THE OTHER LEAGUE

- The Colorado Rockies continue a five-game Interleague homestand tonight with the final game of a two-game series against the defending World Champion Houston Astros ... will host the Oakland Athletics Friday-Sunday after an off-day on Thursday.
- The Rockies lost last night 8-2 in 10 innings ... scored two runs in the seventh inning to tie the game before allowing six in the top of the 10th, the second-most runs allowed in an extra inning in franchise history, the most since allowing nine runs in the 11th inning on June 28, 1994 vs. San Diego.
- The Rockies have lost two consecutive games for the second time since June 28 ... lost back to back games July 8 at Seattle and July 10 vs. Arizona before reeling off a season-high seven straight wins.

STAY HOT

- The Rockies are 19-9 since June 19, a .679 winning percentage that is the best in the NL and the third-best in MLB ... have won 15 of their last 20 games since June 28.
- With last night's loss in this two-game series, the Rockies streak of six consecutive series wins was snapped ... it was their longest series winning streak since 2014 and the first time in franchise history that they won six consecutive series against teams at or above .500.
- Of the 20 series remaining in the Rockies season, 16 are against teams currently at or above .500, including each of the next eight series.

GO LOW

- Since June 19, the Rockies have posted a 3.81 team ERA (248.1 IP, 105 ER), the fourth-lowest ERA in the National League.
- Rockies starters have a 3.71 ERA (165.0 IP, 68 ER) over that span, fourth lowest in the NL ... have surrendered only 14 home runs since June 19, the fewest in the NL.

AND HIGH

- Since June 19, the Rockies rank second in the NL

with 44 home runs and a .279 team batting average ... lead the NL and rank fourth in MLB with 5.71 runs per game over that span.

MARKET CORRECTION

- Since their eight-game home losing streak ended on June 18 the Rockies have gone 12-4 at Coors Field.
- Over that 16-game span, have outscored opponents 105-67 ... have posted a 3.79 team ERA over that span, a 3.46 ERA by the starters and a 4.44 ERA by the bullpen.
- Have average 6.6 runs per game while batting .308.

PLAYING WITH JUNIOR

- Colorado is 7-5 in Interleague play this season, including 4-2 at Coors Field.
- Colorado is 156-194 all-time in Interleague play ... the Rockies are 97-81 at home, 59-113 on the road ... Colorado is 13-11 the past 24 road games vs. the AL, including 3-3 this year.

HOUSTON, WE HAVE TAKE OFF

- The Rockies are playing the Astros for the first time since 2015, when they went 0-4 ... have lost seven straight games overall to Houston dating back to May 29, 2013 ... are 1-8 vs. the Astros since Houston moved to the American League in 2013, including 0-5 at Coors Field.
- Houston relievers Will Harris and Collin McHugh each spent time in the Rockies organization ... Harris was selected by the Rockies in the ninth round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft and spent the 2012 season with the big league club ... McHugh made four starts for the Rockies in 2013 before being claimed off waivers by the Astros in the 2013 offseason.
- Astros Manager A.J. Hinch and Rockies Manager Bud Black were both members of the San Diego Padres from 2010-2014 ... Hinch was the vice president of professional scouting while Black managed the club.

BE IN YOUR SEATS

- Colorado leads the Majors in runs scored in the first inning (82) and also leads MLB in runs allowed in the first frame (88).
- Have hit a Major League-leading 30 home runs in the first inning, while their 25 home runs allowed are tied for the most in MLB ... Nolan Arenado's 11 first-inning home runs and 28 RBI lead MLB.

A NOVEL STORY

- Trevor Story is batting .365 (54-for-148) in 37 games since June 8, the highest batting average in the Major Leagues since that date ... has hit .403 (27-for-67) on the road over that span, which also leads MLB.
- Had his career-best 13-game hitting streak snapped last night, the longest streak by a Rockies player this season.

NORMAL NOLAN

- Nolan Arenado is tied for National League lead with 25 home runs and ranks third with 72 RBI ... also ranks second in slugging percentage (.591), fifth in on-base percentage (.392) and seventh in batting average (.309).

HIT MAN

- Ian Desmond has recorded a hit in 10-straight games, the third-longest active streak in MLB and his longest hitting streak since 2016 (also 10 games).
- In 44 games since June 1, is batting .292 (45-for-154) with a .381 on-base percentage and a .565 slugging percentage ... his .946 OPS over that span ranks 11th in the NL.

IT'S GOOD FOR SOME THINGS

- Kyle Freeland (4.3) and Tyler Anderson (4.1) rank fourth and fifth, respectively, in the National League in Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball Reference*).

SAY GRAY

- Colorado's 2013 first-round pick (third overall) out of the University of Oklahoma will make his first start of the second half the second since his July 14 recall from Triple-A Albuquerque.
- Will make his 19th start of the season, his 10th at home.

WITH A VENGEANCE

- Earned his sixth win of the season his last time out, July 14 vs. Seattle ... was recalled from Triple-A Albuquerque prior to the game.
- Pitched 7.1 innings and allowed one run on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts ... the 7.1 innings of work were his most this season, tied for the second-most of his career (also: May 26, 2016 at Boston), and were the most since his complete-game shutout of San Diego on Sept. 16, 2016.

NEW ACQUAINTANCES

- Will be making his first career start against the Astros, his 10th career Interleague start ... is 5-1 with a 3.42 ERA (55.1 IP, 21 ER) against the American League in his career.
- It will be his fourth Interleague start this season, which will tie his career high from 2016 ... is 2-0 with a 2.79 ERA (19.1 IP, 6 ER), three walks and 23 strikeouts in Interleague play this season.
- Is 3-0 with a 2.49 ERA (25.1 IP, 7 ER), four walks and 26 strikeouts in four career Interleague starts at home.

WOLF DEN

- Is 5-3 with a 5.02 ERA (52.0 IP, 29 ER), 14 walks and 67 strikeouts in nine starts at Coors Field.
- Has tossed at least seven innings and allowed one run in each of his last two starts at Coors Field ... one walk and 18 strikeouts over that span.
- In 36 career starts at Coors Field, has gone 17-7 with a 4.63 ERA (202.1 IP, 104 ER) ... his .708 winning percentage at home is the third-best mark in franchise history (min. 20 starts) ... the Rockies are 21-15 in his home starts.
- In 29 starts at Coors Field since May 13, 2016, has gone 17-6 with a 3.85 ERA (173.0 IP, 74 ER), 42 walks and 190 strikeouts ... the Rockies have gone 19-10 in his home starts over that span ... in his first seven career starts at home prior to that span, went 0-1 with a 9.20 ERA (29.1 IP, 30 ER).

OUT ON THE PROWL

- Has made eight starts on the road in 2018, going 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA (47.1 IP, 31 ER), 16 walks and 58 strikeouts.
- Overall, in 40 starts on the road, has gone 11-16 with a 4.67 ERA (216.0 IP, 112 ER), 82 walks and 245 strikeouts ... Rockies are 14-26 in those games.

RADIOACTIVE

- Made two starts with Triple-A Albuquerque after being optioned on June 29, going 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (10.2 IP, 4 ER), four walks and 13 strikeouts ... allowed four hits and one home run.
- Won his first start, July 3 at El Paso, after pitching six innings and allowing two runs on two hits with no walks and six strikeouts ... held the Chihuahuas hitless in five innings before allowing a leadoff single in the sixth ... also surrendered a two-run home run in the sixth inning.
- Last start came on July 8 vs. Tacoma, the Mariners' Triple-A affiliate ... pitched 4.2 innings and allowed three runs (two earned) on five hits with four walks and seven strikeouts in the Isotopes 8-6 loss.

TAKE A WHIFF

- His strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.17 ranks ninth in the National League (min. 90 IP) ... has struck out 125 while walking 30 ... ranks tied for sixth in the NL with 125 strikeouts and second with 11.33 strikeouts per nine innings (min. 90 IP).
- Struck out his 100th batter June 17, his 15th start of the season ... it was the quickest a Rockies starter reached 100 strikeouts in franchise history.

FAN MAN

- Is the only pitcher in franchise history to have three games of 12 or more strikeouts ... has three games in his career with double-digit strikeouts and no walks, tied for the most such games in franchise history (also: Jorge De La Rosa, Pedro Astacio) ... in franchise history, only Pedro Astacio (15) has more games with 10-plus strikeouts.

PRINCE OF PUNCHIES

- His 462 career strikeouts are ninth in franchise history, nine from passing Brian Fuentes (470) for eighth ... ranks eighth among all-time Rockies starters in strikeouts.
- His 9.94 strikeouts per nine innings and 3.47 strikeout to walk ratio are the best in franchise history among pitchers with at least 20 starts.

OPEN A CAN

- Started for the Rockies on Opening Day in Arizona on March 29, and joined Kevin Ritz (1996-97), Darryl Kile (1998-99), Mike Hampton (2001-02) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010-11) as the only Rockies starting pitchers to make consecutive Opening Day starts ... also started Opening Day at Milwaukee in 2017 ... Jason Jennings (2003, 2006), Aaron Cook (2007, 2009) and Jorge De La Rosa (2014, 2016) all made two Opening Day starts but not in consecutive years.

The 25-year-old left-hander will make his 21st start of the season, his third Interleague start and his first career start against Oakland ... is 8-6 with a 3.28 ERA (120.2 IP, 44 ER), 14 walks and 95 strikeouts on the season, 5-2 with a 2.76 ERA (49.0 IP, 15 ER) 18 walks and 41 strikeouts in eight starts at Coors Field ... his 12 quality starts are tied for fifth in the National League ... has faced American League teams this season at Texas and at Seattle, not yet at home ... in Interleague play this season, has no record with a 2.25 ERA (12.0 IP, 3 ER), five walks and seven strikeouts ... the Rockies have won each of his last four starts.
