Yankees second baseman - and, later, team manager - batted .333 across five World Series played (1951-1953, 1955-1956)



Most hits, doubles, and stolen bases in Yankees history



Hit 714 home runs, the most in MLB history at the time of his retirement



Played in 2,130 consecutive games, an MLB record that stood for 56 years



Holds the MLB record with his 56-game hitting streak



MONUMENT PARK: TRIVIA



Managed the Yankees to four World Series championships (1996, 1998-2000)



Most career home runs by a switch-hitter with 536



Won 10 World Series championships as a player, the most in MLB history



Yankees catcher who caught 100 games in 13 consecutive seasons (1929-1941)



Set the single-season record with 61 home runs that stood for 37 years



Won the 1950 AL MVP and is known as one of the finest defensive shortstops in MLB history



MONUMENT PARK: TRIVIA



Won 1970 AL Rookie of the Year honors, the 1976 AL MVP Award, and was the first Yankees captain since Lou Gehrig



Holds the World Series records for wins, strikeouts, and consecutive scoreless innings pitched



Member of the "Core Four" who won five Silver Slugger Awards as a catcher



Won nine Gold Glove Awards as a first baseman, the most in American League history



First African American player in Yankees history who went on to win the 1963 AL MVP



Managed the Yankees to five consecutive World Series championships (1949–1953), the only time that has happened in MLB history



MONUMENT PARK: TRIVIA



Only player to ever be unanimously (100%) voted into the Baseball Hall of Fame



Never played for the Yankees, but his number is retired by all MLB teams



Famously hit three consecutive home runs on three first pitches in the 1977 World Series



Franchise leader in career strikeouts who won five World Series championships (1996, 1998-2000, 2009)



Nicknamed "Louisiana Lightning," his 1978 was one of the most dominant pitching seasons ever



Smooth fielding centerfielder who won the 1998 AL batting title







