LET'S BREW TWO

- The Colorado Rockies conclude the regular season with a three-game weekend series against Los Angeles Dodgers ... began the homestand with a 2-1 series victory over Miami.
- The Rockies have a two-game lead over the Milwaukee Brewers for the second National League Wild Card ... St. Louis was eliminated from contention with a loss yesterday ... have a magic number of two.
- Were off yesterday following their 15-9 win against the Marlins on Wednesday.
- The Rockies are 4-6 over their last 10 games, while both the Brewers and Cardinals have gone 5-5.
- The Rockies are 14-12 in September ... finished their final road trip of the regular season with a 2-4 record against San Francisco (0-2) and San Diego (2-2).

QUICK PITCH

- Rockies pitchers have posted a 4.10 ERA (228.1 IP, 104 ER) in 16 games in September ... starters are 10-10 with a 3.92 ERA (128.2 IP, 56 ER) while the bullpen has logged a 4.33 ERA (99.2 IP, 51 ER).
- In the last 12 games since September 15, the Rockies as a team have posted a 3.28 ERA (104.1 IP, 38 ER) while going 6-6 ... starters have a 2.78 ERA (68.0 IP, 21 ER) with a 2.12 walks per nine innings and seven home runs allowed ... Rockies relievers have a 4.21 ERA (36.1 IP, 17 ER) with two home runs allowed.

CHALK UP ANOTHER SORTIE

- The Rockies' 86 wins are the third-most in franchise history ... this season marks Colorado's eighth winning record in franchise history and the first since 2010.

WE'VE BEEN EVERYWHERE, MAN

- Colorado, at 41-40 tied the 2009 club for the most road wins (41-40, 506) in club history ... those are the only two years the Rockies have finished over .500 on the road.
- Colorado finished 11-7 over their last 18 road games.

THE WILD WEST

- Colorado has 41 wins (41-32) vs. the National League West for only the second time in franchise history ... the 2007 team was 43-30.

SINCE YOU MAKE A BIG DEAL ABOUT IT

- Of his 36 home runs this season, Nolan Arenado has 18 on the road, 18 at Coors Field.

A LEAGUE OF THEIR OWN

- Nolan Arenado is the second player in Major League history with three or more seasons of at least 35 home runs and 125 RBI before the age of 27 ... only Jimmie Foxx had more with four seasons.
- Arenado is the fourth Major Leaguer all-time with multiple seasons of 40 doubles, 35 home runs and 125 RBI before turning 27 (Hank Greenberg, Chuck Klein and Hal Trosky).

HOLLAND SAVES

- Greg Holland tied the club record Friday with his National League-leading 41st save, equalizing Jose Jimenez (41, 2002) ... Holland is one strikeout away from 500 for his career.

BROKEN RECORD

- Charlie Blackmon leads the NL with a .328 batting average, and leads the Majors with 208 hits, 136 runs, 14 triples, 66 multi-hit games and 379 total bases.
- His 66 multi-hit games are tied for the most in franchise history (Dante Bichette, 1998).
- Is the eighth player (nine times) in Rockies history to record at least 200 hits, the first since Matt Holliday in 2007 ... his 208 hits are tied for sixth-most in franchise history with Larry Walker (1997), one shy of Todd Helton's 209 hits in 2003 and three shy of Ellis Burks' 211 hits in 1996.
- Blackmon's 136 runs scored are the fourth-most in franchise history, the most since Todd Helton scored 138 runs in 2000.
- Blackmon has 99 RBI as a leadoff hitter, one shy of tying Darin Erstad (2000) for the most by a leadoff hitter in MLB history.
- Blackmon's 379 total bases are the most in MLB history for a leadoff hitter ... his 36 home runs are the third-most all-time, behind Alfonso Soriano's 38 home runs in 2002 with the Yankees and 39 home runs in 2006 with the Nationals.

ROLODEX

- Charlie Blackmon is one of nine players in MLB history to have a year with at least 130 runs, 35 doubles, 14 triples and 35 homers ... the last player to have such a season was Stan Musial in 1948.
- Other players on the list: Hank Greenberg (1937), Joe DiMaggio (1937), Chuck Klein (1932), Lou Gehrig (1930, 1927), Al Simmons (1930), Rogers Hornsby (1922) and Babe Ruth (1921).

EXTRA, EXTRA

- Nolan Arenado is the second player in franchise history to have three seasons with 80 or more extra-base hits ... Todd Helton had four ... is the first third baseman in Major League history with 80 or more extra-base hits three times.
- Charlie Blackmon is the third Major League leadoff hitter since 1914 to collect 85 or more extra base hits ... his 85 are a National-League record for a leadoff hitter; and the most since Grady Sizemore set the Major League mark with 92 in 2006.
- The Rockies are the first team since the 2004 Boston Red Sox (David Ortiz, Manny Ramirez) to have two players with at least 85 extra-base hits ... the 1996 Rockies also had two players with at least 85 extra-base hits (Burks, Galarraga).

A BIT MORE ABOUT OUR THIRD BASEMAN

- Nolan Arenado has recorded three consecutive seasons with at least 125 RBI ... is the first player in Rockies history to have three consecutive seasons of 125 or more RBI, and the first third baseman in Major League history to accomplish the feat.
- Also is the first NL player with three consecutive seasons of 125 or more RBI since Ryan Howard had four from 2006-09.
- Arenado is the only player in Rockies history to have three seasons of at least 35 home runs and 125 RBI ... Dante Bichette and Nolan Arenado are the only players in Rockies history to have three seasons of at least 125 RBI.

BACK WHERE YOU BELONG

- The Lubbock, Texas, native is making his ninth Major League start of the season after recovering from a testicular cancer diagnosis received in the offseason ... underwent surgery last November and continued treatments throughout the winter and spring.
- Placed on the 60-day disabled list March 26, sent to Double-A Hartford to begin rehab July 13, and was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list and optioned to Triple-A Albuquerque Aug. 4.
- Pitched in one official Spring Training game this year, March 5 at Milwaukee, and allowed one run on one hit with two strikeouts in two innings of work.

LAST TIME OUT

- Took the loss against the Padres on Sept. 23 ... pitched 4.2 innings, allowing one run on seven hits with two walks and three strikeouts.

HOLLYWOOD

- Will make his second start against the Dodgers this season ... won at Dodger Stadium on Sept. 9 ... pitched five innings and allowed four runs (three earned) on six hits with no walks and five strikeouts in the 6-5 Rockies win.
- Has only made three career appearances, two starts, against the Dodgers at Coors Field ... in two career starts, has no record with a 5.06 ERA (10.2 IP, 6 ER), seven walks and nine strikeouts.
- Is 1-2 with a 6.32 ERA (31.1 IP, 22 ER) in six career starts against Los Angeles-NL.

NEED SOME SUPPORT

- In his eight starts, has received an average of 2.75 runs of support per game ... has received no runs of support four times, one run once, three runs twice and five runs one time.

THE ROAD BACK

- Began his rehab stint July 13 at Double-A Hartford, making five rehab appearances ... came off 60-day DL and was optioned to Triple-A on Aug. 4 ... pitched in one more Minor League game Aug. 8 before returning to Colorado Aug. 14.
- In six Minor League games, total five starts, between Hartford and Triple-A Albuquerque, went 0-3 with a 4.24 ERA (23.1 IP, 11 ER), seven walks and 17 strikeouts.

WELCOME HOME

- On Aug. 14, pitched his first Major League game since September 30, 2016, facing Atlanta ... pitched seven shutout innings, allowing six hits with no walks and two strikeouts in a 3-0 combined shutout (Mike Dunn, Greg Holland) ... received no decision as the Rockies scored all three runs in the bottom of the eighth inning.
- Also made his Major League debut vs. the Braves against Teheran on Aug. 1, 2013 at Turner Field, losing 11-2 (5.0,6,5,5,1).

YOU WERE MISSED

- The Rockies have won 17 of his past 26 starts since June 21, 2016 ... is 10-7 with a 4.59 ERA (147.0 IP, 75 ER) in that span.
- Colorado is 12-2 his past 14 starts at home since June 9, 2016 (7-1, 3.97 ERA).
- Rockies have won 21 of his past 29 home starts at Coors Field since the beginning of the 2014 season ... over that span, he's 12-6 with a 4.59 ERA (166.2 IP, 85 ER).

OUT OF THE GATE

- Pitched seven innings in his first two starts of the year, the first time he has accomplished the feat at home ... third time in his career he has pitched at least seven innings in consecutive starts (career-high three start streak Aug. 28-Sept. 11, 2016).

MOUNTAINOUS

- The Rockies' loss on Aug. 19 snapped their 11-game winning streak at Coors Field when Bettis started (June 9, 2016-Aug. 14, 2017) ... is 7-1 at home since June 9, 2016 with eight quality starts and a 3.89 ERA (76.1 IP, 33 ER) ... has allowed eight home runs.
- Is 12-7 with a 4.71 ERA (183.1 IP, 96 ER) in 32 career starts at Coors Field ... is 1-1 with a 11.51 ERA (20.1 IP, 26 ER) in 18 relief appearances in Denver.

SPLITS

- Is 23-21 with a 4.74 ERA (378.0 IP, 199 ER) in 68 Major League starts ... 1-2 with a 9.09 ERA (31.2 IP, 32 ER) in 29 relief outings.
- A starter since May 14, 2015 after being used primarily as a reliever in 2014 ... began his Major League career making eight starts from Aug. 1-Sept. 8 in 2013.
- Made 29 relief appearances from Sept. 11, 2013 to July 28, 2014 between starts.

GUNS UP

- Missed the entire 2012 season due to a right shoulder injury.
- Drafted in the second round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft, during his junior season out of Texas Tech ... was rated as the 33rd-best player in the draft by *Baseball America*.
- Attended Monterey High School in Lubbock ... was named to the all-region team before his senior season ... drafted by Houston in the eighth round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft, but did not sign ... Rockies selected him in the second round, with the 76th overall selection, in the 2010 draft.
