THIS IS THE END (OF THE FIRST HALF)

- The Colorado Rockies are 3-3 on this two-team, seven-game homestand before the All-Star break ... concluding the first half of the season with this three-game series vs. the Chicago White Sox (1-1).
- With a win today, the Rockies would capture their first series since sweeping San Francisco in four games, June 15-18 at Coors Field.
- After the four-day All-Star break, the Rockies visit the New York Mets next Friday-Sunday ... Colorado returns home Monday, July 17 for a six-game homestand vs. the San Diego Padres and Pittsburgh Pirates.

TOUGH SLEDDING

- The Rockies are 4-13 the past 17 games, batting .241 (141-for-585) with a .248 average (33-for-133) with runners in scoring position ... pitchers have a 6.20 ERA (151.0 IP, 104 ER) that span ... starters have a 6.87 ERA (93.0 IP, 71 ER), going 4-9, while relievers are 0-4 with saves in three of five opportunities and a 5.12 ERA (58.0 IP, 33 ER).

THINK BIG

- Colorado is 51-39 and has a .567 winning percentage, the fourth-best percentage in the NL.
- The Rockies have the most wins in franchise history and the best winning percentage through 90 games (previous best was 49-41, a .544 percentage, in 2010, 2009 and 1995).
- Recorded their 50th win in their 87th game of the season Wednesday ... that is the fewest games it has taken for the team to reach the 50 win plateau in franchise history (previous: 91st game, 1995 and 2010).

SOUTH SIDERS

- The Rockies are playing the Chicago White Sox for the first time since 2014 and the only time this season.
- Are 6-8 all time vs. the White Sox, 4-7 at home ... took two of three from Chicago at Coors Field in 2014.
- White Sox Manager Rick Renner served as a coach and bench coach under Rockies Manager Bud Black in San Diego from 2008-13.
- This is the Rockies' fifth Interleague series of the season, their third at home ... are 6-5 in

Interleague play, 3-3 at Coors Field ... it is the first three-game Interleague series at Coors Field this season after hosting the Seattle Mariners and Cleveland Indians for two games apiece.

- Carlos González is a career .318 (170-for-535) hitter in Interleague play, tied for the eight-highest average among active hitters ... at Coors Field in Interleague, has batted .356 (101-for-284) with 21 home runs and 61 RBI.

ARE ROOKIE CARDS STILL A THING?

- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Colorado is the first team in history to have four rookies win at least five games prior to the All-Star break.
- Four Rockies rookies (Kyle Freeland, Jeff Hoffman, German Márquez and Antonio Senzatela) have started 55 of 90 games, going 28-15 with a 4.32 ERA (325.0 IP, 156 ER).

FLYING DUTCHMAN

- Greg Holland's 28 saves are the most in Major League Baseball and the franchise history prior to the All-Star break.

DERBY DAY

- Outfielder Charlie Blackmon will participate in the 2017 Home Run Derby on Monday ... he will be the 11th Rockies player to participate in the derby, joining Carlos González (2016, 2012), Justin Morneau (2014), Troy Tulowitzki (2014), Michael Cuddyer (2013), Matt Holliday (2007), Todd Helton (2001), Larry Walker (1999, 1997), Vinny Castilla (1998), Ellis Burks (1996) and Dante Bichette (1994).
- Blackmon is riding a seven-game hitting streak (414; 12-for-29) ... is batting .364 (12-for-33) in July.
- He currently leads the Major Leagues in hits (116) and triples (10) and ranks fourth in runs (71) ... ranks sixth in the National League in slugging percentage (.579).
- Hit his 19th home run of the season Friday ... he is the first player since Jose Reyes in 2008 to have double-digit totals in doubles (17), triples (10) and home runs (19) prior to the All-Star break.

CELESTIAL

- Major League Baseball announced Sunday that Nolan Arenado and Charlie Blackmon were voted by the fans as starters for the National League for the 2017 All-Star Game ... Greg Holland and DJ LeMahieu were selected by player and coach balloting.
- All three position player All-Stars hit home runs last night.
- Arenado (2015-16) and Holland (2013-14 with Kansas City) are on their third All-Star rosters, while Blackmon (2014) and LeMahieu (2015) are on their second.
- Arenado is the sixth Rockies player to be named an All-Star in three consecutive seasons, joining Dante Bichette (1994-96), Larry Walker (1997-99), Todd Helton (2000-02), Brian Fuentes (2005-07) and Troy Tulowitzki (2013-15).
- It is the first time that the Rockies have sent four All-Stars ... have sent three seven times.

MUCHO SWAGGER

- Rookie Raimel Tapia is batting .390 (16-for-41) since June 26, hitting safely in nine of 12 games ... hitting .323 (31-for-96) on the season in 36 games ... his batting average ranks third among all rookies with 100 or plate appearances.
- Tapia is batting .422 (19-for-45) in 17 home games.

GOOD LUCK TODAY

- Rockies prospects Ryan McMahon (third base) and Brendan Rodgers (shortstop) will play in the 2017 Futures Game in Miami on Sunday.
- McMahon is batting .353 (112-for-317) with 52 runs, 31 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 61 RBI, 29 walks and 11 stolen bases in 81 games across Double-A (49 games) and Triple-A (32 games) ... was named the Pacific Coast League Player of the Month in June, his first month at the Triple-A level.
- Rodgers is batting .365 (96-for-263) with 49 runs scored, 22 doubles, three triples, 13 home runs, 51 RBI, eight walks and two stolen bases in 62 games across High-A (48 games) and Double-A (14 games).

FOR STARTERS

- Making his 18th career Major League start, his ninth at Coors Field and his first against the White Sox.
- Rookie southpaw is a native of Denver who graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School.
- Pitched collegiately at the University of Evansville in Southern Indiana ... drafted by Colorado in the first round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft (eighth overall).
- Invited twice to Major League Spring Training, in 2016 and 2017.

FOR THE FIRST TIME

- Will make his first career start against the Chicago White Sox.
- Is 3-0 in Interleague play this season with a 2.95 ERA (18.1 IP, 6 ER) ... this will be his second Interleague start at Coors Field.

LAST TIME OUT

- Took his third straight loss, July 4 against Cincinnati ... pitched 5.1 innings, allowing five runs on eight hits with two walks and a season-low one strikeout.

NEWSFLASH, HE'S FROM DENVER

- Is 4-4 with a 3.80 ERA (47.1 IP, 20 ER), 16 walks and 30 strikeouts in eight starts at home ... has recorded six quality starts at Coors Field.
- Has allowed one run in two of his last three home starts, five runs in his last.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- Is 4-3 on the road with a 4.35 ERA (51.2 IP, 25 ER) in nine starts.
- Recorded the win in three consecutive road starts from May 16- June 1 ... the Rockies are 6-3 over his eight starts away from Denver.

BIG LEAGUE COFFEE

- Held opponents to one or no runs in seven of his 17 games with a team-leading 10 quality starts ... worked six or more innings 12 times ... Rockies are 10-7 when he pitches.

ROOKIE BALL

- Among Major League rookies, is first in quality starts (10) and innings pitched (99.0) and second in wins (8) to Antonio Senzatela (9) ... also first in road wins among rookies ... as a rookie, ranks second in ERA (4.09) while his opponents' batting average (.283) is third ... ranks eighth in strikeouts (56).

WORM BURNER

- Among all pitchers, ranks fifth in the Majors and third in the National League with a 56.6 ground-ball percentage (184 compared to 71 fly balls).

PITCHERS WHO RAKE

- Is batting .219 (7-for-32) with one double, one home run and one RBI ... the batting average ranks third in the NL among pitchers.
- Over his last eight starts (plus one pinch-hit at-bat), is 5-for-19 (.263) with one double and one home run ... his double and home run both came May 21 at Cincinnati.

I AM NOT A CHILD

- In April, among MLB rookie starting pitchers, was tied for first in wins (along with Antonio Senzatela), ranked second in ERA and ranked third in innings pitched.

NOTHING LIKE THE FIRST TIME

- Earned his first Major League win and recorded his first Major League hit in his Major League debut in the Rockies Home Opener on April 7 vs. the Dodgers, a 2-1 Rockies win ... pitched six innings, allowing one run on four hits with two walks and six strikeouts.
- Made his Major League debut after having pitched in 45 professional games, all starts, since 2014.
- Became the first starting pitcher to make his Major League debut in his hometown in his club's home opener since Chuck Dobson did so on April 19, 1966 as a member of the Kansas City Athletics.

PURPLE ACE

- Signed with the Rockies on June 10, 2014 ... was ranked as the No. 7 overall prospect in the Draft ... was the fifth player to be drafted in the history of the University of Evansville, the third to go in the first round.
- Originally drafted by Philadelphia out of Thomas Jefferson High School in Denver ... in the 35th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft, but did not sign.
- Said he grew up idolizing Larry Walker and Todd Helton ... set the Colorado state high school record for strikeouts with 145 in 2011.
- With the Purple Aces in 2014, went 10-2 with a 1.90 ERA and 128 strikeouts.
- Selected to the Louisville Slugger All-America Third Team and named a semifinalist for the Golden Spikes Award, presented to the top amateur player in the United States.

 • Recorded a season-high five RBI Friday, his fifth career game of five or more RBI.
 • Leads MLB with 70 RBI ... ranks tied for second in MLB, tied for first in NL with 28 doubles ... his .415 (39-for-94) average against left-handed pitchers ranks third in the Majors.
 • Batted .324 in June (36-for-111) with 27 RBI, which tied for second in the MLB in June.
