (also: June 7, 2017 vs. Chicago-AL).

JULY JAMMIN'

- In six career starts in July, is 5-0 with a 3.20 ERA (39.1 IP, 14 ER) ... made five starts in July, 2017 and went 4-0 with a 3.51 ERA (33.1 IP, 13 ER), seven walks and 39 strikeouts.

DEEP SIX

- Allowed six hits or fewer 12 times this year, including eight times on the road.

A DENVER OPENER

- Started the Rockies home opener on April 6 and walked a career-high six batters en route to an 8-3 loss vs. the Braves at Coors Field ... allowed four runs in the first inning and charged with three in the fifth, working 4.2 frames ... game was delayed one hour due to inclement weather and eventually began at 27 degrees, the second-coldest start temperature in club history.

A YEAR TO REMEMBER

- Named to the *Topps* All-Star Rookie Team, the second pitcher in franchise history to earn that honor (Jason Jennings, 2002).
- Made 29 starts in his rookie season in 2017 and went 11-7 with a 4.39 ERA (162.0 IP, 79 ER), 49 walks and 147 strikeouts.
- Led all Major League rookies in strikeouts and quality starts (14) and finished tied with Kyle Freeland in wins ... finished second in innings pitched (162.0) and tied for first in games started (29).
- Recorded six consecutive quality starts from July 7-Aug. 8, the longest streak by a Rockies rookie in franchise history.
- Per Elias, became the first rookie in Rockies history to record at least nine strikeouts in each of three consecutive games in a single season, July 17-29

The 28-year-old right-hander will make his 19th start of the season ... ranks ninth in the National League with a 3.18 ERA, fourth with 4.1 WAR ... in eight starts at Coors Field, is 5-2 with a 2.89 ERA (43.2 IP, 14 ER) ... has limited opponents to a .215 batting average at home ... his 3.44 career ERA at Coors Field (130.2 IP, 50 ER) is the third-lowest in franchise history, the lowest by a starting pitcher (min. 100 IP) ... lost his only start against Arizona in 2018, June 10 at Coors Field ... allowed four runs on four hits with four walks and eight strikeouts in six innings ... in four career starts against the Diamondbacks, is 1-2 with a 4.74 ERA (19.0 IP, 10 ER), 13 walks and 15 strikeouts ... in two starts at home vs. the D-backs, is 0-2 with a 6.30 ERA (10.0 IP, 7 ER).
