### FIGHTIN' FOR IT

- The Rockies continue their final homestand of the 2018 regular season with the third of four games against the Philadelphia Phillies ... will conclude the regular season with a three-game series against Washington beginning on Friday.
- The Rockies are now 0.5 games ahead of St. Louis for the second Wild Card following the Cardinals' loss to Milwaukee last night, and trail Los Angeles-NL by 0.5 games for first place in the NL West following the Dodgers' loss to Arizona last night ... the Rockies are now a season-high 17 games above .500.

### DIVISIVE

- With their sweep of Arizona Sunday, the Rockies concluded their schedule against divisional opponents ... the Rockies went 41-35 vs. the National League West ... last year the Rockies were 42-34 against their division rivals ... the 2007 team was the best in franchise history vs. the West, going 43-30.

### THE HEAVENLY BED

- The Rockies finished their 2018 road slate with a record of 44-37, the most road wins in franchise history ... only two other Colorado teams had won 40 on the road, the 2009 and 2017 clubs, which were both 41-40.
- Colorado's .543 road winning percentage is tied for fourth in the NL and tied for eighth in MLB.

### NEW NORMAL

- Colorado's .554 winning percentage through 157 games (87-70) is the second-highest clip in club history ... the 2009 team was 89-68 (.567) after 157 games en route to a franchise-best 92-70 mark ... that is the only season in which the Rockies have reached 90 wins in franchise history.
- Colorado has played consecutive seasons over .500 for the first time since 2009-10.

### HEAT WAVE

- Since June 28, the Rockies are 49-28, a .636 winning percentage that ranks first in the National League and third in the big leagues.

### FOR STARTERS

- The Rockies' starting pitchers, with a 3.25 ERA (52.2 IP, 19 ER), pitched seven quality starts on the most recent road trip ... Colorado starters worked five or more innings eight times (six or more seven times) and allowed three runs or fewer each game.
- Jon Gray's seven innings of work Monday in which he allowed one run was the fourth consecutive start of seven innings for the Rockies, the second time this season the Rockies have strung together four consecutive starts of seven or more innings.
- Kyle Freeland pitched his 10th consecutive quality start Sunday as he held the Diamondbacks scoreless through seven innings ... he became the third starting pitcher in Rockies history (second this season, German Márquez has an active 11-game streak) to have 10-plus consecutive quality starts within the same season (Ubaldo Jiménez holds the single-season record with 14, set in 2010).

### GO LOW

- The Rockies' starting ERA of 4.22 (900.0 IP, 422 ER) is the third-lowest figure in franchise history, trailing only the 2009 (4.10) and 2010 (4.21) teams ... the team's overall ERA of 4.37 ranks fourth in club history and is the lowest since the 2010 squad posted a franchise-low 4.14 mark.

### A HAIRY STREAKER

- Charlie Blackmon's career-high 17-game hitting streak (.377, 23-for-61) is the longest active string in the Majors and the longest by a Rockies player since David Dahl began his Major League career with a 17-game hitting streak, July 25-Aug. 11, 2016 ... Carlos González has the most recent hitting streak over 17 games, when he hit safely in 19 consecutive games, July 18-Aug. 13, 2016.
- Blackmon has 14 streaks of 10 or more games, including three this year, the third most in club history behind Todd Helton (25) and Larry Walker (17).

### TAURUS

- The 2.61 ERA (76.0 IP, 22 ER) by the bullpen this month ranks second in the National League and in the Majors.
- Colorado's bullpen has recorded a 2.17 ERA (45.2 IP, 11 ER) the past 15 games with an opponents' batting average of .181 (29-for-160).

### CRACK THE BELL

- Colorado are playing their second series of the season against the Phillies, having lost a three-game series 2-1 in Philadelphia, June 12-14 ... went 2-1 against the Phillies at Coors Field last season, and are 10-6 against them in Denver since 2014.
- In 53 games, Carlos González is a lifetime .358 hitter (68-for-190) vs. Philadelphia, the third-best average among active players with 150 or more plate appearances against the Phillies ... has a hit in 16 of his past 20 games (.373, 28-for-75).
- Phillies rookie manager Gabe Kapler played parts of two seasons with the Rockies in 2002-03 ... the outfielder batted .280 (52-for-186) with six doubles, three triples and two home runs across 79 games played.

### GOOD COMPANY

- Charlie Blackmon joins Willie Mays (1954-1965) and Duke Snider (1953-56) as the only NL center fielders to have at least three straight seasons with 100 runs scored and 25 home runs.

### EARTH WIND AND FIRE

- Charlie Blackmon's .364 batting average (32-for-88) in September ranks second in the NL with the center fielder hitting safely in 21 of 23 games.
- Trevor Story is tied for third in the NL this month with seven home runs, despite missing a week of playing time with elbow soreness.

### BETTER HOMES AND ROOFTOPS

- Since an eight-game home losing streak ended June 19, the Rockies are 32-13 at Coors Field (.711), the best home winning percentage in the NL over that span.

### BY A HARE

- The Rockies' 26 one-run wins are third in the NL and tied for fifth in the Majors ... their .634 winning percentage (26-15) is second in the NL and tied for fifth in the big leagues ... the Rockies' .618 winning percentage in one-run decisions since the start of the 2017 season is second in the Majors.
- Colorado's 22 wins in two-run games are the most in the big leagues ... the .688 winning percentage (22-10) leads the NL.

### GO LONG

- The 900.0 innings by Colorado's starters rank second in the NL behind Arizona's 900.2 IP ... their 499.1 relief innings rank last in the NL.

### TUFF ENUFF

- Colorado is 55-41 against teams at or above .500, the most such wins in the Majors.

### BABY COME BACK

- The Rockies' 45 come-from-behind wins are second in the NL (third in the Majors) and the fourth-most in franchise history.

- Has hit safely in five of his last six games (.304; 7-for-23) with one RBI in four of those games.
- Among National League leaders in home runs (34-T2), RBI (105-T2), slugging (.544-4th), runs (99-7th), batting average (.295-11th), on-base percentage (.374-12th), multi-hit games (55-2nd) and extra-base hits (71-6th).
- Since 2014, leads MLB with 559 RBI and tops the NL with 172 home runs.
- Fourth consecutive season with at least 30 home runs and 100 RBI ... fourth Rockie with four such seasons (also: Todd Helton, Vinny Castilla and Larry Walker) and the third with four consecutive years (also: Castilla and Helton) ... the ninth third baseman in MLB history with four such seasons ... also joins Castilla, Chipper Jones and Alex Rodriguez as the fourth third baseman to accomplish the feat in four straight seasons.
- Batting .316 (43-for-136) with RISP ... his .332 career batting average with RISP is fourth among active MLB players.
- Tied for second in NL with 29 go-ahead RBI and leading NL with 19 on the road ... his 122 go-ahead RBI lead the Majors since 2015.
- All-Star for the fourth consecutive season ... starter for the second straight year.

### #19 CHARLIE BLACKMON, of

**Last Game:** 2-3, 2 R, 2B, RBI, BB

**Last Road Trip:** 10-33, 3 R, 3 2B, HR, RBI, 2 HBP, 5 BB, 4 SO

- His career-high 17-game hitting streak the longest active string in MLB and tied for the longest in the National League this season ... the longest for the Rockies since David Dahl recorded a hit in 17 straight in 2016.
- Has 14 career hitting streaks of 10 or more games, including three this year, third-most in club history behind Todd Helton (25) and Larry Walker (17) ... his 13 double-digit hitting streaks since 2015 are the most in MLB.
- Leads the NL with 114 runs, his third straight season with at least 100 runs ... seventh in the NL with a team-high 174 hits ... tied for seventh in the league with 49 multi-hit games.
- His .364 average (32-for-88) ranks third in the NL this month ... hit safely in 21 of 24 games.
- Third straight season with at least 100 runs scored and 25 home runs, the third NL center fielder to accomplish the feat (also: Willie Mays & Duke Snider).
- Leads the National League with 284 multi-hit games since 2013.
- Hitting .343 (48-for-140) since Aug. 17, hitting safely in 30 of 35 games.
- Batting .288 (68-for-236) vs. left-handers, tied for seventh among NL lefty hitters ... his .302 career clip vs. southpaws (317-for-1051) first among active left-handed batters.
- Hit two home runs Sept. 9 vs. the Dodgers, his second multi-home run game of the season (March 31 at Arizona), the 10th of his career ... hit his 30th career leadoff home run, his second of the season (May 1 at Chicago-NL).
- Played in his 900th career game Sept. 10, seventh player in franchise history to reach that mark, the third player drafted by the Rockies (Helton, Tulowitzki) ... his 1,038 hits through 900 games were the fourth-most through 900 games in franchise history, trailing Bichette (1,136), Walker (1,088) and Helton (1,072).
- Hit his first Major League walk-off home run on July 25 vs. Houston in the 3-2 win ... it was his second career walk-off RBI (Sept. 1, 2014 vs. San Francisco).
- Appeared in his third career All-Star game (also: 2014, 2017).

### #16 DREW BUTERA, C

- First hits and RBI as a Rockie Sept. 7 vs. the Dodgers, his fifth multi-hit game of the season (last: Aug. 29 vs. Detroit) ... made five starts with Colorado.
- Acquired along with cash considerations from the Kansas City Royals Aug. 31 in exchange for left-handed pitcher Jerry Vasto ... added to roster Sept. 1 and made his Rockies debut in a start at catcher Sept. 3.
- Batted .188 (28-for-149) with 11 runs, nine doubles, two home runs and 18 RBI for the Royals this year in 51 games, 44 starts ... batted .264 (14-for-53) over 16 games from July 4-Aug. 29.

### #56 NOEL CUEVAS, of

- Is 8-for-27 as a pinch hitter with his .296 average 12th in the NL ... eight pinch hits tied for 12th in the league.
- Has 20 starts in right field, 13 in left, one in center, batting .221 (25-for-113).
- Two-run, pinch-hit, go-ahead single in the eighth inning Sept. 3 vs. San Francisco.
- Recalled Sept. 1 from Triple-A Albuquerque, his second stint on the roster ... originally recalled on April 22 before being optioned on July 29.
- Made his Major League debut April 22 vs. Chicago-NL ... first Major League hit and first career multi-hit game on April 24 vs. San Diego.
- Second career home run and career-high three RBI July 7 at Seattle ... second career three-hit game (also: April 30 at Chicago-NL).
- Game-winning RBI as a pinch-hitter vs. Cincinnati on May 27 with his first Major League triple ... first home run May 14 at San Diego (Lucchesi).
- Recalled from Triple-A Albuquerque on April 22.

### #26 DAVID DAHL, of

- Has hit a home run in each of the last two games, the second time this month he has homered in consecutive games (also: Sept. 2 & 4).
- Tied a career high with three hits (6x, last: Sept. 13 vs. Arizona) and four RBI (2x, last: Sept. 10 vs. Arizona) Tuesday vs. the Phillies.
- Batting .311 (19-for-61) with five home runs and a team-leading 18 RBI in 15 starts in September ... 18 RBI rank tied for fourth in the NL in the month.
- Since being recalled from Triple-A Albuquerque Aug. 5, batting .274 (37-for-135) with eight doubles, eight home runs and 26 RBI.
- Is 3-for-13 (.231) with three RBI and three walks as a pinch-hitter ... first career pinch-hit home run May 29 vs. San Francisco.
- Homered in consecutive games Sept. 2 and Sept. 4 for the first time in his career.
- First grand slam of his career Monday vs. Arizona ... career-high four RBI.
- Suffered a broken right foot May 30 and was on disabled list June 1-July 27 ... reinstated and optioned to Triple-A ... first recalled from Triple-A April 22.

### #20 IAN DESMOND, inf-of

- Has 20 home runs and 20 stolen bases, fifth career 20/20 season ... one of eight Rockies all-time with 20 homers, 20 steals and 80 RBI (11 times) in a season.
- Hit safely in 18 of 23 games in September, batting .278 (22-for-79) ... his 25 RBI since Aug. 16 are tied for eighth in the NL that span.
- Team-high 49 road RBI tied for eighth in the league ... eight triples tied for third in NL.
- Five RBI Aug. 17 at Atlanta tied a career high (third time, last: July 11 vs. Arizona).
- Slashed .307/.378/.530 in 45 games from June 10-Aug. 4 ... in first 62 games of the season up to June 10, slashed .190/.263/.389.
- Hit a walk-off home run Aug. 23 vs. San Diego, his seventh career walk-off RBI and his second career walk-off home run (also: May 2, 2012 vs. Arizona).
- Reached base in a career-high tying 19 consecutive games July 10-Aug. 4 (also: May 27-June 17, 2013) ... his 13-game hitting streak July 10-28 the second-longest string of his career, his longest since a 13-game streak in 2015.

### #5 CARLOS GONZÁLEZ, of

- His pinch-hit, two-RBI double with the bases loaded Tuesday his first RBI since Sept. 4 ... passed Vinny Castilla for the fourth-most RBI in franchise history (746).
- All-time for Colorado, ranks second in games and at-bats, third in hits, runs and extra-base hits and fourth in home runs, RBI and multi-hit games.
- Hit his 15th home run on Aug. 28 at Los Angeles-AL, surpassing last year's total of 14 ... has seven seasons with at least 15 home runs, tied for the third-most in Rockies history.
- Third Rockie (Helton, 998; Walker, 599) to reach 500 or more extra-base hits with his home run on May 27 vs. Cincinnati.

### #1 GARRETT HAMPSON, inf

- Has hit safely in eight of 10 starts (.313, 10-for-32).
- First career pinch-hit Monday, an RBI double ... 1-for-4 with one RBI, one walk and one hit by pitch in the pinch.
- Recalled Sept. 4 for his third stint on the Major League roster.
- First career multi-hit game and first career stolen base on July 30 at St. Louis.
- Contract purchased from Triple-A Albuquerque July 21 and made his debut at Arizona starting at second base ... first hit an RBI double in the fifth inning.
- Began season with Double-A Hartford before being promoted to Albuquerque on May 17 ... in 110 games between the two stops, hit .311 (138-for-444) with 25 doubles, six triples, 10 home runs, 40 RBI and 51 walks.
- Stole 36 bases with five caught stealing between Hartford and Albuquerque ... in 305 career Minor League games, has 123 stolen bases and 23 caught stealing.

- Is 3-for-7 with a double, home run and a walk as a pinch hitter ... pinch-hit home run in the seventh inning Aug. 25 vs. St. Louis to snap a scoreless tie, his first homer of 2018 and his second career pinch-hit home run (also: Sept. 30, 2016 vs. Pittsburgh).
- Second home run of the season Sept. 7 vs. the Dodgers.
- Singled as a pinch-hitter on Aug. 24 vs. the St. Louis Cardinals in his 700th game with Colorado ... his first hit as a Rockie since Sept. 25, 2008 vs. San Francisco.
- Contract selected from Triple-A Albuquerque on Aug. 23 ... signed by the Rockies to a Minor League contract on July 29.
- Batted .346 (18-for-52) with 12 runs, four doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, nine walks and nine strikeouts in 15 games with Albuquerque.
