HUMIDITY IS BAD

- The Colorado Rockies return to Coors Field for a seven-day, seven-game homestand vs. the Atlanta Braves (Monday-Thursday) and Milwaukee Brewers (Friday-Sunday).
- The Rockies lost yesterday's series finale at Marlins Park 5-3 ... were swept for the fifth time this season and for the first time by the Marlins since 2006 ... finished the road trip to Cleveland and Miami 1-4, dropping their road record to 30-31 ... it is the first time this season the Rockies have dropped below .500 on the road.

WELcomed BACK CHAD

- Rockies pitcher Chad Bettis will make his first start of the season tonight against Atlanta after recovering from a testicular cancer diagnoses that he received last offseason ... underwent surgery last fall and continued treatments throughout the season until his final treatment on May 16.
- Made his first rehab start July 13 at Double-A Hartford ... was reinstated from the 60-day DL and optioned to Triple-A on Aug. 4 ... in six starts, five games between Double-A and Triple-A, went 0-3 with a 4.24 ERA (23.1 IP, 11 ER).
- Went 14-8 with a 4.79 ERA (186.0 IP, 99 ER) across 32 starts in 2016 ... set career highs in wins, starts, innings and strikeouts.

GROOVE

- The Rockies will honor their inaugural manager, Don Baylor, tonight in a pregame ceremony ... Baylor passed away last Monday at the age of 68.
- Baylor managed the Rockies from 1993 through the 1998 season, guiding them to three winning seasons from 1995-97 ... he was named the NL Manager of the Year in 1995 after leading the Rockies to their first playoff berth as the NL Wild Card team in their third year of existence.
- Baylor returned to the Rockies in 2009 as the club's hitting coach, a role he would serve in through the 2010 season.
- Across his two stints, Baylor was a member of five of the Rockies' eight winning seasons in franchise history.

NAIL BITERS

- Over the last 16 games, the Rockies have played 13 games that have been decided by three or fewer runs, including each of the last nine games ... seven of the 16 games have been one-run games with two walk-off wins and two walk-off losses.

LITTLE SHAMPOO BOTTLES

- Colorado is 30-31 on the road having dropped 20 of their past 26 road games since they took three of four from the Cubs June 8-11 ... have lost seven of nine road series over that span ... were 9-0 with two ties in road series prior to the past nine road series.
- Have averaged 3.5 runs per game over those 26 games, scoring three runs or fewer 18 times (1-18 in those games) ... have batted .235 overall and .213 with runners in scoring position over the 26-game span.
- Rockies starters have posted a 6.19 ERA with six quality starts over the last 26 road games ... relievers have logged a 4.55 ERA.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH

- The Rockies are 35-21 (.625) at home, the third-best home winning percentage in the NL ... are 12-4-2 in home series this season ... are 14-4 in the first game of a series at home.
- Since starting 7-7 at home, the Rockies are 28-14 at Coors Field since May 6, outscoring opponents 269-211.

TOP OF THE ORDER AND THE CHARTS

- Charlie Blackmon leads the Majors in runs (106), triples (13), multi-hit games (51) and total bases (291) ... ranks second in MLB, first in the National League, with 159 hits.
- He ranks second in the NL in batting average (.335), fourth in slugging percentage (.614) and tied for seventh in home runs (27) ... his 74 RBI are the most among MLB leadoff hitters, 27 home runs rank second.
- Since July 1, Blackmon has batted .382 (55-for-144) over 35 game, the second-highest average in MLB and the highest average in the NL.

CHOP YOU DOWN

- The Rockies are facing the Atlanta Braves for the first time this season ... Colorado is 76-116 all-time vs. Atlanta, 47-52 in Denver and 29-64 in Atlanta.
- Colorado has taken six of seven games from the Braves each of the last two seasons and is 14-2 vs. Atlanta over their last 16 games since June 11, 2014 ... Rockies pitchers have posted a 2.65 ERA against Atlanta over that span.
- Colorado has swept Atlanta in four games at Coors Field each of the last two seasons and have won a franchise record 10 consecutive games against the Braves at Coors Field dating back to June 11, 2014 ... have outscored Atlanta 68-28 over that span.

CLUTCH GENE

- Nolan Arenado recorded his 100th RBI of the season last Friday with a two-run home run ... for each of the last three seasons, he has been the first player in the NL to reach the 100-RBI plateau, becoming the first player to reach 100 RBI first in the league in three straight seasons since Pittsburgh's Willie Stargell, 1971-73, according to Elias ... is also the first Major Leaguer to reach 100 RBI by Aug. 11 since Miguel Cabrera and Chris Davis in 2013, and the first NL player to do so since Albert Pujols in 2009.
- Leads the Major Leagues with 100 RBI and ranks second with 66 extra-base hits ... ranks third with 265 total bases and fourth with 141 hits ... eighth in NL in batting average (.311) ... he ranks among NL position players with 5.2 bWAR.
- Arenado has recorded three walk-off RBI this season and leads the Majors with 16 game-winning RBI.
- Arenado is batting a Major League-leading .439 (50-for-114) with runners in scoring position with 13 doubles, three triples and 10 home runs; a .868 slugging percentage that leads MLB.

PURPLE RAIN

- At 65-52 (.556), the Rockies have the best record in club history through 116 games ... the previous best at 117 games was 64-53 (.547) in 2009.
- The Rockies are tied with the Arizona Diamondbacks (65-52) for the first Wild Card spot, 4.5 games ahead of the St. Louis Cardinals.

GOOD COMPANY

- Nolan Arenado (66) and Charlie Blackmon (65) currently rank second and third in the Major Leagues in extra-base hits behind Giancarlo Stanton ... per Elias, the only other pairs of teammates to finish the season ranked first and second in the Majors in extra-base hits were Tony Armas and Dwight Evans for the 1984 Boston Red Sox and Lou Gehrig and Babe Ruth for the 1926 and 1927 Yankees.

PARRA FOR THE COURSE

- Since coming off the disabled list July 7, Gerardo Parra is second in the NL behind Charlie Blackmon (.400) with a .385 batting average (40-for-104), while hitting safely in 22 of 27 games.

SINCE MID-JUNE, NO SWOON

- Since June 15, DJ LeMahieu (.364), Charlie Blackmon (.350) and Nolan Arenado (.349) ranks first, second and third in the National League in batting average.

THIS ONE IS SPECIAL

- Will be making his first Major League start of the season after recovering from a testicular cancer diagnosis that he received last offseason ... underwent surgery last fall and continued treatments throughout this season.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 26, sent to Double-A Hartford to begin rehab July 13, and was reinstated from the 60-day DL and optioned to Triple-A Albuquerque Aug. 4.
- Pitched in one official Spring Training game this year, March 5 at Milwaukee, and allowed one run on one hit with two strikeouts in two innings of work.

THE ROAD BACK

- Began his rehab stint July 13 at Double-A Hartford ... in six starts, five games, between Hartford and Triple-A Albuquerque, went 0-3 with a 4.24 ERA (23.1 IP, 11 ER), seven walks and 17 strikeouts.

PICK IT UP

- The Lubbock, Texas, native went 14-8 with a 4.79 ERA (186.0 IP, 99 ER), 59 walks and 138 strikeouts in 2016 ... set single-season career highs in wins, starts, innings and strikeouts.
- Is 12-17 with a 4.62 ERA (338.2 IP, 174 ER) in 60 Major League starts ... 1-2 with a 9.09 ERA (31.2 IP, 32 ER) in 29 relief outings.
- A starter since May 14, 2015 after being used primarily as a reliever in 2014 ... made 29 relief appearances from Sept. 11, 2013 to July 28, 2014 between starts (Sept. 9, 2013 and May 14, 2015).

BRAVERY

- Has made five career starts and one relief appearance against Atlanta, and is 3-1 with a 4.75 ERA (30.1 IP, 16 ER), 19 walks and 24 strikeouts.
- Faced the Braves twice in 2016 and went 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA (13.1 IP, 4 ER), six walks and 11 strikeouts ... both starts were quality.

YOU BELONG HERE

- Went 8-2 in 14 starts at Coors Field last season, posting a 4.44 ERA (81.0 IP, 40 ER) with seven quality starts ... worked six or more innings nine times.
- The Rockies have won each of his past 10 starts at Coors Field dating back to June 9, 2016 ... is 7-0 at home since then with six quality starts and a 3.92 ERA (57.1 IP, 25 ER) ... has allowed five home runs.
- Is 12-6 with a 4.81 ERA (159.0 IP, 85 ER) in 28 career starts at Coors Field ... is 1-1 with a 11.51 ERA (20.1 IP, 26 ER) in 18 relief appearances in Denver.

BACK ON THE BUS

- In 2016, went 6-6 on the road with a 5.06 ERA (105.0 IP, 59 ER) in 18 road games, which included 10 quality starts ... is 10-11 with a 4.46 ERA (179.2 IP, 89 ER) in 32 career road starts.
- Allowed 15 of his 21 home runs last year on the road.
- Pitched at least six innings in 12 of his 18 road starts in 2016.

GUNS UP

- Missed the entire 2012 season due to a right shoulder injury.
- Drafted in the second round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft, during his junior season out of Texas Tech ... was rated as the 33rd-best player in the draft by *Baseball America*.
- Attended Monterey High School in Lubbock ... was named to the all-region team before his senior season ... drafted by Houston in the eighth round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft, but did not sign ... Rockies selected him in the second round, with the 76th overall selection, in the 2010 draft.
