• The Colorado Rockies are 1-1 on this two-team, seven-game homestand before the All-Star break ... play the Reds tonight and tomorrow and then face the Chicago White Sox for three games.

• According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Colorado is the first team in history to have four rookies win at least five games prior to the All-Star break.
• Four Rockies rookies (Kyle Freeland, Jeff Hoffman, German Márquez and Antonio Senzatela) have started 53 of 87 games, going 27-15 with a 4.34 ERA (304.2 IP, 147 ER).

• Colorado is 49-37 and has a .570 winning percentage, the fourth-best percentage in the NL.
• The Rockies have the most wins in franchise history and the best winning percentage through 86 games (previous best was 48-38, a .558 percentage, in both 1995 and 2010).

• Over the past two weeks since June 21, the Rockies have dropped 11 of 13 games ... batting .226 (102-for-452) over that stretch, while hitting .206 (21-for-102) with runners in scoring position ... have posted a team ERA of 6.81 (115.0 IP, 87 ER) with starters at 7.89 (67.1 IP, 59 ER) and relievers at 5.29 (47.2 IP, 28 ER).

• The Rockies continue their season series against the Cincinnati Reds with the sixth of seven games.
• Went 2-1 over their three-game series in Cincinnati, May 19-21.
• Last season, the Rockies went 2-5 against Cincinnati, their first time losing the season series against the Reds since 2012 (1-5).
• Colorado has won 17 of the past 31 meetings vs. the Reds since 2013, including eight of 15 in Cincinnati and nine of 16 at Coors Field.
• Carlos González is a lifetime .317 hitter (57-for-180) vs. the Reds (average ranks ninth all-time against the Reds among active players) with 16 home runs and 41 RBI ... since 2015, has multiple hits in 10 of 17 games overall and has hit .385 (25-for-65) with 19 runs, five doubles, eight home runs, 19 RBI and 10 walks.
• Nolan Arenado has batted .324 (36-for-111) with nine home runs and 21 RBI over 30 games vs. Cincinnati.
• Ryan Hanigan made his Major League debut for Cincinnati on Sept. 9, 2007, and played parts of seven seasons for the Reds ... batted .262 (355-for-1354) with 128 runs, 48 doubles, one triple, 20 home runs, 138 RBI, 189 walks and 159 strikeouts in 474 career games.

• The Rockies concluded their three-city, nine-game, 10-day road trip Sunday, going 1-8 ... it was their first 1-8 road trip since having two 1-8 trips in 2005 (April 29- May 8 at Los Angeles-NL, San Diego, Florida; June 14-22 at Cleveland, Baltimore, Houston).
• Batted .211 (67-for-317) with nine extra-base hits (268 slugging) ... batted .217 (15-for-69) with runners in scoring position ... the Rockies averaged 2.9 runs scored per game.
• Starting pitchers posted a 6.41 ERA (46.1 IP, 33 ER) and a 1-5 record, while relievers went 0-3 with a 4.68 ERA (32.2 IP, 17 ER) ... the Rockies issued 40 walks, for an average of 4.56 walks-per-nine innings.

• Greg Holland's 27 saves are the most in franchise history prior to the All-Star break.

• Outfielder Charlie Blackmon will participate in the 2017 Home Run Derby ... he will be the 11th Rockies player to participate in the derby, joining Carlos González (2016, 2012), Justin Morneau (2014), Troy Tulowitzki (2014), Michael Cuddyer (2013), Matt Holliday (2007), Todd Helton (2001), Larry Walker (1999, 1997), Vinny Castilla (1998), Ellis Burks (1996) and Dante Bichette (1994).
• Blackmon's 18 home run are tied for the 14-most in the National League.
• He currently leads the Major Leagues in hits (108) and triples (10) and ranks tied for third in runs (67) ... ranks sixth in the National League in slugging percentage (.575).

• Major League Baseball announced Sunday that Nolan Arenado and Charlie Blackmon were voted by the fans as starters for the National League for the 2017 All-Star Game ... Greg Holland and DJ LeMahieu were selected by player and coach balloting.
• Arenado (2015-16) and Holland (2013-14 with Kansas City) are on their third All-Star rosters, while Blackmon (2014) and LeMahieu (2016) are on their second.
• Arenado is the sixth Rockies player to be named an All-Star in three consecutive seasons, joining Dante Bichette (1994-96), Larry Walker (1997-99), Todd Helton (2000-02), Brian Fuentes (2005-07) and Troy Tulowitzki (2013-15).
• It is the first time that the Rockies have sent four All-Stars ... have sent three seven times.

• Nolan Arenado concluded the month of June with four triples, which led MLB ... it tied the Rockies franchise record for the month of June (fourth time, last: Carlos González, June 2013) ... now has five triples on the season, one short of his career high of six set last season.
• For the season, Arenado leads Major League Baseball in extra-base hits (47), is second in doubles (27) and ranks tied for fourth in RBI (62).

• The Rockies are 26-21 away from Denver, tied for the most road wins in the National League ... the Rockies have only had one winning record away from Denver in a season, going 41-40 in 2009.

• Raimel Tapia is batting .393 (11-for-28) over his past eight games ... hitting .313 (26-for-83) over the season in 32 games ... his batting average ranks fourth among all rookie hitters with 30 or more games.

• Rockies prospects Ryan McMahon (third base) and Brendan Rodgers (shortstop) have been named to the 2017 Futures Game roster.
• McMahon is batting .355 (111-for-313) with 51 runs, 30 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 61 RBI, 29 walks and 11 stolen bases in 80 games across Double-A (49 games) and Triple-A (31 games).
• Rodgers is batting .372 (93-for-250) with 48 runs scored, 21 doubles, three triples, 12 home runs, 49 RBI, seven walks and two stolen bases in 59 games across High-A (48 games) and Double-A (11 games).

BACK WHERE YOU BELONG

- Colorado's 2013 first-round draft pick, out of the University of Oklahoma.
- Returned to the rotation on June 30 after being put on the 10-day disabled list on April 14 with a broken bone in his left foot.
- 25-year-old was active on an Opening Day roster for the first time in his career after beginning 2016 on the 15-day disabled list with an abdominal strain.
- Ranked second among Rockies starters in 2016 with 16 quality starts (Chad Bettis with 17) ... the 16 quality starts were a Rockies single-season rookie record.

LAST TIME OUT

- Was reinstated from the disabled list (broken bone, left foot) and made his first start since April 13 ... faced the Arizona Diamondbacks at Chase Field and earned the win, snapping the Rockies' eight-game losing streak.
- Pitched a season-high six innings, allowing two runs on seven hits with one walk and a season-high 10 strikeouts ... allowed one home run.
- It was his seventh career game with at least 10 strikeouts, passing Jorge De La Rosa for the most 10-strikeout games in franchise history.

REDLEGS

- Has made one career start against Cincinnati, May 31, 2016 at Coors Field ... pitched six innings allowing three runs (two earned) on four hits with three walks and four strikeouts ... allowed two home runs (Votto, Bruce) in a 17-4 Rockies win.

OUR DAYS HAVE BEEN GRAY WITHOUT YOU

- Made three starts in April, but did not figure in any of the three Rockies wins April 3 at Milwaukee, April 8 vs. Los Angeles-NL and April 13 at San Francisco.
- Opponents hit .244 (11-for-45) ... allowed a home run to the Dodgers.
- Did not get a decision in any of his three Minor League rehab appearances (1.35 ERA, 13.1 IP, 2 ER) ... pitched for High-A Lancaster on June 14 (4.0,4,0,0,1,5) ... pitched twice for Triple-A Albuquerque June 19 and June 24 ... combined to pitch 9.1 innings, allowing 10 hits and 6 runs (two earned) with five walks and 13 strikeouts.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Will be making his second start at home this season ... last home start was April 8 against Los Angeles-NL ... did not factor in the 4-3 Rockies win, after allowing one run over 5.1 innings of work.
- In 20 career starts at Coors Field, is 7-3 with a 4.92 ERA (109.2 IP, 60 ER), 27 walks and 110 strikeouts.

PRINCE OF PUNCHIES

- Surpassed Manny Corpas for 30th all-time in Colorado history with 244 strikeouts.
- Set a Rockies rookie franchise record with 185 strikeouts in 2016.
- Pitched his first career complete-game shutout Sept. 17 vs. San Diego, allowing four hits and no walks with a Rockies and Coors Field record 16 strikeouts ... struck out six batters in succession between the second and third innings to set a record for the most consecutive strikeouts for a Rockies pitcher ... he struck out four batters in the second inning, the fourth time in Rockies history that four opponents struck out in one inning.
- With his 10 strikeouts at San Diego May 2, 2016, became the first Colorado rookie to have multiple games in which he struck out 10 or more batters ... struck out 10 or more batters in six starts, the second-most 10-plus strikeout games in a single season in Rockies history ... only Pedro Astacio had more games in a season (seven in 2000) ... became the first Rockies rookie with multiple games of 10 or more strikeouts in franchise history.
- Combined for 26 strikeouts between Sept. 17 vs. San Diego and Sept. 23 at Los Angeles-NL to set a new franchise record for strikeouts over two consecutive games.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- Is 1-0 with a 4.85 ERA (13.0 IP, 7 ER), five walks and 18 strikeouts in two starts on the road this season.
- In 22 career road starts, is 4-9 with a 4.53 ERA (117.1 IP, 59 ER), 54 walks and 134 strikeouts.

OPENING DAY

- Made his first career Opening Day start on April 4 at Milwaukee, getting the no decision in a 7-5 Rockies win.
- Allowed six hits and five runs with two walks and seven strikeouts.
- Pitched four scoreless innings until allowing five runs in the fifth inning before getting pulled.

GET THROUGH THE FIRST TWO

- A total of 43 of his 92 runs allowed in 2016 were scored in the first two innings, 21 in the first and 22 in the second.
- For his career, has allowed 62 runs combined in the first two innings, 30 in the first and 32 in the second toward a total of 126 career runs.

BOOMER SOONER

- Made his Major League debut Aug. 4, 2015 vs. Seattle at Coors Field ... pitched four innings, allowing three runs, two earned, on five hits ... walked two and struck out four.
- Chandler, Okla., native played at the University of Oklahoma, where he was an All-American ... played one season at Eastern Oklahoma State College before transferring to OU.
- Fourth season in professional baseball ... was previously drafted by the Kansas City Royals in the 13th round in 2010 and the New York Yankees in 2011.
