FALL IS IN THE AIR

- The Colorado Rockies begin their final series of the regular season tonight with the first of three games against the Washington Nationals.
- The Rockies swept the Philadelphia Phillies in four games Monday-Thursday, outscoring them 39-7 ... the +32 run differential was tied for the third-largest in a four-game series in the NL since 1920, the biggest since the Mets beat the Diamondbacks by 32 runs in a four-game set in 2005.
- Entering today, the Rockies hold a one game lead on the Los Angeles Dodgers for first place in the NL West and a two game lead on the St. Louis Cardinals for the second Wild Card spot ... Colorado's magic number to clinch a postseason appearance is two, entering play today.

JUST KEEP WINNING

- Since being swept in three games at Los Angeles-NL Sept. 17-19 the Rockies have won a season-high tying seven consecutive games ... the Rockies last won eight consecutive games April 12-20, 2013.
- The Rockies are outscoring their opponent 52-10 over the seven-game span, batting .307 (75-for-244) with nine home runs ... Rockies starting pitchers have allowed five earned runs across 42.1 innings during the streak (1.06 ERA) with five quality starts

BA-DEE YA, SAY, DO YOU REMEMBER

- The Rockies have gone 17-8 in September, the most wins in the National League ... the 17 wins are tied for the third-most in September in franchise history, the most since winning 18 games in September, 2009 (franchise record: 20 wins, 2007).
- The Rockies 3.09 ERA (221.1 IP, 76 ER) in the month is the second-lowest in MLB behind Milwaukee's 2.69 ERA ... the bullpen's 2.62 ERA (82.1 IP, 24 ER) also ranks second in MLB behind Milwaukee (1.98) while the starter's 3.37 ERA (139.0 IP, 52 ER) ranks fifth in MLB, fourth in the NL.
- Colorado has scored 135 runs in September, tied for second-most in MLB and tied with Washington for the most in the NL ... lead MLB with a .274 batting average this month while their 32 home runs are tied for the second-most in the NL.
- Trevor Story's nine home runs this month are tied for the most in the NL ... David Dahl's 23 RBI are tied for the fourth-most in the NL ... Charlie Blackmon's .344 batting average ranks third in NL.

NEW NORMAL

- The Rockies' .560 winning percentage through 159 games (89-70) is the second-highest clip in club history behind the 2009 club (.572) ... that is the only 162-game season in which the Rockies have reached 90 wins ... reached their 90th win of the season in 2007 in a tie-breaking game 163 against San Diego.
- Colorado has played consecutive seasons over .500 for the first time since 2009-10.

NO CHANCE

- On Wednesday, German Márquez tied a modern Major League record (since 1900) by striking out the first eight batters of the game (also: Jim Deshaies, Sept. 23, 1986 vs. Los Angeles-NL and Jacob deGrom, Sept. 15, 2014 vs. Miami) ... the eight straight strikeouts were also a franchise record for consecutive strikeouts in a single game and tied the franchise record for strikeouts vs. consecutive batters faced (Justin Miller, three game span, Sept. 7-11, 2015).
- Márquez now has 221 strikeouts this season, a new single-season franchise record (previous: Ubaldo Jiménez, 214, 2010).

THE MILE HIGH KID

- Kyle Freeland enters tonight's game 16-7 with a 2.84 ERA (196.1 IP, 62 ER) ... would be the third pitcher in franchise history who qualified for a league ERA title to finish with an ERA below 3.00 (Marvin Freeman, 2.80 in 1994 and Ubaldo Jiménez, 2.88 ERA in 2010).

HAVE TO GET BY THEM FIRST

- Over their last nine games, Rockies starters are 5-0 with a 1.47 ERA (55.0 IP, 9 ER) with 15 walks and 52 strikeouts ... have pitched seven innings or more in five of those games with quality starts in seven of those contests, not allowing more than two runs in any of those games.

GO LOW

- Rockies starting pitchers lead the National League and rank third in MLB with 911.2 innings pitched.
- The Rockies' starting ERA of 4.18 (911.2 IP, 423 ER) is the second-lowest figure in franchise history, trailing only the 2009 (4.10) team ... the team's overall ERA of 4.33 ranks fourth in club history and is the lowest since the 2010 squad posted a franchise-low 4.14 mark.

MORE GOLIATH THAN DAVID

- David Dahl has hit a home run in four consecutive games, the second Rockies player this season to homer in four-straight games (also: Nolan Arenado, June 19-22) ... became the second player in franchise history to homer in each game of a four-game series (also: Troy Tulowitzki, April 11-14, 2011 at New York-NL).

GNATS

- The Rockies are 3-1 vs. the Nationals this season having taken three of four at Nationals Park from April 12-15, the first time since 2006 that they won a four-game series at Washington ... the Rockies batted .169 in the series, the first time in franchise history they won a four-game series while batting .200 or worse.
- Ian Desmond won the final game of the series with a go-ahead home run in the ninth inning ... Desmond's 927 career games played with the Nationals from 2009-15 are the second-most in Washington Nationals history.
- All-time vs. Washington and Montreal, Colorado is 110-84, including 54-38 vs. Washington since the move to D.C. in 2005 ... the Rockies have gone 24-21 vs. the Nationals at Coors Field since 2005.

GOOD COMPANY

- Charlie Blackmon joins Willie Mays (1954-1965) and Duke Snider (1953-56) as the only NL center fielders to have at least three straight seasons with 100 runs scored and 25 home runs.

BETTER HOMES AND ROOFTOPS

- Since an eight-game home losing streak ended June 19, the Rockies are 34-13 at Coors Field (.723), the best home winning percentage in the NL.

BABY COME BACK

- The Rockies' 45 come-from-behind wins are second in the NL (third in the Majors) and tied for the third-most in franchise history.

FREE RIDE

- Denver native graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School.
Selected in the first round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft (eighth overall), the third player in University of Evansville history to be drafted in the first round.
A member of the Opening Day roster for the second consecutive season after making his debut in 2017 ... earned his first win and recorded his first hit in his debut in the Rockies Home Opener on April 7, 2017 vs. Los Angeles-NL.

WHACKING DAY

- Pitched seven shutout innings at Arizona on Sept. 23, allowing seven hits with one walk and six strikeouts in the Rockies 2-0 win over the Diamondbacks.
It was his 10th consecutive quality start ... became the third pitcher in Rockies history (fourth time) with a streak of 10 or more quality starts (German Márquez currently on a 12-game QS streak, Ubaldo Jiménez had two such streaks in 2009 and 2009-10).

BE NATIONAL

- Has made two career starts against Washington, both at Nationals Park ... did not factor in the Rockies 2-1 win on April 13 ... allowed one run on four hits with three walks and four strikeouts over 4.1 innings.
Overall, is 1-0 with a 3.72 ERA (9.2 IP, 4 ER), three walks and eight strikeouts in two Rockies wins.

STREAKING

- His seven-game winning streak (2.10 ERA, 64.1 IP, 15 ER over 10 starts) is the longest by a Rockies starting pitcher since Ubaldo Jiménez, who won a club record nine in a row as a starter in 2010 (May 15 to July 8).
Worked six or more innings in all 10 starts during his winning streak with the Rockies 9-1.

NOT WEIRD

- Fourth in the National League with a 2.84 ERA ... among left-handed starting pitchers, his ERA is the lowest in the NL, second-lowest in MLB.
His ERA is the lowest ERA by a left-handed starter in franchise history (De La Rosa, 2013, 3.49) with a minimum of 25 starts ... only two starting pitchers in franchise history have had sub-3.00 ERA (Marvin Freeman, 2.80 ERA, 1994, Ubaldo Jiménez, 2.88, 2010).

BORN LEADER

- Ranks among NL leaders in quality starts (23-4th), wins (16-T4th) and innings pitched (196.1-5th).
His 23 quality starts rank third-most for a single season in franchise history ... Ubaldo Jiménez is the only pitcher to record more quality starts in a single season (24 in 2009, 25 in 2010).

SECOND HALF

- Second-half ERA is the second-lowest in franchise history, the lowest by a starter, and one of three 2018 Rockies among the club's top 10 along with Scott Oberg (2.20-1st) and German Márquez (2.55 3rd).

DON'T STOP

- Is 8-1 with a 2.45 ERA (80.2 IP, 22 ER) with Colorado winning 11 of the 13 starts since the All-Star break ... second-half wins tied for second-most in the National League.
Has limited left-handed hitters to a .063 batting average since the break (3-for-48) ... two of those hits came in his last start at Arizona

FREEEEE

- Since July 2, Colorado has won 14 of his past 16 starts (9-1, 2.39 ERA, 98.0 IP, 26 ER) ... opponents have hit .228 (83-for-364). ... allowed six homers that span.
Is 10-1 with the Rockies 15-3 his last 18 starts since June 21, posting a 2.27 ERA (111.0 IP, 28 ER) and a .225 opponents' batting average (92-for-409).

FREEEEEE

- Career 3.40 ERA (352.1 IP, 133 ER) ranks fourth all-time among Rockies pitchers with 100.0 or more innings ... his 3.41 (346.0 IP, 131 ER) clip first among starting pitchers.

ROADIES

- Over his past 11 road starts since June 5, has gone 5-1 with a 2.66 ERA (67.2 IP, 20 ER) with eight quality starts and the Rockies 7-4.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Among National League pitchers, is tied for first in home wins (9) and is third in home ERA (2.36).

THAT'S QUITE A RUN

- Has not lost in Denver since June 10, having gone 6-0 with a 2.05 ERA (57.0 IP, 13 ER) with the Rockies winning all nine starts.

SUB 303

- His 3.04 career ERA in Denver (174.2 IP, 59 ER) is the lowest home ERA in franchise history (min. 100 IP) ... opponents' batting average against at Coors Field (.242) ranks third.

OVERALL

- Is 27-18 with a 3.41 ERA (346.0 IP, 131 ER) in 60 career starts with the Rockies going 38-22 in those games ... Colorado is 19-11 in his 30 home starts (15-10, 3.04, 171.2 IP, 58 ER) ... is 12-8 on the road in 30 road starts with Colorado 19-11 (3.77, 174.1 IP, 73 ER).
Has no decisions with a 2.70 ERA (3.1 IP, 1 ER) in two road relief outings ... has a 3.00 ERA (3.0 IP, 1 ER) in three relief appearances at home.

WINLAND

- Earned his 20th career win on July 27 in his 49th career start to become the fourth pitcher in Rockies history to reach 20 or more wins within his first 50 career starts, all with Colorado (also: Jason Jennings, 23; Jhoulys Chacin, 20; Jeff Francis, 20).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JON GRAY (12-8, 4.91)

Earned the win his last time out on Sept. 24 vs. Philadelphia ... pitched seven innings, allowing one run on four hits with one home run, three walks and seven strikeouts ... is 5-1 with a 3.91 ERA (78.1 IP, 34 ER) over 13 starts since his July 14 recall with the Rockies going 10-3 ... over 15 starts at home this season, is 7-3 with a 4.50 ERA (86.0 IP, 43 ER), 28 walks and 99 strikeouts ... will be making his fourth career start vs. the Nationals, second at Coors Field ... is 0-2 with a 6.48 ERA (16.2 IP, 12 ER), three walks and 17 strikeouts over those starts ... took the loss at Nationals Park on April 14, after allowing five runs on eight hits with one walk and six strikeouts over 5.2 innings.

- Has hit safely in seven of his last eight games (.323, 10-for-31) with three multi-hit games.
- Among National league leaders in multi-hit games (56-T1), home runs (34-T3), RBI (105-T2), slugging (.545-4th), extra-base hits (73-T5), runs (100-7th) and doubles (37-8).
- Since 2014, leads MLB with 559 RBI and tops the NL with 172 home runs.
- Fourth consecutive season with at least 30 home runs and 100 RBI ... fourth Rockie with four such seasons (also: Todd Helton, Vinny Castilla and Larry Walker) and the third with four consecutive years (also: Castilla and Helton) ... the ninth third baseman in MLB history with four such seasons ... also joins Castilla, Chipper Jones and Alex Rodriguez as the fourth third baseman to accomplish the feat in four straight seasons.
- Batting .314 (43-for-137) with RISP ... his .332 career batting average with RISP is fourth among active MLB players.
- Tied for second in NL with 29 go-ahead RBI and leading NL with 19 on the road ... his 122 go-ahead RBI lead the Majors since 2015.
- All-Star for the fourth consecutive season ... starter for the second straight year.

- Had his career-high 17-game hitting streak snapped Wednesday ... the streak was tied for the longest in the NL this season and was the longest by a Rockies player since David Dahl recorded a hit in 17 straight in 2016.
