- The Colorado Rockies will conclude their brief two-game series in Cleveland today, looking for a series split ... will travel to Miami post-game and have an off-day on Thursday before beginning a three-game series (Aug. 11-13) to conclude the road trip.
- The Rockies held on to a 1-0 lead over the Indians last night until forfeiting it with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning ... would then lose on a walk-off three-run home run.
- Lost the final game of their three-game series against Philadelphia Sunday after blowing the save, and have now lost back-to-back games in which they took a lead into the ninth inning for the first time since Aug. 21-22, 2013 at Philadelphia ... were 59-0 when taking a lead into the ninth inning prior to Sunday's loss ... the 59-0 record to start the season was the longest in club history (previous: 47 straight wins when leading after eight innings in 1995).

APPETITE FOR DESTRUCTION

- Nolan Arenado hit his 25th home run of the season Friday, a game-tying home run in the seventh inning.
- He also recorded both of the Rockies walk-off RBI last week, Aug. 1 & 3 vs. the New York Mets ... he now has three walk-off RBI this season, tied for the Rockies single-season franchise record (also: Dante Bichette in 1996, Jeff Cirillo in 2001).
- Arenado now has six walk-off RBI in his career, tied for the fourth-most in franchise history (Dante Bichette and Todd Helton lead with nine).
- He leads the Majors with 16 game-winning RBI ... since debuting in 2013, Arenado's 72 game-winning RBI are the most in the National League.
- Arenado is batting a Major League-leading .441 (49-for-111) with runners in scoring position with 13 doubles, three triples and nine home runs, a .856 slugging percentage that leads MLB.
- With runners in scoring position and two outs, Arenado is batting .409 (18-for-44), sixth in the NL, with a Major League-leading 28 RBI.
- Arenado ranks third in MLB in Win Probability Added (3.70), which credits or debits a player based on how much their action increased or decreased their team's odds of winning.

RIDE THE LIGHTNING

- Arenado leads the Major Leagues with 98 RBI and 65 extra-base hits, ranks second with 259 total

bases and fourth with 138 hits.

SECOND HELPING

- In 22 games since the All-Star break, the Rockies are 12-10 ... over that span they lead the National League in runs (133), batting average (.296 and on-base percentage (.357) and are second in slugging percentage (.494).
- Among National League second-half batting average leaders, Gerardo Parra ranks second (.397), Charlie Blackmon ranks third (.389), Nolan Arenado ranks sixth (.372) and DJ LeMahieu ranks seventh (.368).
- Blackmon leads the Majors with 29 runs scored ... Arenado is tied for second in the Majors with 28 RBI.

PURPLE RAIN

- At 64-49 (.566), the Rockies have the best record in club history through 113 games ... the previous best at 113 games was 62-10 (.549) in 2009.
- The Rockies currently sit a half game behind the Arizona Diamondbacks (64-48) for the first Wild Card and six games ahead of Milwaukee.

Vs.

- The Rockies are facing the Cleveland Indians for the second time this season ... swept the Indians in two games at Coors Field June 6-7, outscoring the Indians 19-4.
- Colorado is 12-12 all-time vs. Cleveland, 9-2 at Coors Field and 3-10 in Cleveland ... the Rockies were swept by the Indians in three games in their last visit here, May 30-June 1, 2014 ... all three games in 2014 were decided by two runs or fewer.
- Bud Black played parts of four seasons with Cleveland, beginning with a stint from 1988-1990 and then a final season in 1995 before retiring ... went 29-26 with a 3.93 ERA.
- Following his retirement as a player, Black spent four years in the Indians organization, three as a special assistant to the general manager (1996-97, 1999) and one as a pitching coach with Triple-A Buffalo (1998).

BRINGING IT ALL BACK HOME

- The Rockies are 35-21 (.625) at home, the third-best home winning percentage in the NL ... are 12-4-2 in home series this season ... are 14-4 in the first game of a series at home.
- Since starting 7-7 at home, the Rockies are 28-14 at Coors Field since May 6, outscoring opponents 269-211.

CAN'T BUY A THRILL

- Colorado is 29-28 on the road overall but has dropped 18 of its past 23 road games since June 11 ... the Rockies won their last road series, in Washington July 29-30, snapping a six-series road losing streak dating back to June 12-14 ... were 9-0 with two ties in road series prior to the slide.
- Have hit .230 overall and .237 with runners in scoring position over their past 23 road games ... Rockies starters have posted a 6.27 ERA with six quality starts while averaging fewer than five innings per start ... relievers have logged a 4.93 ERA.

ALL SUMMER LONG

- Nolan Arenado (65) and Charlie Blackmon (63) currently rank first and second in the Major Leagues in extra-base hits ... per Elias, the only other pairs of teammates to finish the season ranked first and second in the Majors in extra-base hits were Tony Armas and Dwight Evans for the 1984 Boston Red Sox and Lou Gehrig and Babe Ruth for the 1926 and 1927 Yankees.

BACK IN BLACK

- Since coming off the disabled list on July 7, Gerardo Parra leads the National League with a .407 batting average (35-for-86) while hitting safely in 19 of 23 games.

HELLO NASTY

- Charlie Blackmon leads the Majors in runs (101), triples (13), multi-hit games (49) and total bases (279) ... ranks second in MLB, first in the National League, with 151 hits.
- He ranks third in the National League in batting average (.330), fourth in slugging percentage (.611) and tied for sixth in home runs (26).

A QUIET STORM

- DJ LeMahieu ranks seventh in the NL in batting average (.318) ... has hit .390 since June 15, going 57-for-147, the second-highest average in the Majors over that span and the highest in the NL.

GRANDE LIGAS

- The 22-year old right-handed pitcher made his first Opening Day roster and made his Major League debut on April 6 vs. the Milwaukee Brewers at Miller Park.
- His 10 wins rank second among all Major League rookie pitchers, ... Kyle Freeland ranks first with 11 and German Márquez ranks third with nine ... he is the sixth Rockies rookie to reach the 10-win plateau.
- Was signed as a non-drafted international free agent on July 8, 2011 ... signed by Rockies scouts Rolando Fernandez, Orlando Medina and Carlos Gomez.

LAST TIME OUT

- Last made a start July 24 at St. Louis and took the loss after allowing four runs on six hits with two walks and five strikeouts over four innings of work ... the four innings matched his season low as a starter.
- Has made two relief appearances since his most recent start, Aug. 2 vs. New York-NL and Aug. 4 vs. Philadelphia ... pitched three scoreless innings with one hit and four strikeouts against the Mets, and allowed two runs on three hits with one walk and no strikeouts in two innings of work against Philadelphia.

BIG PICTURE

- Is 10-4 with a 4.78 ERA (107.1 IP, 57 ER) in 22 games, 17 starts ... 10-4 with a 4.99 ERA (97.1 IP, 54 ER) as a starter ... in relief, has no record and a 2.70 ERA (10.0 IP, 3 ER) with four walks and nine strikeouts.

TRIBAL

- Will be making his second start against Cleveland ... faced them June 6 in Denver and earned the win after holding them to three runs on six hits with one walk and four strikeouts in six innings pitched.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- In seven starts on the road, is 2-2 with a 5.25 ERA (36.0 IP, 21 ER), 38 hits, 14 walks and 34 strikeouts ... the Rockies are 3-4 when he starts on the road.
- Has made two road relief appearances (4.0 IP, 0 ER).
- Allowed only four home runs on the road, 13 at home.

IN THE CITY, CITY OF DENVER

- Is 8-2 with a 4.81 ERA (67.1 IP, 36 ER), 21 walks and 41 strikeouts over 13 games, 11 starts, this season at Coors Field.
- Has pitched six or more innings in seven of his 10 home starts, and logged a season-high eight innings on May 26 ... five quality starts at home.
- Won five consecutive starts at Coors Field May 9-June 16, posting a 4.02 ERA (31.1 IP, 14 ER), eight walks and 22 strikeouts over that span.

THANKS FOR YOUR SUPPORT

- In his 17 starts, the Rockies have scored an average of 8.23 runs per game ... has a total RSA of 7.71, the highest in MLB among pitchers with over 100.0 innings pitched.

ROOKIE OF THE MONTH

- Named the National League Rookie of the Month for April after going 3-1 with a 2.81 ERA.
- Finished the month first among Major League rookie starting pitchers in ERA and innings pitched, tied for first in wins and tied for fourth in strikeouts.
- Pitched seven innings in three consecutive starts, April 11-22 and has yielded three-or-fewer runs in four of his five starts overall.
- Became the second Venezuelan pitcher to earn a win in three of his first four career starts, joining Jeanmar Gomez who accomplished the feat for the Cleveland Indians in 2010.
- Pitched seven innings in three consecutive starts from April 11-22 ... the last Rockies pitcher to toss at least seven innings in four consecutive starts was Jhoulys Chacin in 2013.

DEBUT

- Made his debut April 6 at Milwaukee ... pitched five shutout innings with three walks and six strikeouts ... did not receive a decision in a 2-1 Rockies win.
- Allowed two hits in the bottom of the first inning, the only hits he allowed in the game ... worked out of a bases loaded jam in the first, getting a ground ball double play to end the inning.
- Made the first Major League debut for the Rockies this season ... Kyle Freeland made his debut on April 7 ... it was the first time in franchise history where starting pitchers have made back-to-back MLB debuts.
