### BREAK STUFF

- The Colorado Rockies wrap up the first half of the season today with the final game of a three-game set against the Seattle Mariners.
- Won 4-1 last night to claim the series win after winning 10-7 on Friday ... Jon Gray was recalled from Triple-A Albuquerque prior to the game and made the start, his 18th of the season ... pitched a season-high 7.1 innings and allowed one run on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts.
- Colorado has won nine of their last 11 and 12 of the last 15 games ... are 16-7 since June 19, a .696 winning percentage that ranks second in the NL, tied for fourth in MLB over that span ... have won 50 games prior to the All-Star Break for the third time in franchise history (also: 2017, 2003).
- The Rockies travel to Arizona for three games after the All-Star break, July 20-22, before returning home for a six-game Interleague homestand against the Houston (July 24-25) and Oakland (July 27-29).

### DAISY CHAIN

- The Rockies have won five consecutive series, all against teams at or above .500 at the beginning of the series ... it is the first time in franchise history that the Rockies have won five consecutive series against teams at or above .500, and the first time that they have won more than four consecutive series since 2014 (six consecutive series wins against Philadelphia, San Francisco, Los Angeles-NL, Arizona, New York-NL and Texas, April 18-May 6).

### SMASH MOUTH

- Nolan Arenado, Charlie Blackmon and Trevor Story were each selected to represent the National League in the 2018 All-Star Game at Nationals Park in Washington D.C. ... it is the sixth consecutive season that the Rockies have had multiple All-Stars.

### YOU DA BADDEST

- Infielder Brendan Rodgers (U.S. Team) and right-handed pitcher Jesus Tinoco (World Team) will represent the Rockies in the All-Star Futures Game today at Nationals Park.

the Rockies are 96-80 at home, 59-113 on the road ... Colorado is 13-11 the past 24 road games vs. the AL, including 3-3 this year.

### PORT OF DENVER

- Colorado took two of three in Seattle last weekend, the third time in franchise history they won a series in the Emerald City (2006, 2015).
- The Rockies are 20-23 all-time against the Mariners, going 11-12 on the road and 9-11 in Denver.
- The Rockies are 3-7 at home against the Mariners since 2012, but have won four games in a season against the Mariners for the first time (previous high: three, 2009 and 2013).
- Mariners Executive Vice President & General Manager of Baseball Operations Jerry Dipoto played four seasons with the Rockies (1997-2000), going 12-12 with a 4.21 ERA (267.1 IP, 125 ER) in 222 relief appearances.
- Mariners Manager Scott Servais, a catcher, signed with Colorado as a free agent on Dec. 17, 1999 and played 33 games for the Rockies in 2000, batting .218 (22-for-101) with four doubles, one home run and 13 RBI.

### GO LOW

- Rockies starters have posted a 2.20 ERA (86.0 IP, 21 ER) their past 14 starts ... have nine quality starts with the starters going 8-1.
- Since June 19, the Rockies have posted a 3.41 team ERA (203.1 IP, 77 ER), the second-lowest ERA in the National League, the fourth-lowest in MLB over that span ... the starters' 3.43 ERA over that span ranks fourth in the NL while the bullpen's 3.36 ERA ranks first.

### BE IN YOUR SEATS

- Colorado leads the Majors in runs scored in the first inning (80) and also leads MLB in runs allowed in the first frame (80).
- Have hit a Major League-leading 29 home runs in the first inning, and have allowed 24 to lead the Majors ... Nolan Arenado's 10 first-inning home runs are tied for the most in MLB and his 26 RBI are the most.

### A NOVEL STORY

- Trevor Story is batting .382 (50-for-131) in 32 games since June 8, the highest batting average in the Major Leagues since that date ... has hit .414 (24-for-58) on the road over that span, which also leads MLB.
- Story ranks second in the National League with 51 extra-base hits, tied for the sixth-most in franchise history before the All-Star break, the most since Carlos González recorded 53 extra-base hits before the 2013 break.
- His 67 RBI are tied with Nolan Arenado for fourth in the NL ... has 200 total bases, one more than Arenado, which ranks second in the NL.
- Story leads MLB with 42 two-out RBI.

### NORMAL NOLAN

- Nolan Arenado is tied for second in the National League with 23 home runs and tied for fourth with 67 RBI ... ranks second in slugging percentage (.585) and third in total bases (199).

### LOTS OF LONG BALLS

- Four Rockies (Arenado, Blackmon, Desmond, Story) players have hit 18 or more home runs this season, the most in the Major Leagues and the most in franchise history prior to the All-Star break ... the last team to accomplish the feat was the 2009 Philadelphia Phillies.

### MEET MY FRIEND MENDOZA

- Adam Ottavino (.158) and Wade Davis (.178) are each in line to carry sub-.200 opponent batting averages into the All-Star Break ... would become the second and third Rockies pitchers (Ubaldo Jimenez, .198 in 2010) to carry sub-.200 opponent batting averages into the All-Star Break (min. 1.54 batters faced / team game).

### LIKE TUPPERWARE

- Wade Davis has an NL-leading 27 saves, one short of Greg Holland's franchise record of 28 pre-All-Star saves set last season.

**QUACKS LIKE A DUCK**

- The 28-year-old left-hander will be making his 20th start of the season, his 10th at Coors Field ... is a member of his second career Opening Day roster in his third Major League season ... made his Major League debut on June 12, 2016 vs. San Diego.
- The University of Oregon product was selected as the Rockies' first-round selection (20th overall) in Major League Baseball's 2011 First-Year Player Draft ... was also drafted in '08 by the Minnesota Twins, but did not sign.

**LAST TIME OUT**

- Did not factor into the Rockies 5-3 loss to Arizona at Coors Field on July 10 ... pitched six innings and allowed one run on three hits with four walks and eight strikeouts ... his lone run came on a Nick Ahmed home run in the first inning ... exited the game with a 2-1 lead.

**THAT TYLER IS SO HOT RIGHT NOW**

- Has allowed one run in 22 innings (0.41 ERA) over his last three starts ... nine hits, seven walks and 25 strikeouts over that span ... lone run came on a solo home run ... has struck out at least eight hitters in each start, the longest streak of his career.
- Recorded consecutive outings of eight scoreless innings June 29 at Los Angeles-NL and July 4 vs. San Francisco ... is the third pitcher in franchise history to record consecutive outings of at least eight scoreless innings (also: Ubaldo Jimenez, May 26-31, 2010 and Jason Marquis, June 30-July 6, 2009) ... is the first pitcher in franchise history to accomplish that feat while allowing four or fewer hits in each start ... is the first pitcher in MLB to accomplish the feat since Jake Arrieta, Aug. 30-Sept. 5, 2015.

**LET'S GO BACK A LITTLE FURTHER**

- In seven starts since June 7, Anderson is 3-2 with a 2.09 ERA (47.1 IP, 11 ER), the second-lowest ERA in the National League, fourth-lowest in MLB ... his 49 strikeouts are tied for fourth and .196 opponent batting average ranks sixth over that span in the NL.
- The Rockies are 3-4 in his starts over that span ... have given Anderson three or fewer runs of support in five consecutive starts, including one run three times.

**A GIANT ZERO**

- Was the winning pitcher in the Rockies 1-0 win over the Giants at Coors Field on July 4 ... pitched eight scoreless innings for the second consecutive start, allowing two hits with two walks and a season-high tying nine strikeouts.
- Became the fifth pitcher in franchise history to toss at least eight scoreless innings with two or fewer hits at Coors Field, joining Kyle Freeland (2017), Chad Bettis (2016), Jeff Francis (2006) and Shawn Chacon (2003).

**BATTLESHIP**

- Will be making his second career start against the Mariners ... was the losing pitcher in the Rockies 10-4 loss to Seattle at Coors Field on May 30 of last season ... allowed six runs on a career-high 11 hits in five innings pitched ... walked two and struck out three ... allowed one home run (Seager).

**THE OTHER SIDE**

- In five career starts vs. the American League, is 1-3 with a 5.22 ERA (29.1 IP, 17 ER) ... lost his only Interleague start this season, May 9 vs. Los Angeles-AL at Coors Field ... allowed four runs on six hits across five innings.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

- His 3.60 career ERA at Coors Field is the lowest all-time among Rockies starting pitchers with at least 25 starts.
- In 29 career appearances in Denver, 28 starts, has worked 172.2 innings, allowing 69 earned runs ... is 10-8 overall at home with the Rockies 13-15 over his 28 starts.
- In nine starts at Coors Field this year, is 2-3 with a 4.05 ERA (53.1 IP, 24 ER).
- His 3.00 ERA at home in 2016 was the second-lowest home ERA in franchise history (min. 75 innings pitched) behind Jorge De La Rosa's 2.76 home ERA (81.2 IP, 25 ER) in 2013.

**AWAY WE GO**

- Rockies have won seven of his last nine road starts (4-0, 2.42, 52.0 IP, 14 ER) since April 5 ... has five quality starts ... overall, is 4-0 with a 3.48 ERA (54.1 IP, 21 ER) in 10 road games this year.
- Is 7-7 with a 4.46 ERA (135.1 IP, 67 ER) in 26 career games, 25 starts, away from Coors Field.

**TAKE A FLIER**

- Has the fourth-lowest ground-ball percentage in the National League at 37.0 ... his 110 fly balls are tied for third-most in the NL ... induced 110 ground balls with a grounder-to-flies ratio of 1.00 which ranks fourth-lowest in the NL.

**SAY HIT TO JULY**

- Did not make a start in July in 2017 ... in seven career starts in July is 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA (44.1 IP, 14 ER), 11 walks and 39 strikeouts.

**BACK STRONG**

- The Rockies have won 12 of his 23 appearances (11 of 22 starts) after he missed much of June and all of July and August last year (knee surgery) ... 9-4 with a 3.31 ERA (130.1 IP, 48 ER) since Sept. 11, 2017.

**THE NOT SO DISTANT PAST**

- In 15 starts and two relief appearances in 2017, went 6-6 with a 4.81 ERA (86.0 IP, 46 ER) ... the two relief appearances were the first of his professional career.
- Was 5-6 with a 5.11 ERA (81.0 IP, 46 ER) as a starter, 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (5.0 IP, 0 ER) in his two relief appearances.
- Had two separate stints on the 10-day disabled list and one stint on the 60-day DL ... placed on the 10-day DL on June 4 with left knee inflammation ... reinstated on June 22 but made just two appearances (one start) before being placed on the disabled list again on June 26 ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left knee on July 3 and was transferred to the 60-day DL on July 26.

**JUST A TASTE**

- Pitched one inning of relief in the National League Wild Card Game at Arizona ... entered the game in the third inning and allowed two runs on two hits with one strikeout ... allowed a two-run home run to Daniel Descalso.
