TIMES UP, LET'S DO THIS

- The Colorado Rockies play their final game of the regular season today vs. the Washington Nationals.
- The Rockies enter play today in a tie for the National League West with the Los Angeles Dodgers ... a win today and a Dodgers loss would clinch the Rockies' first division title in franchise history ... if both teams remain tied after play today, a Game 163 tiebreaker would be played tomorrow in Los Angeles.
- The Rockies' 12-2 loss to the Nationals yesterday snapped their season-high eight game winning streak, the club's longest win streak since winning 10-straight in 2010 (Sept. 3-12).
- The Colorado Rockies have clinched a postseason berth two consecutive seasons for the first time in franchise history.

NEW NORMAL

- The Rockies 90 wins this season are tied for the second-most in franchise history with the 2007 club, who won their 90th game in the tie-breaking Game 163 vs. San Diego ... the 2009 club holds the franchise record with 92 wins.
- Colorado has played consecutive seasons over .500 for the first time since 2009-10.

BETTER HOMES AND ROOFTOPS

- Since an eight-game home losing streak ended June 19, the Rockies are 35-14 at Coors Field (.714), the best home winning percentage in the NL and tied for third-highest clip in the Majors.

THE BEST OF YOU

- Colorado's 56 wins against teams at or above .500 lead the Majors.

BABY COME BACK

- The Rockies' 46 come-from-behind wins are second in the NL (third in the Majors) and the third-most in franchise history.

BA-DEE YA, SAY, DO YOU REMEMBER

- The Rockies have gone 18-9 in September, tied for the most wins in the National League and tied for the second-most victories in the Majors ... the 18 wins are tied for the second most in September in franchise history, the most since also winning 18 in September, 2009 (franchise record: 20 wins, 2007).
- The Rockies' 3.38 ERA (239.1 IP, 90 ER) in the month ranks fourth in the NL ... the Rockies 142 runs this month ranks third in the NL ... rank second in the league with a .269 batting average and 38 home runs this month.
- Trevor Story is tied for second in the NL this month with nine home runs and tied for fifth with 20 RBI ... David Dahl's 24 RBI are fourth in the NL ... Charlie Blackmon's .327 batting average ranks seventh in NL.

NO CHANCE

- On Wednesday, German Márquez tied a modern Major League record (since 1900) by striking out

the first eight batters of the game ... the eight-straight strikeouts were also a franchise record for consecutive strikeouts in a single game and tied the franchise record for strikeouts vs. consecutive batters faced.

- Márquez now has 221 strikeouts this season, a new single-season franchise record.

THE MILE HIGH KID

- Kyle Freeland finished the regular season with a 2.85 ERA (202.1 IP, 64 ER), the lowest full-season ERA for a starting pitcher in Rockies history ... his 2.40 ERA (93.2 IP, 25 ER) at home is also the lowest for a starter in club history.
- Is the first Rockies pitcher to reach 200 innings in a season since Ubaldo Jiménez in 2010 (221.2 IP)
- Has 11 consecutive quality starts, third-longest quality start streak for a season in franchise history ... his 17 wins are tied for second in franchise history and the most since Jiménez recorded a franchise-record 19 wins in 2010.
- His 24 quality starts this season rank fourth in the NL and are tied for the second-most in franchise history.

HAVE TO GET BY THEM FIRST

- Over their last 11 games, Rockies starters are 6-1 with a 2.29 ERA (63.0 IP, 16 ER) with 16 walks and 57 strikeouts ... have pitched seven innings or more in five of those games with quality starts eight times while not allowing more than two runs in 10 of 11 games.

GO LOW

- Rockies starting pitchers lead the National League and rank third in MLB with 919.2 innings pitched.
- The Rockies' starting ERA of 4.21 (919.2 IP, 430 ER) is the second-lowest figure in franchise history, trailing only the 2009 (4.10) team ... the team's overall ERA of 4.36 ranks fourth in club history and is the lowest since the 2010 squad posted a franchise-low 4.14 mark.

MORE GOLIATH THAN DAVID

- David Dahl hit a home run in five consecutive games Monday through Friday, the fourth player in franchise history to record a home run streak of five or more games ... Dante Bichette (Aug. 1-5, 1995), Larry Walker (June 18-23, 1999) and Nolan Arenado (six games, Sept. 1-5, 2015) also accomplished the feat.

GOOD COMPANY

- Charlie Blackmon joins Willie Mays (1954-1965) and Duke Snider (1953-56) as the only NL center fielders to have at least three straight seasons with 100 runs scored and 25 home runs.

AND THEN THERE WERE TWO

- With his 35th home run of the season Saturday, Nolan Arenado joins Albert Belle (1993-96) as the only players in Major League history to record at least 35 doubles and 35 home runs in four consecutive seasons.

TRUE STORY

- Trevor Story enters today leading the National League with 83 extra-base hits ... would join Ernie Banks (1957-58, 1960) and Honus Wagner (1903-04, 1907-09) as the only NL shortstops to lead the league in extra-base hits.
- Also ranks tied for third in home runs (35), tied for fourth in RBI (105) and fourth in doubles.

GNATS

- The Rockies are 4-2 vs. the Nationals ... won the season series two of the past three years ... won three of four at Nationals Park from April 12-15, the first time since 2006 that they won a four-game series at Washington.
- All-time vs. Washington and Montreal, Colorado is 111-85, including 55-39 vs. Washington since the move to D.C. in 2005 ... the Rockies have gone 25-22 vs. the Nationals at Coors Field since 2005.
